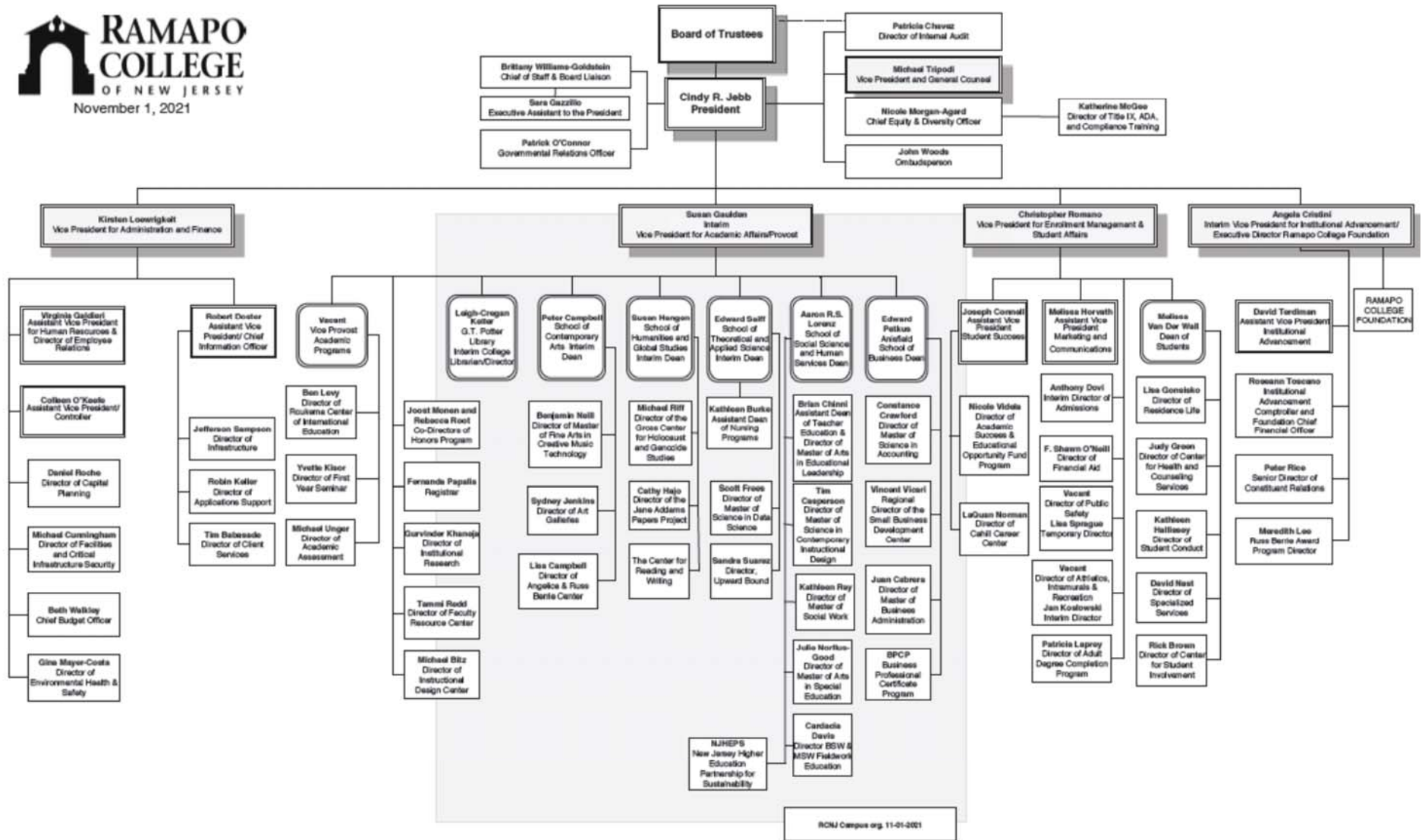

FALL 2011 - FALL 2021

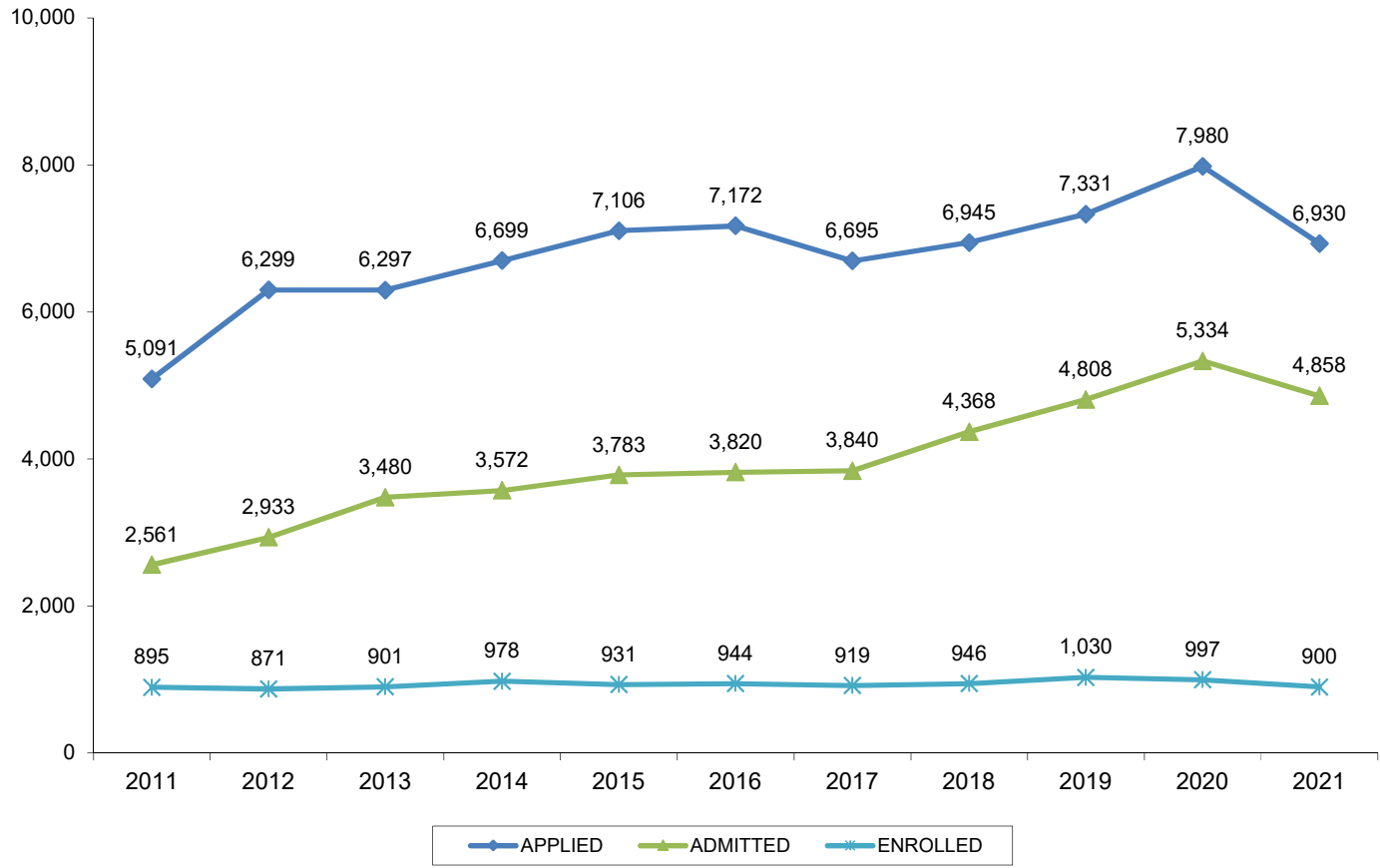

NEW UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANTS BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2021

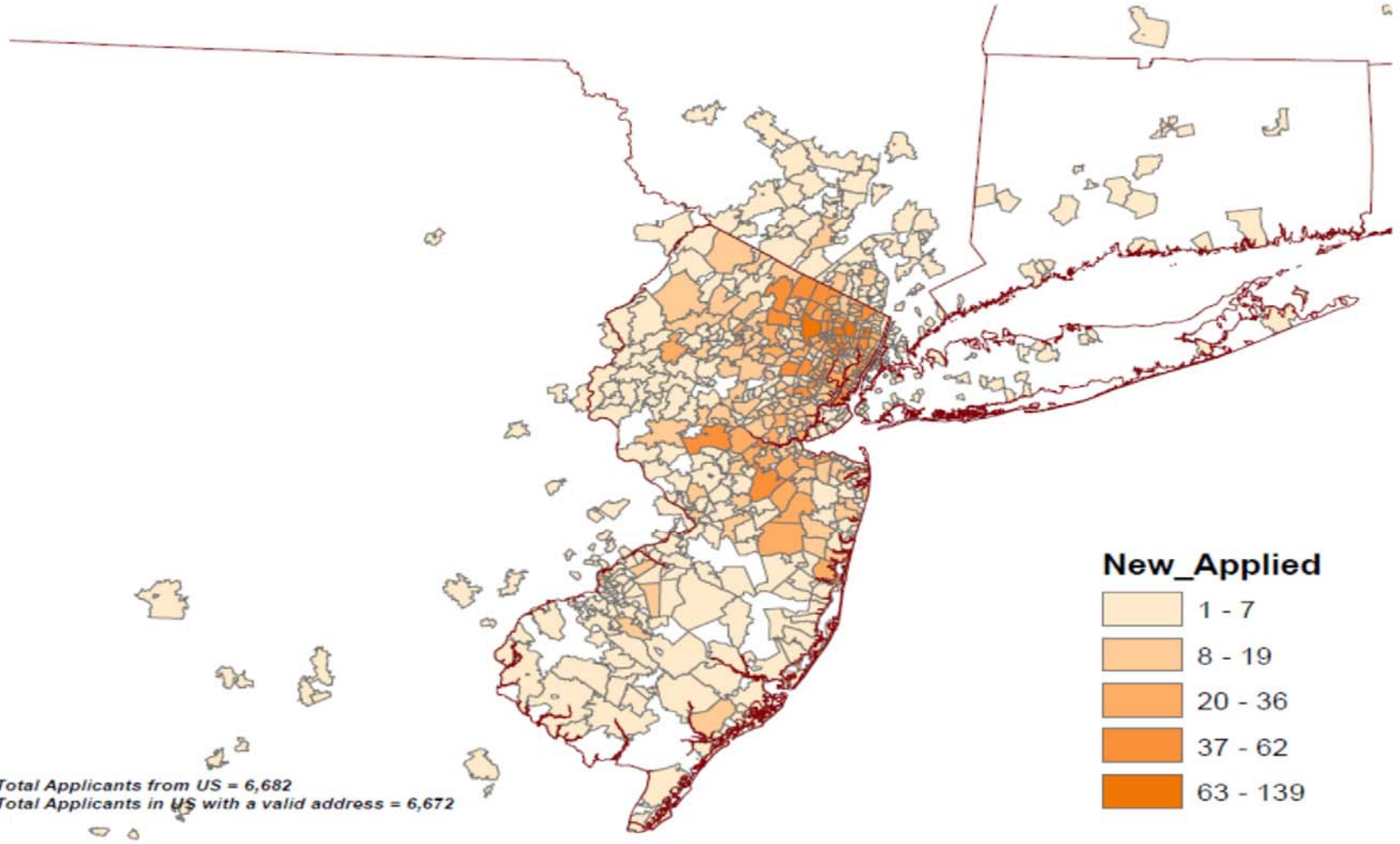

NEW UNDERGRADUATE ADMITS BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2021

