Cathleen A. Benko '85

Cathy is vice chairman and chief talent officer for Deloitte LLP, the largest professional services firm in the country. She is responsible for driving the organization's strategy to attract, develop and advance a highly skilled and increasingly diverse workforce. She is also leading a pioneering approach to employee engagement and career-life fit called mass career customization, a signature initiative of Deloitte's Talent agenda. Before her appointment to this position, Cathy Benko led Deloitte Consulting's high technology industry sector as well as the organization's award-winning Women's Initiative. She continues to serve as lead client service principal for a major technology client.

In recognition of her professional achievements, Cathy has been named one of the "25 Most Influential Consultants" and a "Frontline Leader" by Consulting Magazine, and is the recipient of its inaugural "Leadership Achievement Award" for Women Leaders in Consulting. She has also been cited for her accomplishments by a number of prestigious organizations, including Women in Technology International (WITI) and the San Francisco Business Times, which has named her one of the "Most Influential Women in the Bay Area" for eight consecutive years.

Cathy is the co-author of *Connecting the Dots: Aligning Projects and Objectives in Unpredictable Times* (Harvard Business Press, 2003), *Mass Career Customization: Aligning the Workplace with Today's Nontraditional Workforce* (Harvard Business Press, 2007) and its sequel, titled *The Corporate Lattice: Achieving High Performance in the Changing World of Work*, which is scheduled for a Spring 2010 release.

Cathy is a member of Deloitte's Executive Committee and Consulting Magazine's advisory board, and was recently a judge for Harvard Business Review's McKinsey Awards. She is also a past member of Harvard Business School's Global Alumni Board of Directors, and currently serves on its Northern California Board and Executive Committee.

Cathy earned a bachelor of science degree from Ramapo College and an MBA from Harvard Business School. She currently lives in Northern California with her husband and their two children. The family travels back to New Jersey regularly, including annual trips to the Jersey shore.

The Honorable Dennis McNerney

Dennis McNerney is serving his second term as County Executive, the highest elected office in Bergen County. He captured the County Executive's office in November 2002 and was re-elected in November 2006, after twice being elected to the Bergen County Board of Chosen Freeholders in 1998 and 2001.

County Executive McNerney has placed the sharing of services as one of his top priorities. Believing it is crucial to find solutions to Bergen's spiraling property taxes, he has worked with local and county officials to cooperatively provide the residents of Bergen County with essential public services while helping to lower the tax burden.

As County Executive and previously as a Freeholder, McNerney has been a pioneer in the fight to preserve open space in Bergen County. McNerney also has committed himself to helping the growing senior population in Bergen County. In 2003 he worked with the Freeholder Board to institute a prescription discount card program that is available to every resident of the county and can save them up to 10 to 50 percent off the cost of their prescription drugs. In addition, he has worked to improve and expand the services available through the Community Transportation and Meal-on-Wheels programs and also at the county's 12 senior activity centers.

The County Executive remains a strong proponent of improving our sports and recreational opportunities throughout the county.

Dennis McNerney is a lifelong resident of Bergen County. He graduated from Bergen Catholic High School, attended Bergen Community College, the University of Delaware, and went on to receive his master's degree in Public Administration from Columbia University. Prior to his election as County Executive, McNerney was a Vice President for a municipal finance firm. He currently resides in Ho-Ho-Kus with his wife, Catherine, and their two children.

Stanley Young

Stanley Young is Chief Executive Officer for NYSE Technologies and co-global Chief Information Officer of NYSE Euronext.

NYSE Euronext (NYSE/New York and Euronext/Paris: NYX) operates the world's largest and most liquid exchange group and offers the most diverse array of financial products and services. NYSE Euronext, which brings together six cash equities exchanges in five countries and six derivatives exchanges, is a world leader for listings, trading in cash equities, equity and interest rate derivatives, bonds and the distribution of market data.

Mr. Young is CEO for NYSE Technologies, the world's leading provider of end-to-end electronic trading solutions. NYSE Technologies' flexible and scalable products deliver robust and integrated solutions, from single trading positions to complete exchange platforms. Mr. Young is also Co-Global CIO of NYSE Euronext and works with Steve Rubinow (Co-Global CIO) to combine and leverage NYSE Euronext's technology across North America and Europe as a result of the recent insourcing of Atos Euronext Market Solutions (AEMS). Mr. Young and Mr. Rubinow are jointly responsible for delivering the group's strategies to implement the universal trading platform (UTP) and managing the technology unit of NYSE Euronext.

From June 2007, Mr. Young was the Chief Executive of AEMS, the leading global provider of technology solutions for exchanges, clearing houses, banks, brokers, and intermediaries, until its incorporation into NYSE Euronext in August 2008. As a result of this transaction, NYSE Euronext acquired ownership of the NSC cash trading and LIFFE CONNECT® derivatives trading platform technology and all of the management and development services surrounding these platforms as well as AEMS's third-party exchange technology business. Mr. Young joined AEMS from Hewlett-Packard where he was Head of the FSI Consulting & Integration business in North America. Prior to this he was Worldwide Director of Financial Markets.

Mr. Young has held senior partner positions in Capco and Accenture with accountability for the Global Capital Markets and Market Infrastructure businesses. He also spent more than 11 years at the London Stock Exchange as Director for New Strategy Development responsible for the implementation of the Exchange's trading and trade management systems.
