



NEW UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANTS BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2020



NEW UNDERGRADUATE ADMITS BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2020





NEW INCOMING STUDENTS BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2020**





NEW UNDERGRADUATES BY ADMISSION CATEGORY, FALL 2020



RACE/ETHNICITY AND SEX OF ALL FIRST-TIME, DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS, FALL 2020





FALL 2010 - FALL 2020**



NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2020



NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2020



ENTERING TRANSFERS FROM NEW JERSEY PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES, FALL 2020



NEW GRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2020




UNDERGRADUATE HEADCOUNTS, FALL 2016 - FALL 2020



GRADUATE HEADCOUNTS, FALL 2016 - FALL 2020



FALL 2016 - FALL 2020



ALL UNDERGRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2020



ENROLLED UNDERGRADUATES BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2020



ALL GRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2020



ENROLLED GRADUATES BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2020





GRADUATE STUDENT ENROLLMENT BY PROGRAM, FALL 2020



UNDERGRADUATE AWARDS BY TYPE OF DEGREE, FISCAL YEAR 2019-20



GRADUATE AWARDS BY TYPE OF DEGREE, FISCAL YEAR 2019-20



UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES BY SCHOOL, FISCAL YEAR 2019-20



GRADUATE DEGREES BY PROGRAM AND SCHOOL, FISCAL YEAR 2019-20



BY SCHOOL AND INITIAL ADMIT TYPE, FISCAL YEAR 2019-20



BY PROGRAM, FISCAL YEAR 2019-20




FIGURE 3.7
OVERALL GRADE DISTRIBUTION, FALL 2020



INTO THE SECOND SEMESTER BY ADMISSION TYPE, FALL 2016 - FALL 2020





RAMAPO ALUMNI IN USA: FALL 2020**



RAMAPO ALUMNI BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2020





FALL 2020






FALL 2020








- 1 **Bischoff Hall Elevator Upgrades.** The project began in May 2020 and was completed in August 2020.
- 2 **College Park Apartments (CPA) Lodge Courts Renovation.** The project started in Fall 2019 and was completed in August 2020.
- 3 **College Park Apartments (CPA) Two Transformer Replacements.** Bids were solicited for this project in February 2020. Construction began at the end of May 2020 and the project was completed in August of 2020.

Under Construction In 2021

- 1 **Athletic Field Sports Lighting.** The project was delayed due to COVID-19, and will be completed in Summer 2021.
- 2 **Campus-wide Fire Alarm Monitoring and Network Upgrade** from a dedicated copper/fiber network to an Internet Protocol (IP) based system. Pine Hall has been completely retrofitted with all new addressable detection systems. All existing network switches located in buildings equipped with emergency generators are now connected to the generators. The new fire alarm monitoring system head end computers located in Public Safety are live and are connected to G-Building and the Adler Center fire panels. The migration to the new system is ongoing.
- 3 **Library Rehabilitation and Learning Commons Addition.** Construction began in August of 2019. The project is scheduled to be completed in the Fall of 2021.

Follow directions above "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM WESTCHESTER AND ROCKLAND COUNTIES

Follow Route 287 West over the Mario M. Cuomo Bridge (a.k.a. the Tappan Zee Bridge) to Route 17 South. Follow directions above for "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM THE EAST

Follow Route 80 or Route 4 to Route 17 North. Follow Route 17 North. Follow directions below for "From the South, Using Route 17."

FROM THE WEST

Follow Route 80 East to Route 287 North to Mahwah exit 66 (south on Route 17 to 202 South).

FROM NEW YORK CITY

Take the George Washington Bridge, Route 4 West to Route 17 North to 202 South.