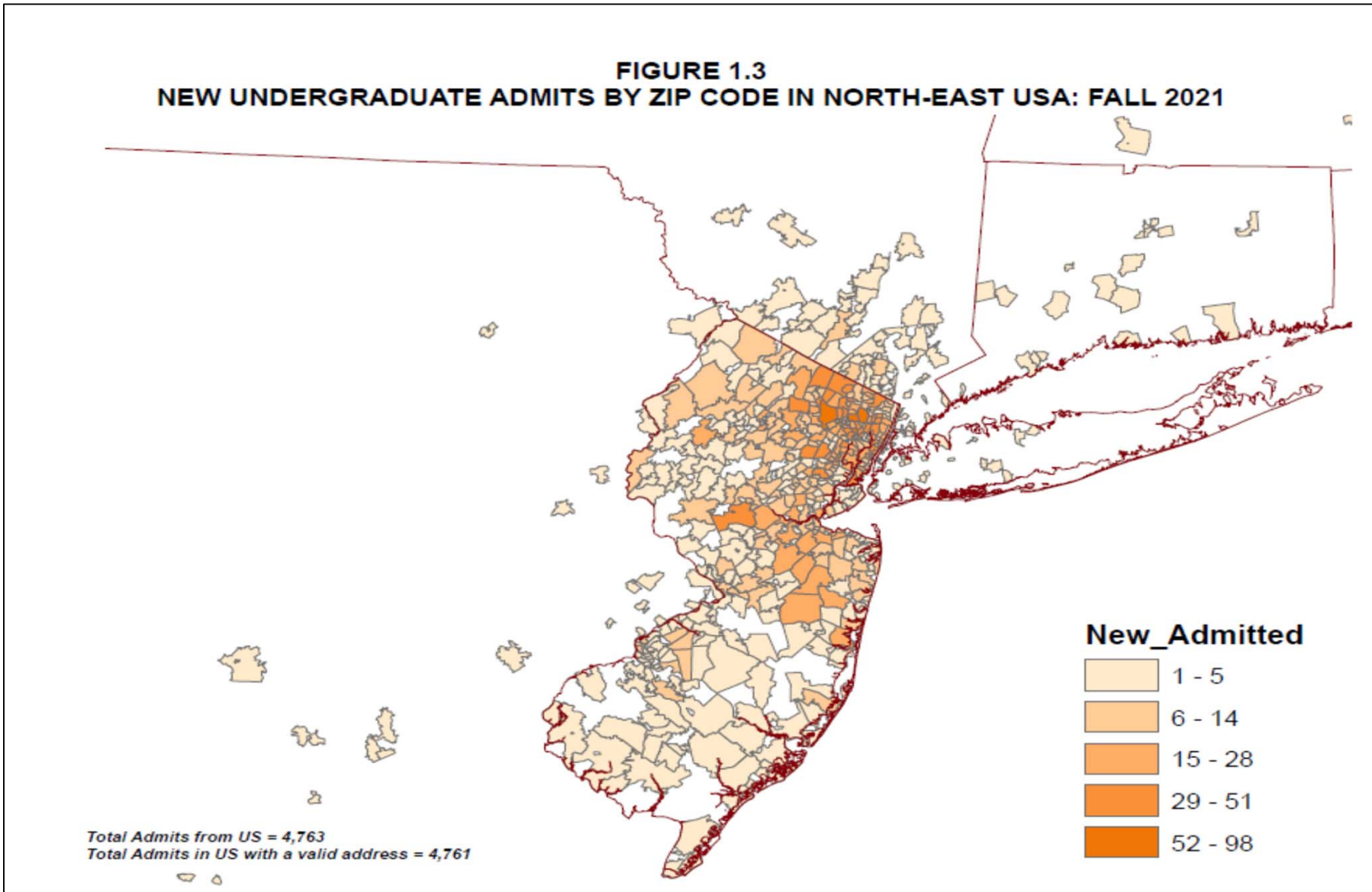

NEW UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2021

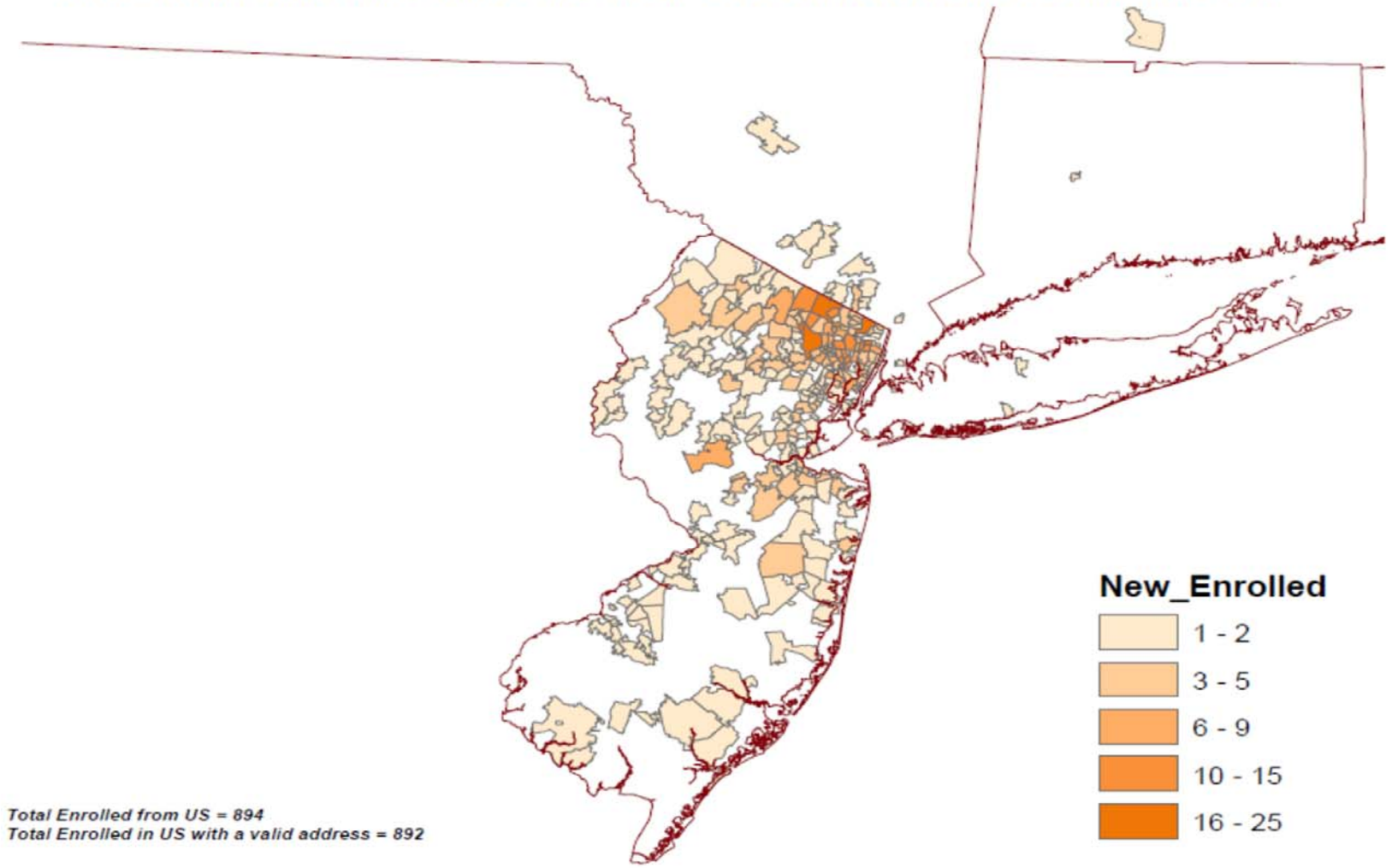
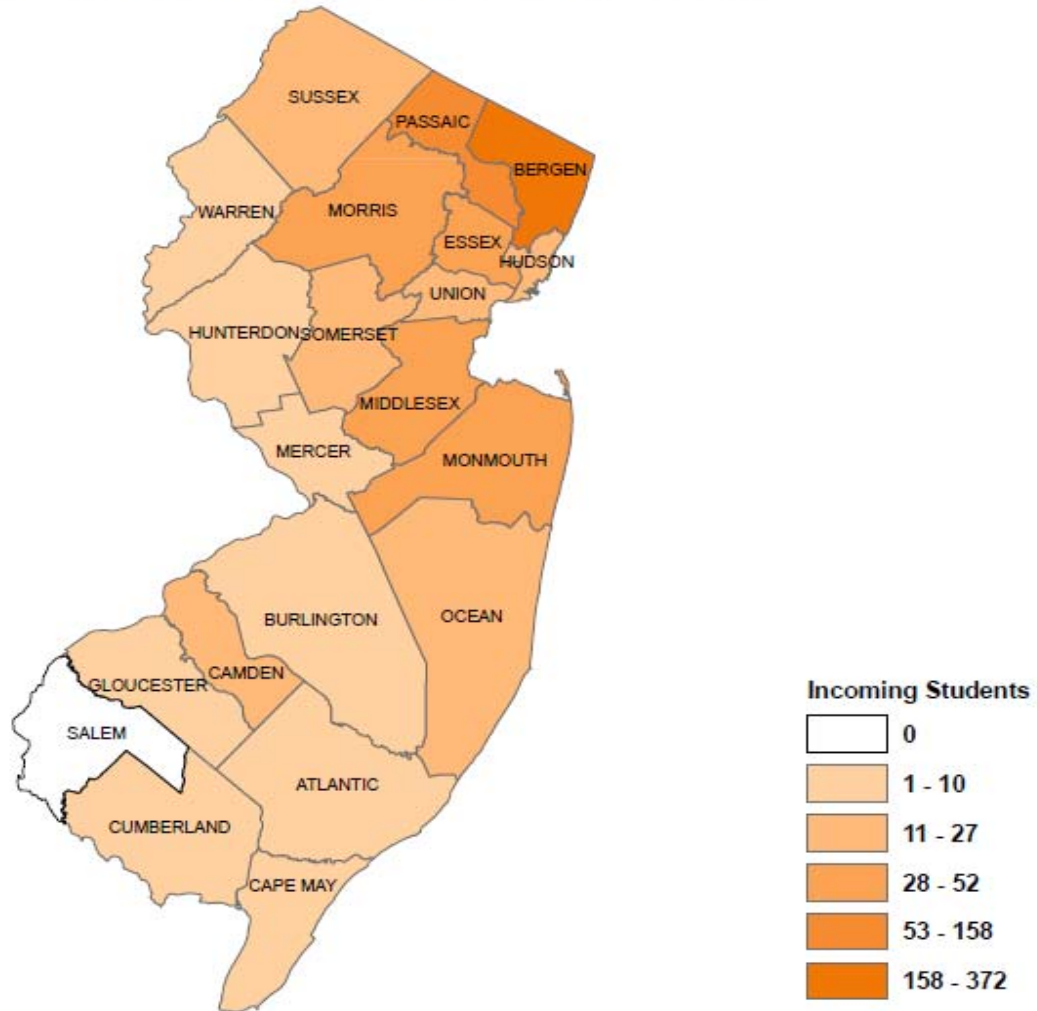

