Kun-Yang Lin/Dancers

Kun-Yang Lin/Dancers (KYL/D) is a contemporary Asian-American professional dance company, based in Philadelphia. Drawing upon Eastern philosophies, while expanding the perimeter of contemporary dance, Founder & Artistic Director, Kun-Yang Lin's Zen-inspired practice of dance manifests in lush works of poetic sensibility.

KYL/D's evening of mixed repertoire will feature four works as follows:

Black Moon, a new work by Kun-Yang Lin, is loosely based on the Chinese tale of the Moon goddess, the hero, moon rabbit and a tree of immortal life. **Black Moon** takes us on a journey from traditions rooted in history and deeply ingrained expectations to an exploration of the polarizing tensions inherent in contemporary life. The choreographer draws from ancient myth and the unadorned fabric of human experience, intending to reveal hidden patterns of life-

sustaining continuity within the metaphor of the shadow-black moon.

An ode to invisible forces, the work speaks to profound connections that often go unnoticed, yet intricately shape the tapestry of our lives.

Moon Dance is a signature solo work of Kun-Yang Lin, contrasts moments of lush dynamism with captivating stillness.

Chi is inspired by the interplay of the visible and invisible as manifested in the ancient art forms of tai chi and calligraphy, "chi" means breath, energy or life's source.

Fire Ritual Dance/ Fenghuang Awakens, a new work by Kun-Yang Lin, takes as its point of departure from ancient Confucian rituals and the metaphors of fire and Feng Huang, the Chinese phoenix.

Fèng Huáng (Chinese phoenix). The Feng Huang was believed to represent the five tones of traditional Chinese music and to represent the Confucian 5 virtues of:

- (Rén) (仁): Benevolence, humanity, and compassion.
- (Yì) (義): Righteousness, honesty, and integrity.
- (Li) (禮): Propriety, correct behavior, and rites, Ritual, consistency.
- (Zhì) (智): Wisdom and knowledge.
- (Xìn) (信): Faithfulness and trustworthiness

Thus, in the rich treasury of traditional Chinese culture, the phoenix is both a bird and also a person or force for good, which is linked to the immortal and the divine.

The world may well be on fire, but if we are open to see it clearly—that fire will illuminate the goodness in ourselves and others, serving as a reminder that when we offer gratitude by acting with patience, kindness, love, compassion, it can indeed, water our arid souls and awaken the Feng Huang in each of us.


What the Constitution Means to Me




