GENERAL Education	Three years ago the General Education Curriculum Committee (GECCo) embarked on a three-year assessment of Ramapo's general-education curriculum. To date, GECCo has completed assessments of written communication, quantitative reasoning, information literacy, oral communication, critical inquiry, intercultural North America, international, and interdisciplinary. NSSE	Ramapo College has administered the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) since 2000. Last year the College administered the survey to almost 300 first-year students and to almost 200 seniors. Compared to public institutions in the mideast, one of Ramapo's peer groups, both first-year students and seniors reportedly wrote more papers and made more class presentations. However, both student groups were less likely to report that they studied more than 10 hours a week and that they had "serious conversations" with students different from them (e.g. ethnicity, religion, values). Success Story	 The members of ASB's Teaching, Assessment, and Programs Committee (TAP) agree—the assessment of the e-harmony case was a great success. To assess the ASB core objective for ethics, faculty who teach ethics embedded the case in their courses. The assessment process had these features: The rubric was well connected to both the course objectives and assigned case. The students were exposed to the rubric multiple times before doing the case assignment. Raters were provided with detailed guidelines on what was expected of students.
