## **Faculty Assembly Executive Council Meeting Minutes**

- 1. Approving the FAEC minutes from 1/21/2015
  - a. Approved
- 2. Discussed the interim schedule modifications for Fall 2015. Shift to 4-credits curriculum was confirmed. The following scheduling issues were raised:
  - a. Shared-governance
  - b. Scheduling conflicts for some faculty and for some programs
  - c. Concerns were raised for having allocation of 3x vs. 2 x vs. 1x a week classes not founded on pedagogy, and for having daily schedules elongated by scheduling 100 minutes classes as 120 minute classes (requiring each to take a break) and providing longer breaks between classes; unit councils are requesting pedagogical support for scheduling options presented to the faculty by administration
  - d. Difficulty in retaining adjunct faculty to teach in certain time slots; some units are reporting inability to retain adjuncts when evening classes cannot meet 1x per week
  - e. Discussed classroom utilization and desirability of scheduling flexibility when necessary and justified
  - f. Schedules of other 4-credit Colleges should be consulted for benchmarking
  - g. Importance of assessing the Interim schedule; what benchmarks will be assessed, by whom, how, and when, should be determined in advance of implementation
- 3. FAEC reaffirmed that faculty representation on the external search on VPEMSA, VPAF should be consulted with the faculty. FAEC also will query the space utilization of ASB 4<sup>th</sup> floor after it is vacated by Nursing
  - a. FAEC will follow-up with President Mercer when he visits FAEC on February 11<sup>th</sup>.

- 4. Discussed the pending merge of the Instructional Design Center and Faculty Resource Center under one administrator
  - a. FAEC has heard of this only second-handedly and informally. It will request clarification and explanation
  - b. FACE expressed that the merge should be consulted with faculty since pedagogy is the purview of the faculty
- 5. President Mercer will visit the FAEC on a monthly basis starting on February 11<sup>th</sup>
- 6. On February 4<sup>th</sup>, Meredith Davis (Service Task Force) will visit the FAEC to present the Service Task Force report
  - a. Other guests may also visit FAEC on Feb 4th: Thierry Rakotobe (ARC), Eric Karlin (TFAEE) and Ed Shannon (GenEd Task Force)
- 7. FAEC suggests that other Task Forces, such as Rigor, should also report to the FA in February and March
