\*\*\* Take HIST 201: Historiography as soon as possible before enrolling in other 200/300 level HIST courses.

Minimum major requirement is SIX 200/300-level HIST electives beyond HIST 201. If you continuously studied language in your first two years, you may still need HIST electives.

(GenEd-International Issues) is best fulfilled by completing Intermediate I Language which is part of the SSAIS School Core.

Otherwise, choose a 200/300-level HIST course that fulfills that category.

(GenEd-Intercultural North America) is best fulfilled by choosing a 200/300-level HIST course that fulfills that category.

With your free electives, consider a minor or second major.
