Presidential Task Force on AI

President Jebb is convening a Presidential Task Force on Artificial Intelligence to complement the work currently underway within Teaching and Learning to ensure Ramapo engages this emerging technology with thoughtfulness, responsibility, and vision.

The Presidential Task Force will be charged with studying the potential uses, implications, and impacts of AI across teaching, learning, research, operations, and student life, with the goal of offering recommendations that align with Ramapo's identity, values, and pursuit of national distinction.

Key Areas of Focus

Mission Alignment & Identity:

Leverage AI to strengthen the liberal arts mission, uphold institutional values, and advance national distinction.

Teaching, Learning & Student Success:

Explore responsible uses of AI to enhance pedagogy, support faculty innovation, and prepare graduates for an AI-shaped workforce.

Operational & Ethical Considerations:

Assess risks, ethics, and governance to ensure responsible, equitable, and value-driven AI adoption.

Future Readiness & Strategic Positioning:

Define Ramapo's identity in the AI era and position the College as a liberal arts leader in thoughtful, innovative engagement with AI.