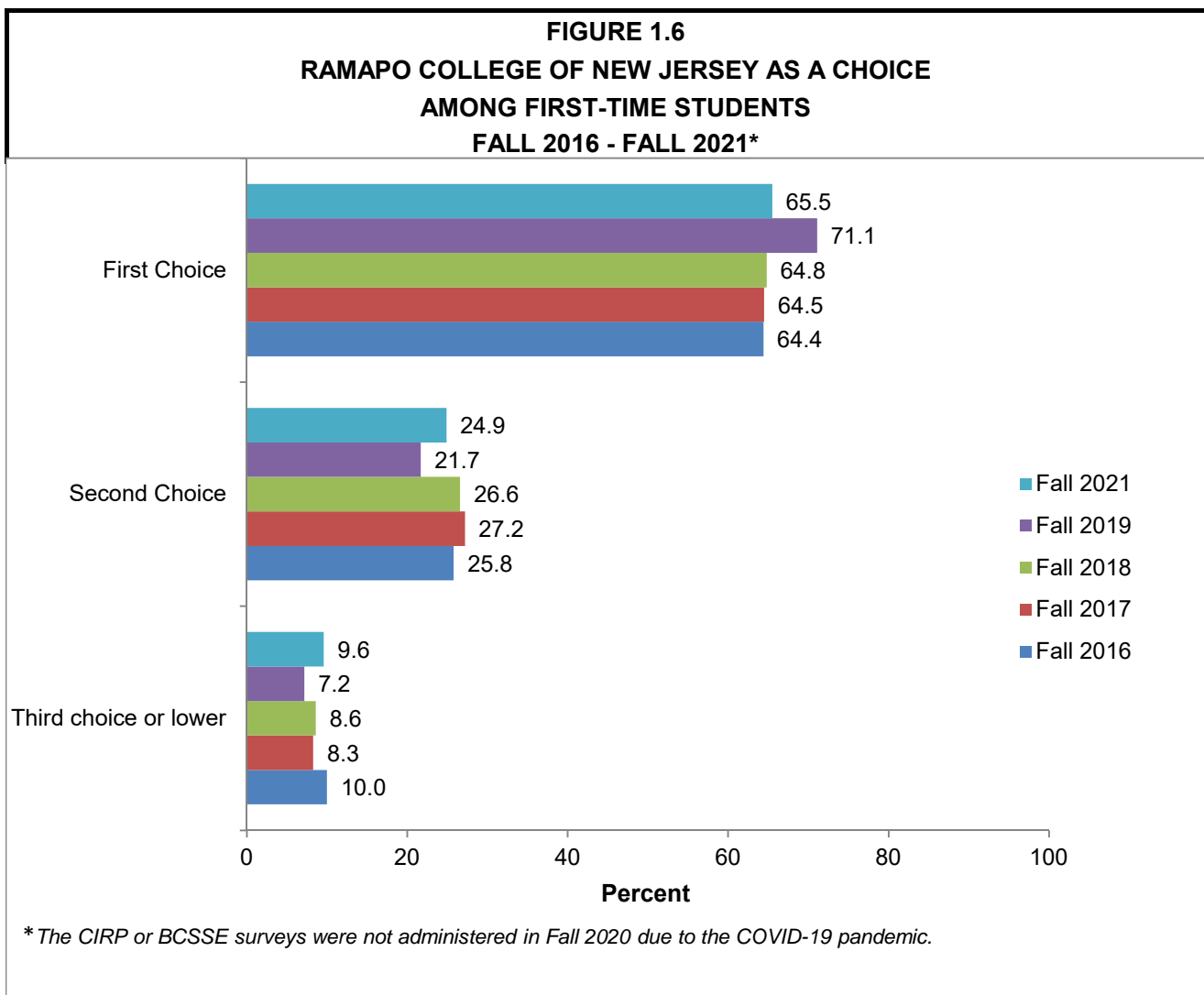

NEW UNDERGRADUATES BY ADMISSION CATEGORY, FALL 2021

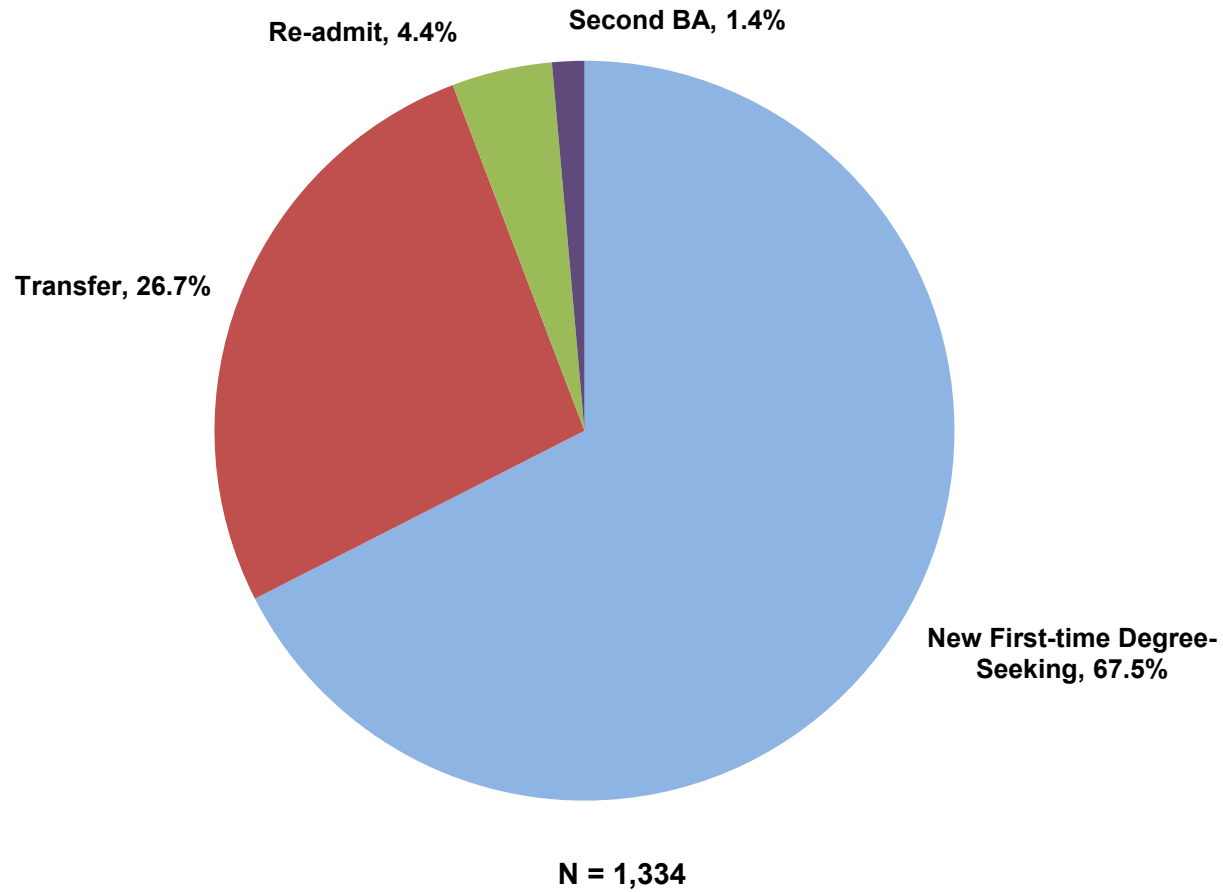

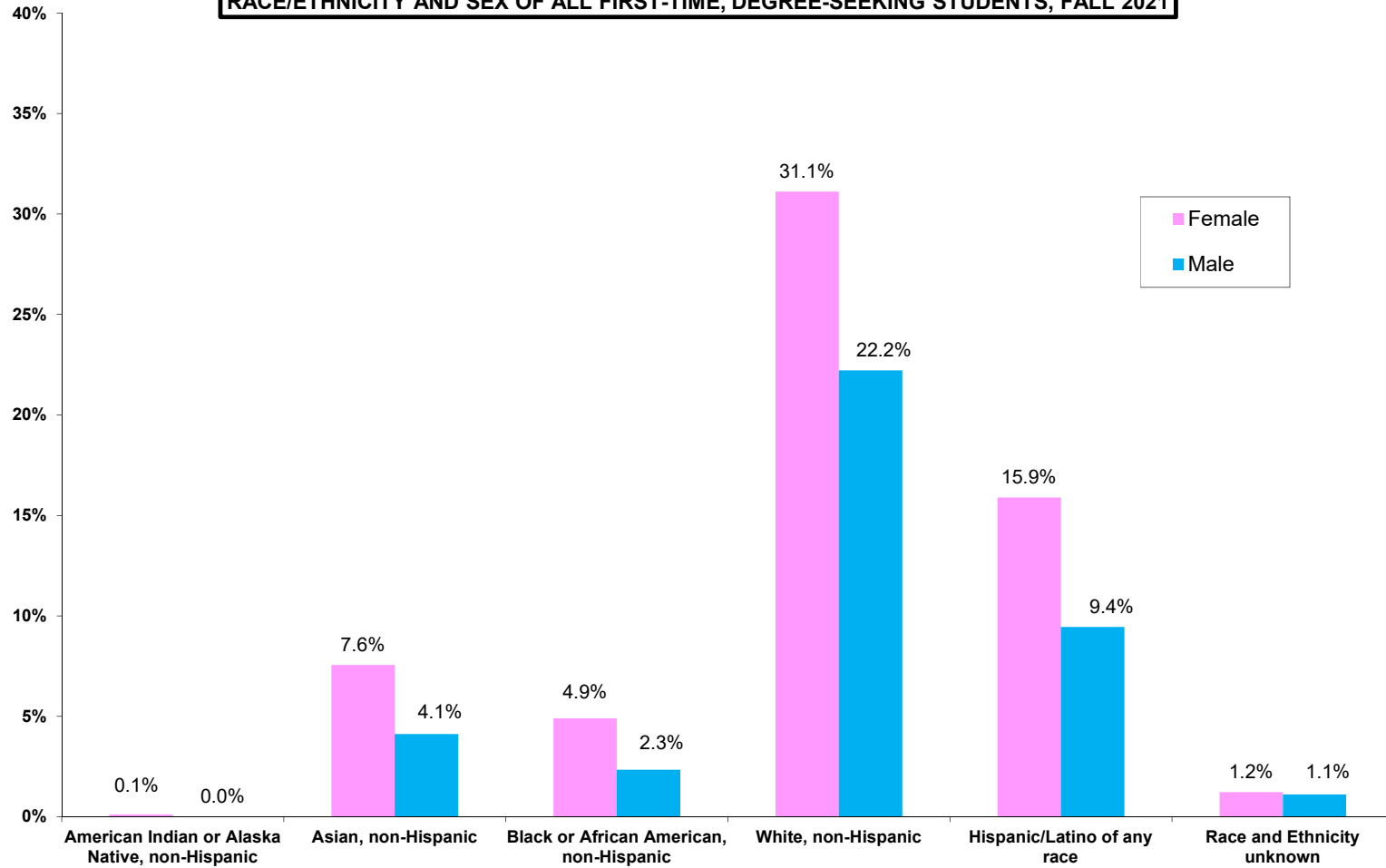

