

- 1. Ramapo College is celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> year of its charter that established Ramapo College of New jersey in 1969. Various activities were planned for the year involving faculty, staff, students and Alumni. Maroon Monday turned out to be one of the most successful events, whereby the employees and students wore maroon gear on Mondays. Specifically 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary shirts were designed and distributed for the occasion. - 2. Ramapo College was accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) with honors in February 2020. Further, the team did not have any recommendations or requirements for the College. Kudos! to Ramapo College for its tremendous success. The office of Institutional Research is proud to report that the Fact book played an important role in the reaccreditation process, and getting the college re-accredited.
- 3. Soon after getting re-accredited by MSCHE the nation faced the tragedy of "COVID-19." Before one could understand its potential, the disease claimed many lives, with thousands hospitalized in USA and many countries around the world. Among the many changes that institutions of higher education, like Ramapo College, faced was the delivery of the education to students, while maintaining the teaching continuity. Colleges and Universities across the nation were physically closed and they switched to online delivery of academic programs. Although not an easy task, credit goes to the faculty and ITS staff for moving forward with change without missing a beat. 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





NEW UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANTS BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2019



NEW UNDERGRADUATE ADMITS BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2019







### FIGURE 1.7 NEW UNDERGRADUATES BY ADMISSION CATEGORY, FALL 2019












ALL UNDERGRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2019






ALL GRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2019





UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY SCHOOL, FALL 2019









UNDERGRADUATE AWARDS BY TYPE OF DEGREE, FISCAL YEAR 2018-19







BY SCHOOL AND INITIAL ADMIT TYPE, FISCAL YEAR 2018-19






BY PROGRAM, FISCAL YEAR 2018-19







INTO THE SECOND SEMESTER BY ADMISSION TYPE, FALL 2015 - FALL 2019



INTO THE SECOND YEAR BY ADMISSION TYPE, FALL 2014 - FALL 2018







FALL 2019





5-Megawatt Photovoltaic System -- Parking Lot Canopies, Ground-Mount, and Roof-Mounted Solar Panels. System was completed and went live Summer 2019.

# **Under Construction In 2020**

- 1 **Athletic Field Sports Lighting.** Anticipated project completion summer 2020.
- 2 **Bischoff Hall Elevator Upgrades**. The project is expected to begin in May 2020 and be completed by August 2020.
- Campus-wide Fire Alarm Monitoring and Network Upgrade from a dedicated copper/fiber network to an Internet Protocol (IP) based system. Pine Hall has been completely retrofitted with all new addressable detection systems. All existing network switches located in buildings equipped with emergency generators are now connected to the generators. The new fire alarm monitoring system head end computers located in Public Safety are live and are connected to G-Building and the Adler Center fire panels. The migration to the new system is ongoing.
- College Park Apartments (CPA) Lodge Courts Renovation. The project started in Fall of 2019 and expected completion by end of spring 2020.
- College Park Apartments (CPA) Two Transformer Replacements. Bids were solicited for this project in February 2020. Construction is expected to begin at the end of May 2020 and be completed in August of 2020.
- 6 **Library Rehabilitation and Learning Commons Addition.** Construction began in August of 2019. The project is scheduled to be completed in the Fall of 2021.


