Commodity: Oats

What are Oats?

- Species of cereal grain
- Used for human and animal consumption

Where are oats grown?

- Cool temperate regions
- Northern hemisphere: Russia, Canada, US
- Southern hemisphere: Australia, Argentina, Brazil

Trade

- Global oats market reached 23.5 million tons in 2018
- Projected to reach 28 million tons
- 1.5 million tons going to the US
- Contract month corresponding to harvest seasons

Imports and Exports

- Canada is the biggest exporter (50.2%)
- United States is the biggest importer (42.8%)

Corporation: Blue Lake Milling

- South Eastern Australia
- Conscience of social and environment issues
- \$2.77 billion in sales with only 178 employees

Production Process

 Harvest > clean and grade > dehull > heat > dry > cut/flake/grind > transport or further process

Why include oats?

- Lowers cholesterol, improves gut health
- Low cost and easy to make
- Includes essential vitamins and minerals
- Low carbon footprint

Oats as an alternative to dairy milk

- 270 million cows are used for dairy milk
- Dairy has a negative impact on environment
- Dairy is unnatural for consumption
- Cows are mistreated
- Controversy: jobs in the dairy industry are being taken away