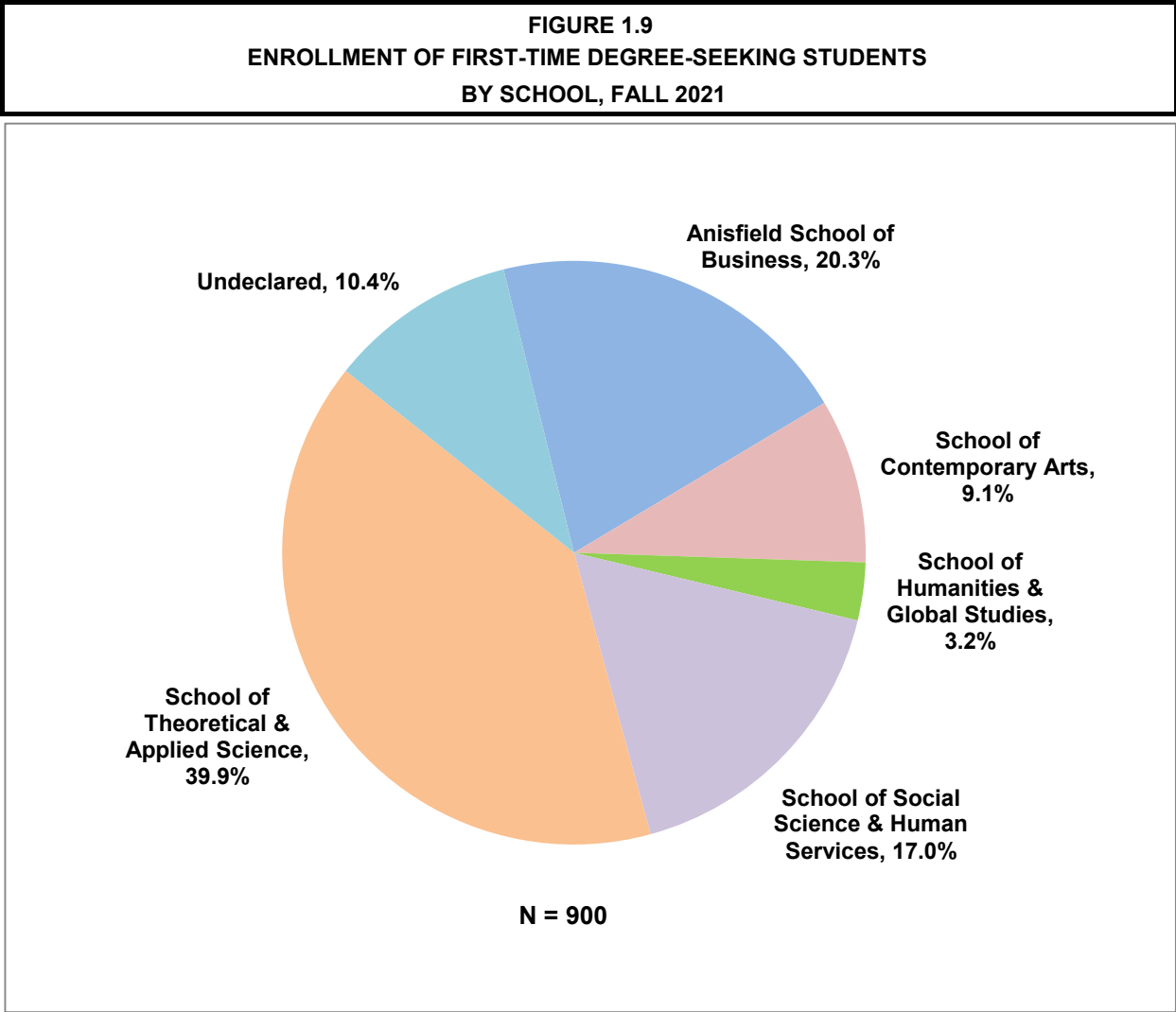

FALL 2011 - FALL 2021**

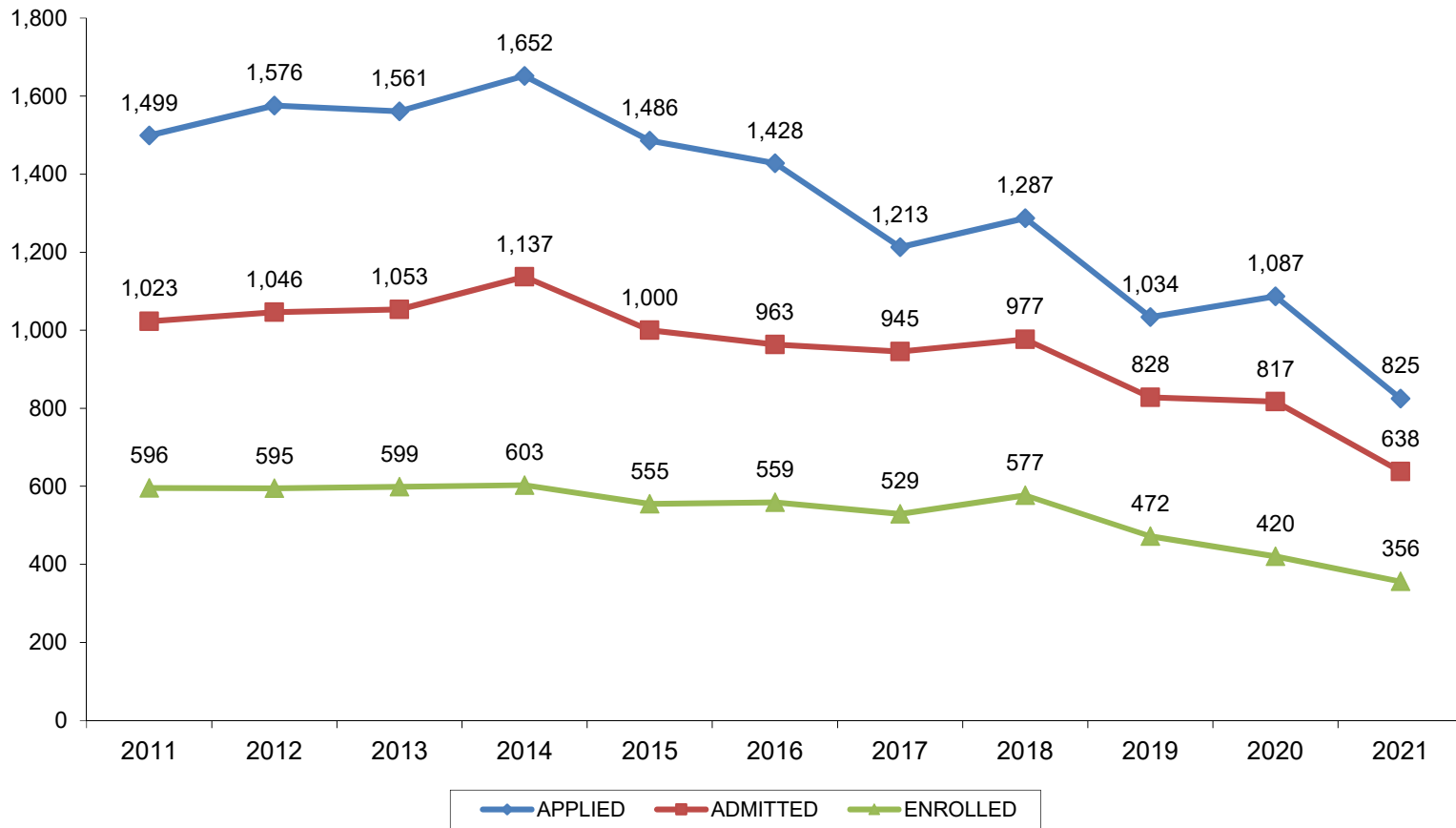

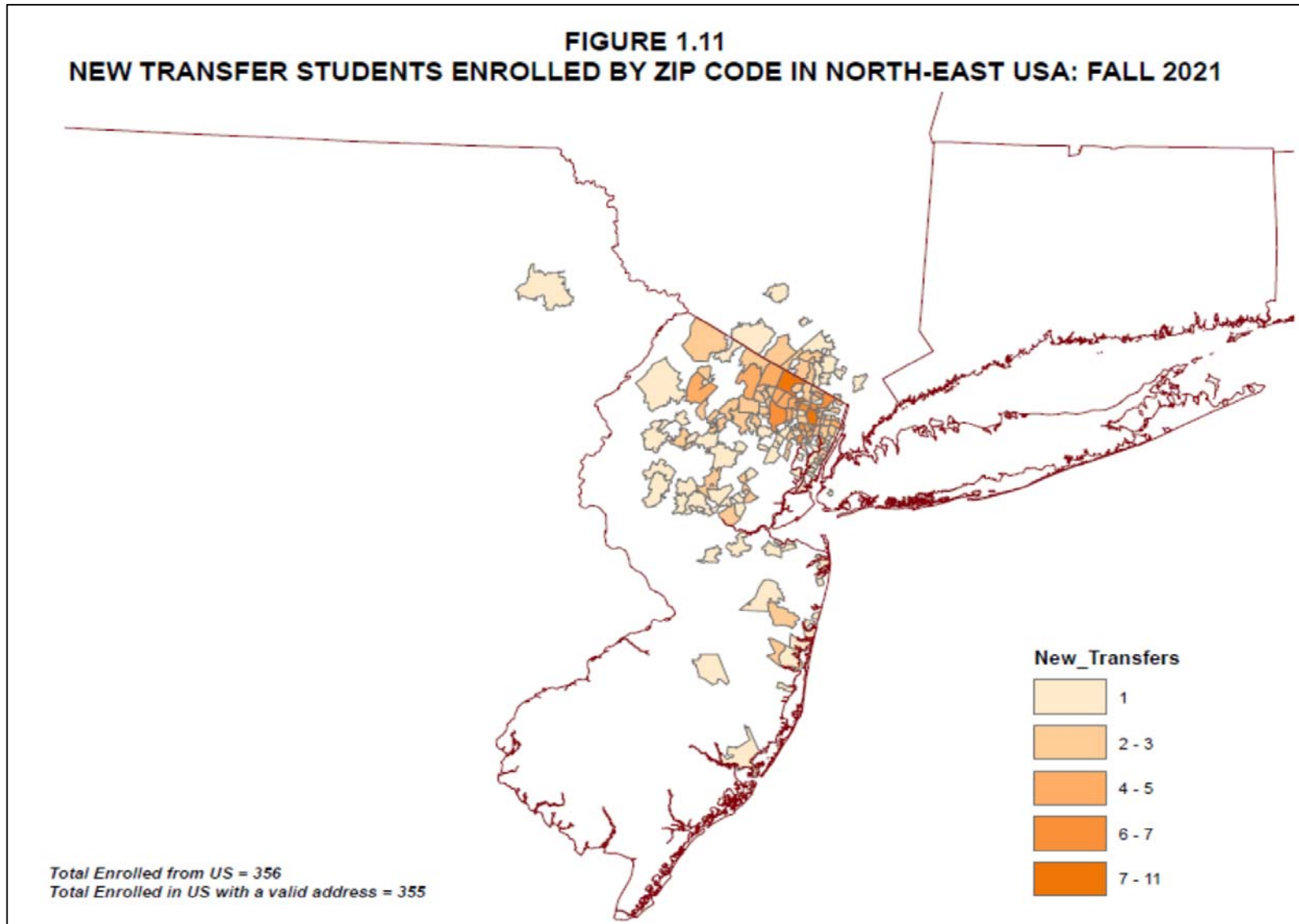
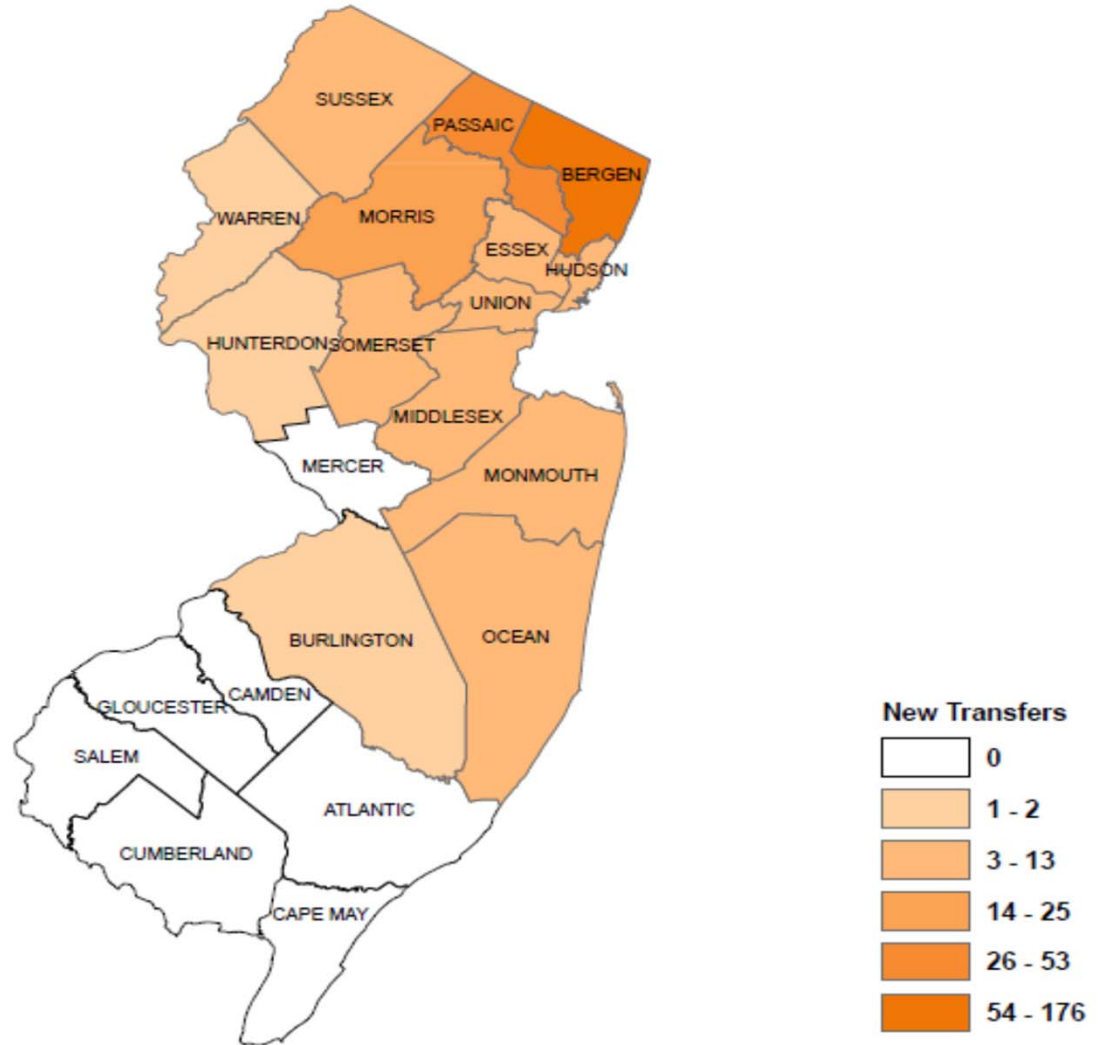

