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Board of Trustees December 12, 2016 Meeting Recap

The Ramapo College Board of Trustees met on December 12, 2016 and took the following actions:

- Approved the Degree Candidates for January 2017
- Approved a minor in Contemplative Studies, a major in Elementary Education, and a concentration in Accounting in the MBA program
- Approved the award of a management contract extension of three years for book store services effective
 July 1, 2017 to Follett Higher Education Group, Inc.
