



EOF Pre-Freshmen Studies Summer Program Frequently Asked Questions

1. When is EOF Orientation?

The EOF Orientation is on Saturday, May 19th from 9:30am to 12:30pm in the Ramapo Pavilion. This is a mandatory orientation where you will go over your summer class schedule, meet with your EOF Advisor, and hear from the Office of Financial Aid. Each student is allowed to bring up to 2 people with them to orientation. Continental breakfast will be served.

2. What are the dates of the EOF Program?

The EOF Pre-Freshmen Studies Summer Program will begin on Saturday, June 23rd and end on Thursday, August 2nd.

3. When is move in day?

Move in will start at 9am on Saturday, June 23rd.

4. Do I have to pay for the six week EOF Pre-Freshmen Studies Program?

No. All EOF first year students that are accepted to the college through the EOF Program and are cleared by the Office of Financial Aid are awarded state funds that cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, supplies, residential accommodations, meal plans and stipend for the summer program.

6. What classes will I take?

All students will take a writing course. Depending on how you score on your college placement test (Accuplacer), you will also have a mathematics or general education requirement course. All STEM majors will also have a STEM seminar.

7. What do I need to do to successfully complete the EOF Program and keep my scholarship?

All EOF Scholars have been conditionally accepted to Ramapo through the EOF Program. Students who earn at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average are eligible for the Ramapo EOF Scholarship. Students who do not earn at least a 2.0 grade cumulative point average might not be invited to attend Ramapo in the fall. Every effort will be made this summer to help EOF Scholars succeed. Students will work closely with their professors, tutors, and EOF Advisors. Counseling and Health services will also be available. Our Resident Programming Assistants will assist students in adjusting to living in dorms and provide fun programming for students. If you are highly motivated and stay focused, you will have a great EOF Pre Freshmen Summer experience.

8. Do I have to live on campus during the summer?

Yes, as an EOF Pre-Freshmen Studies Summer student, you will live on campus in the Village Apartments. Students can go home every weekend except July 27th-July 29th. Students will be sharing an apartment with four other students. Students are not allowed to have guests in their apartments. Family members who visit campus can do so in the Village Commons.

9. Can I work after class during the week?

Students will not be able to work during the week.

Bathing Suit (for Campus Pool)
Paper Towels
Toilet Paper
Shower Caddy
Shower Shoes
Medical Insurance Card
(if you have your own family insurance)
Plastic cups and plates (optional)
Plug in air freshener or Febreze (Aerosol cans and candles are prohibited on campus)