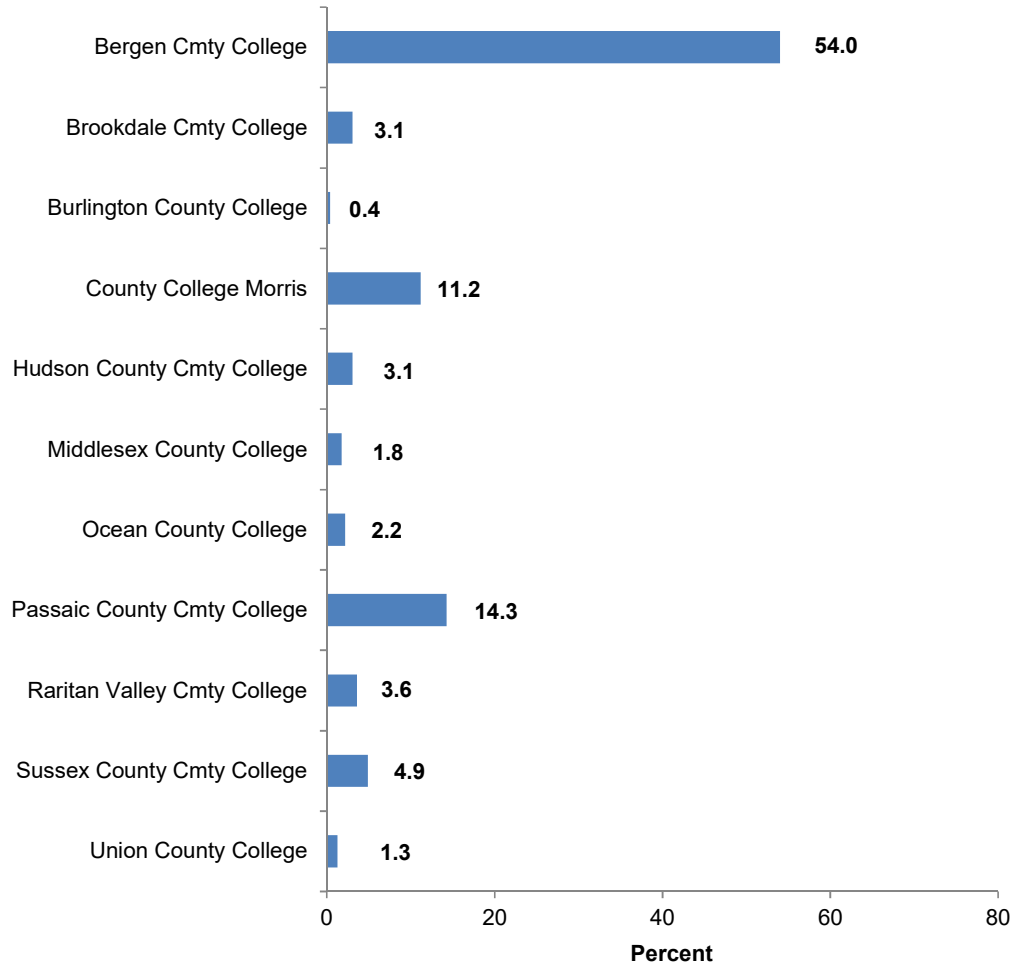

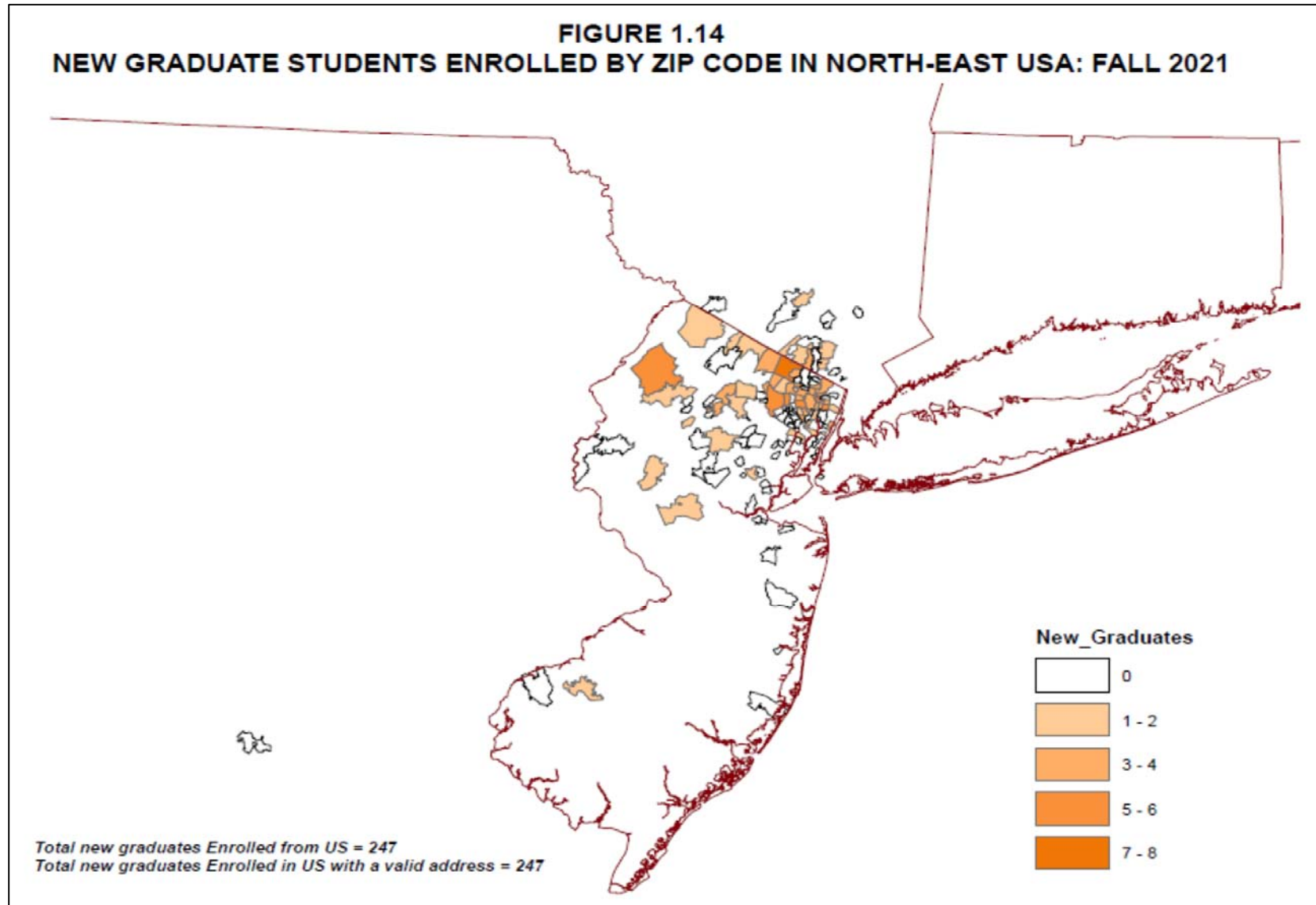
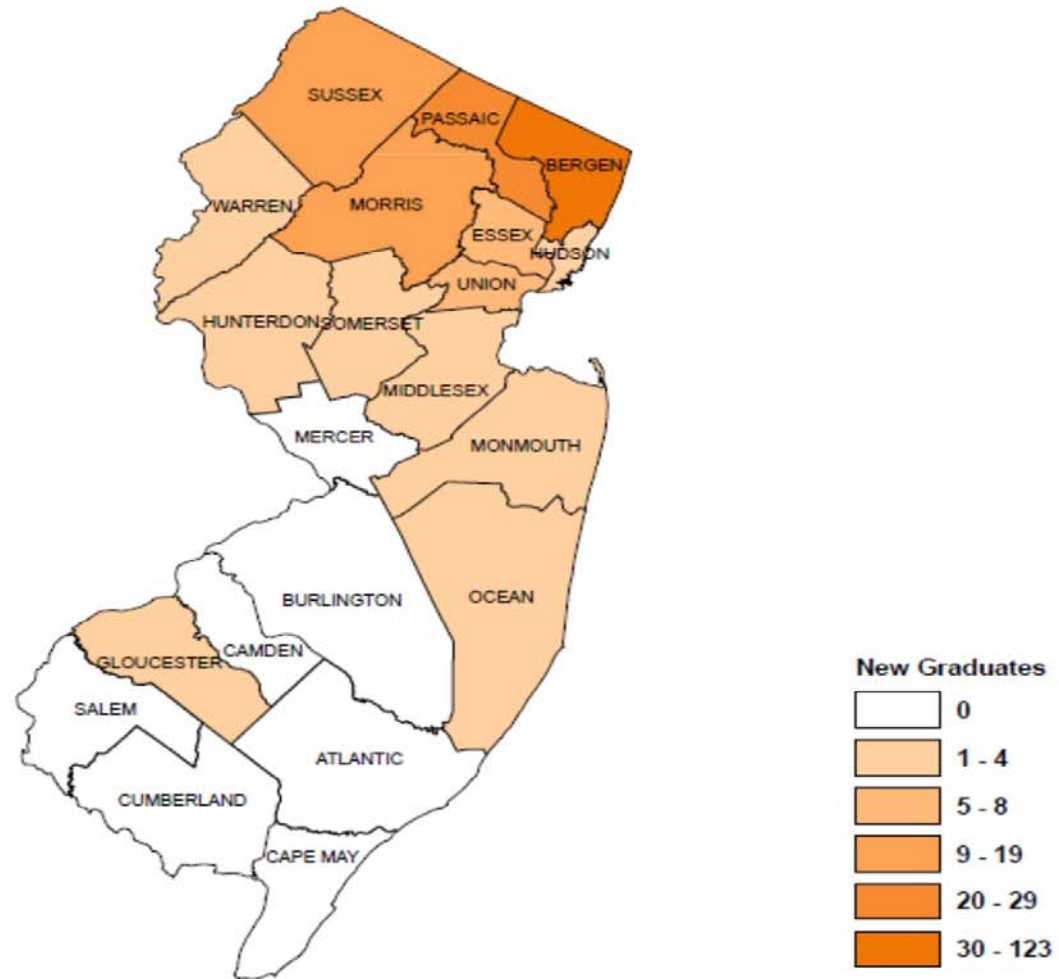

