SPOTLIGHT ON... AUTUMN BASS

"Students on the autism spectrum and anyone in special education teach society valuable lessons...this population allows us to look at things from another light."

Meet Autumn Bass, a recent graduate of Ramapo College who is continuing her education to earn a Master's Degree in Social Work at RCNJ. Autumn is working as an Intern with the ENHANCE program as part of the MSW program. As a child, Autumn was diagnosed with an auditory processing disorder and so brings a unique perspective to her position. As a high school student, a favorite teacher said something that has always resonated with Autumn: "You are not disabled – you just learn differently." Autumn uses that advice to inform her interactions with students: working as a peer mentor, helping to run the Connections group and her personal favorite, the weekly Social Group. Autumn says that it is refreshing to see our students interact with one another in this environment and she likes to challenge them to "get out of their comfort zone."

Connections

Our weekly Connections group is one of the hallmarks of the **ENHANCE** program and much of what we do here is designed to help our students become successful at Ramapo College and beyond. Over pizza and soda, our meetings cover topics like the differences between high school and college and talk about advocating with professors, accessing college resources like tutoring, the fitness center, etc. We delve into friendships and dating and role play some awkward or concerning situations and how to handle them, like meetings with professors/employers or campus safety. We will often invite other departments to come and speak to our students. Earlier this semester, a member of the Ramapo College Krame Center came and did a guided meditation and discussed mindfulness. Most recently, staff from the Cahill Career Center came and talked about Pathways and Handshake which are career preparation resources that are available to Ramapo students.
