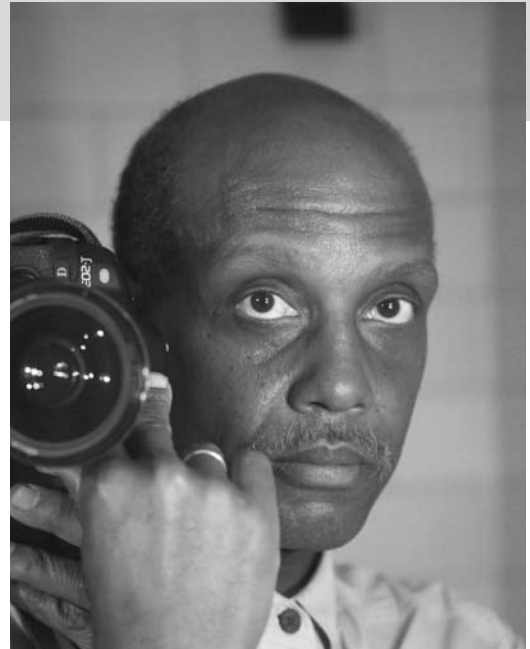


Orphans, Hunger, and Poupelard Street: Photographs of Haiti after the January 12th Earthquake