UNDERGRADUATE HEADCOUNTS, FALL 2017 - FALL 2021

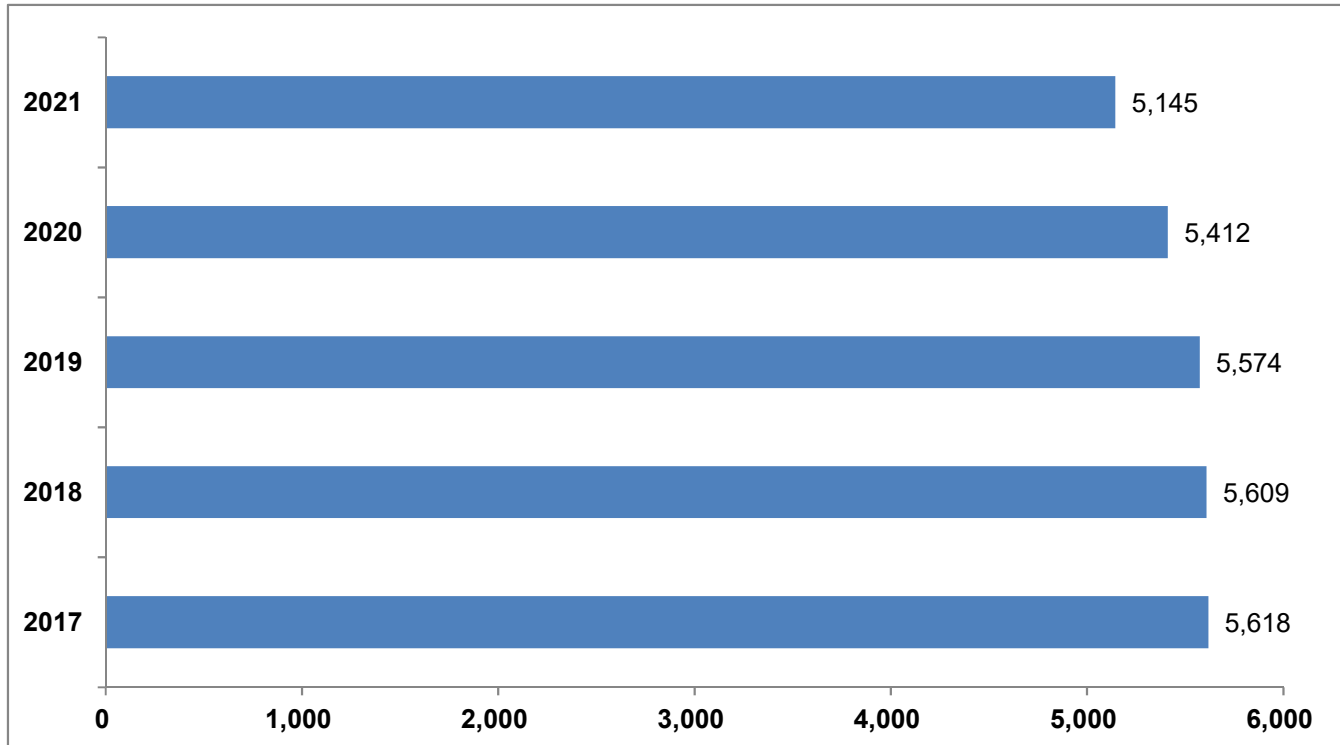

GRADUATE HEADCOUNTS, FALL 2017 - FALL 2021

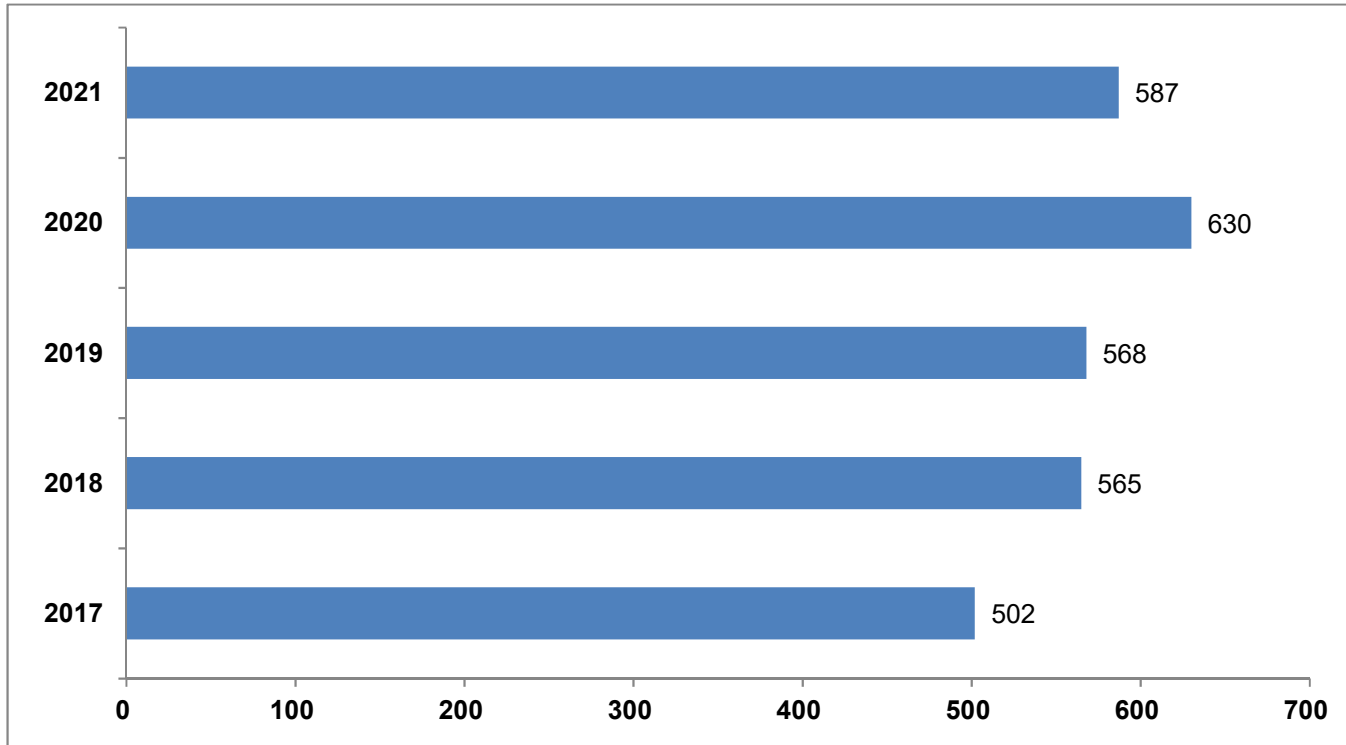

FALL 2017 - FALL 2021

