FAQ's ABOUT ALCOHOL PERMITS

There are two types of permits.

- 1. Ramapo Alcohol Permit (Internal)
- 2. ABC Permit: Special Permit for Social Affairs (External)



When do I need a Ramapo Alcohol permit?

Whenever you are serving alcohol on campus and there is NO money changing hands at or before the event.

When do I need an ABC permit?

When there is a cash bar or money is changing hands?

What if the alcohol is free but participants pay an admission fee?

That would still be considered an exchange of money and require an ABC permit.

What if the tickets are prepaid and no money is given at the door?

That would still be considered an exchange of money and require an ABC permit.

Letter B and C under section <u>Alcoholic Beverages at Campus Events</u> explain the criteria for a College Alcohol Permit and ABC permit they read, "If alcohol is to be served and no money is to change hands, only a College Alcohol Permit is required." "If alcohol is to be sold, or where any transfer of money takes place, the sponsor of the event must secure a Special Permit for Social Affairs from the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control and a Ramapo College Alcohol Permit."