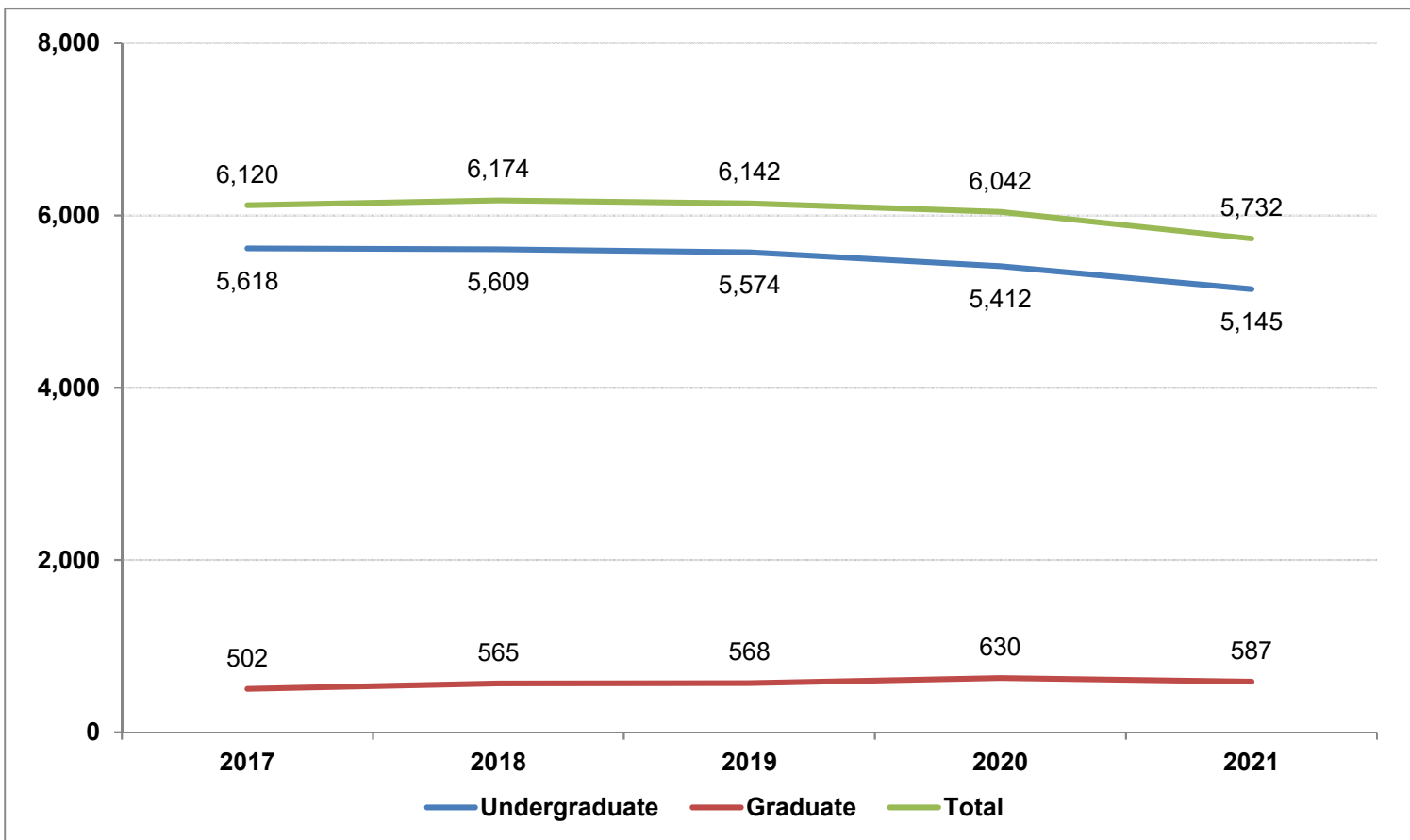

ALL UNDERGRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2021

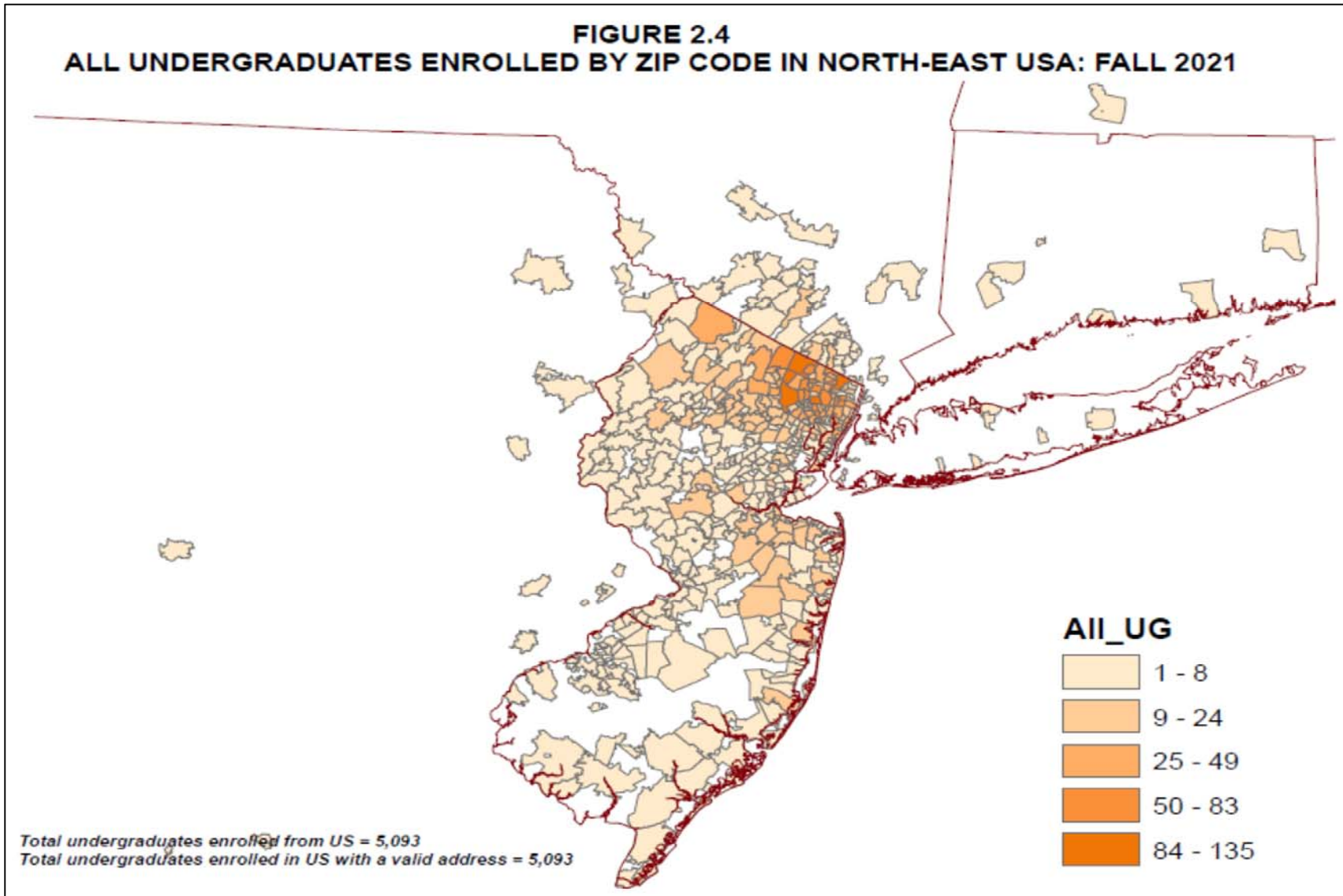
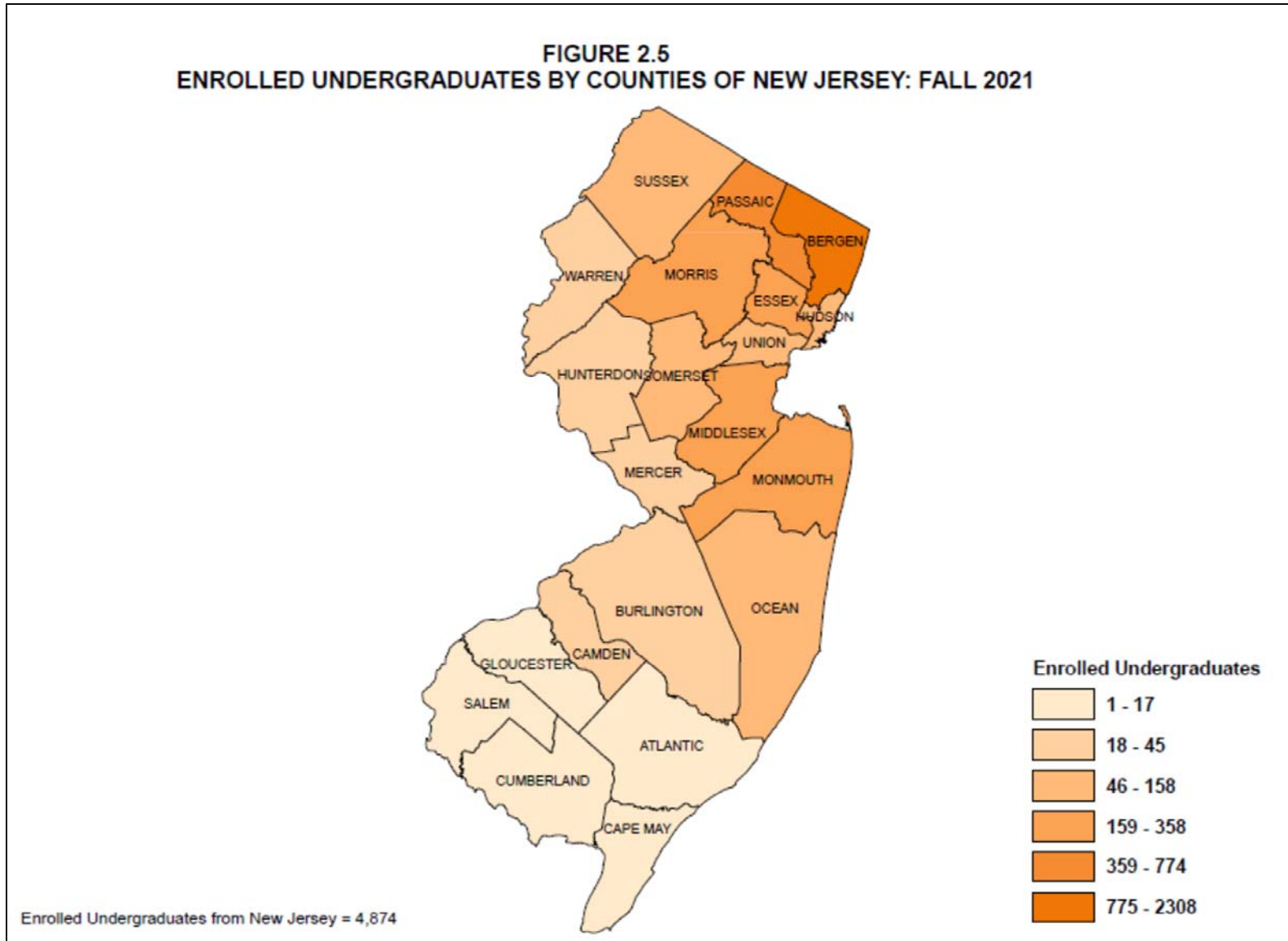

ENROLLED UNDERGRADUATES BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2021



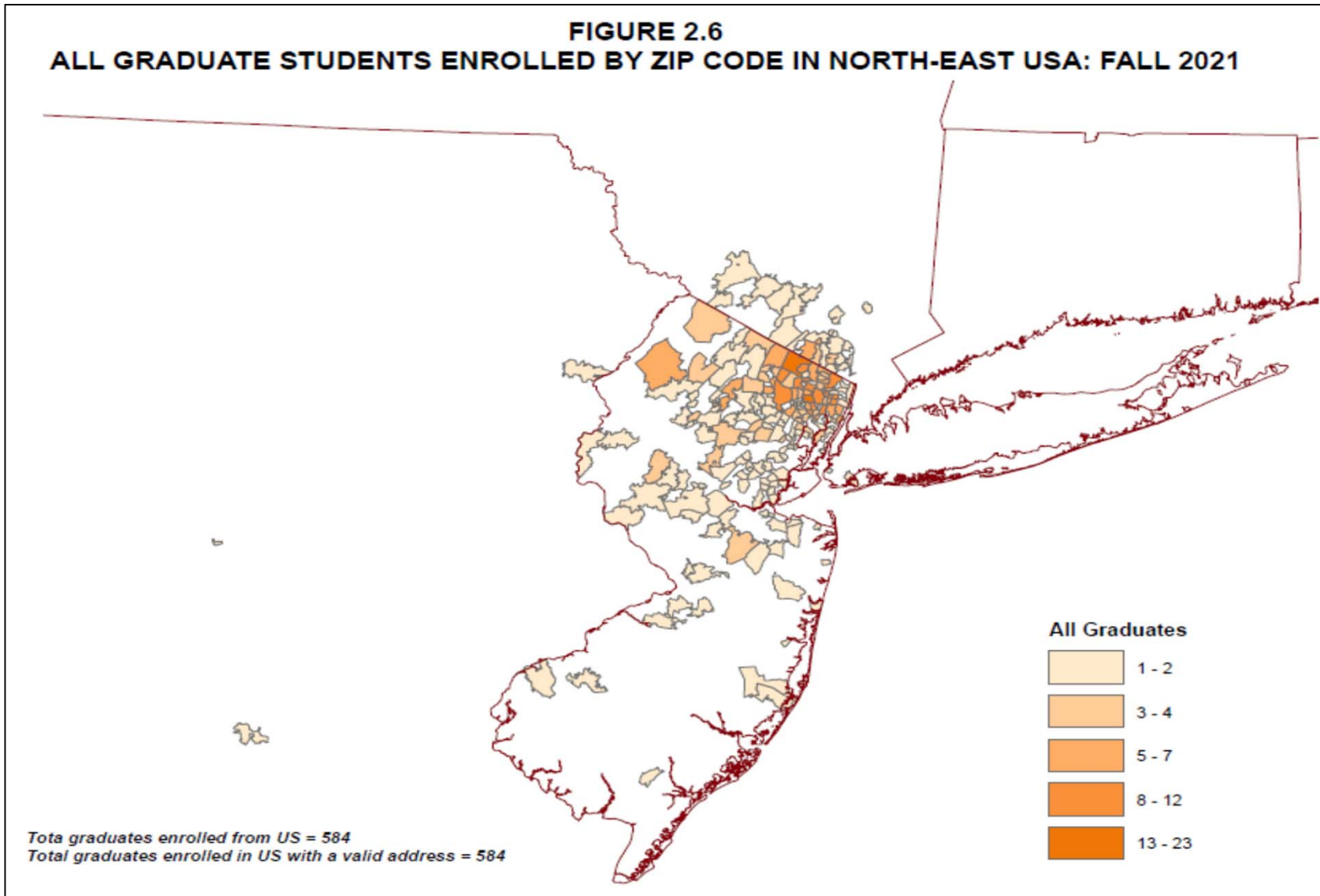

ENROLLED GRADUATES BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2021

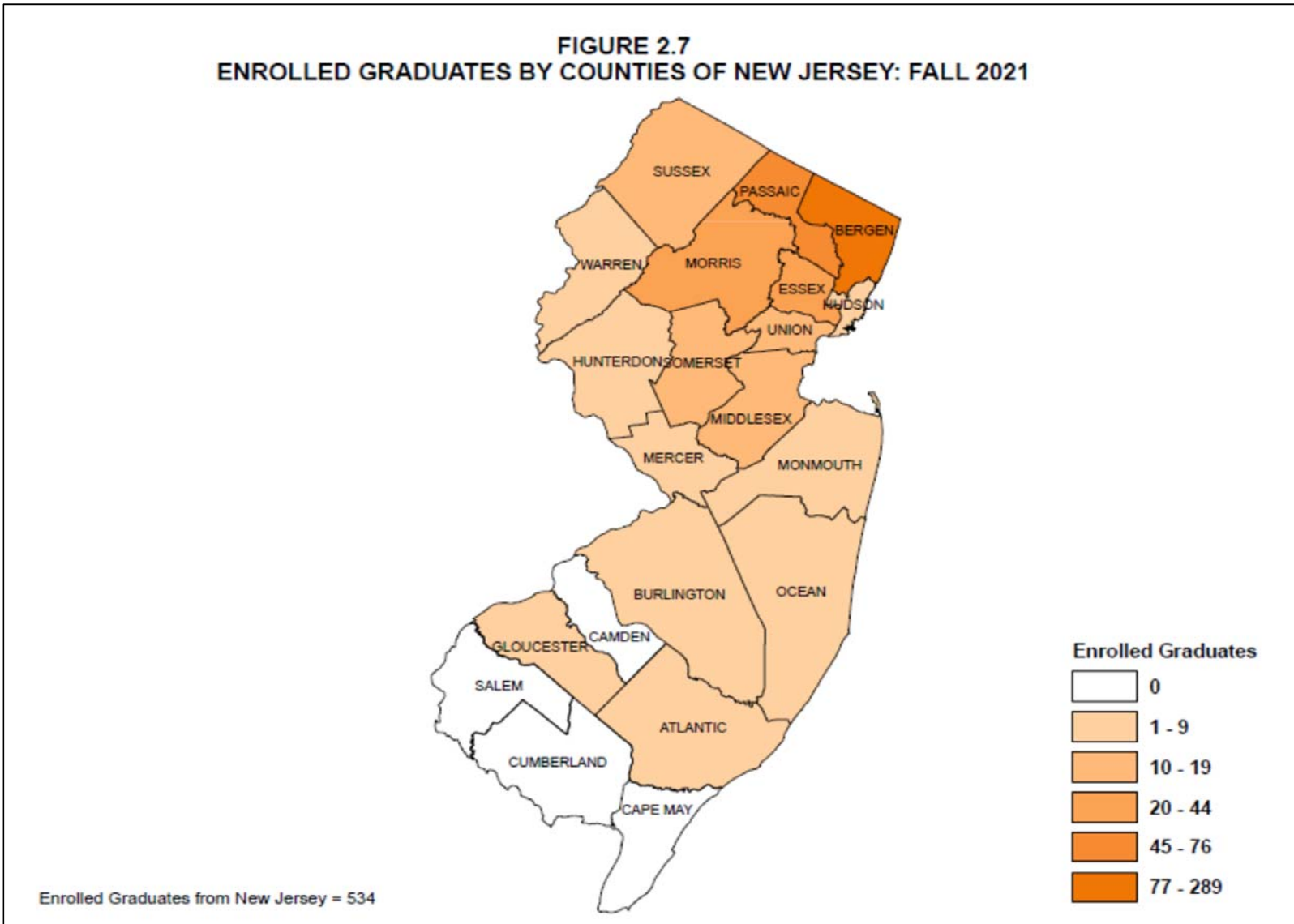

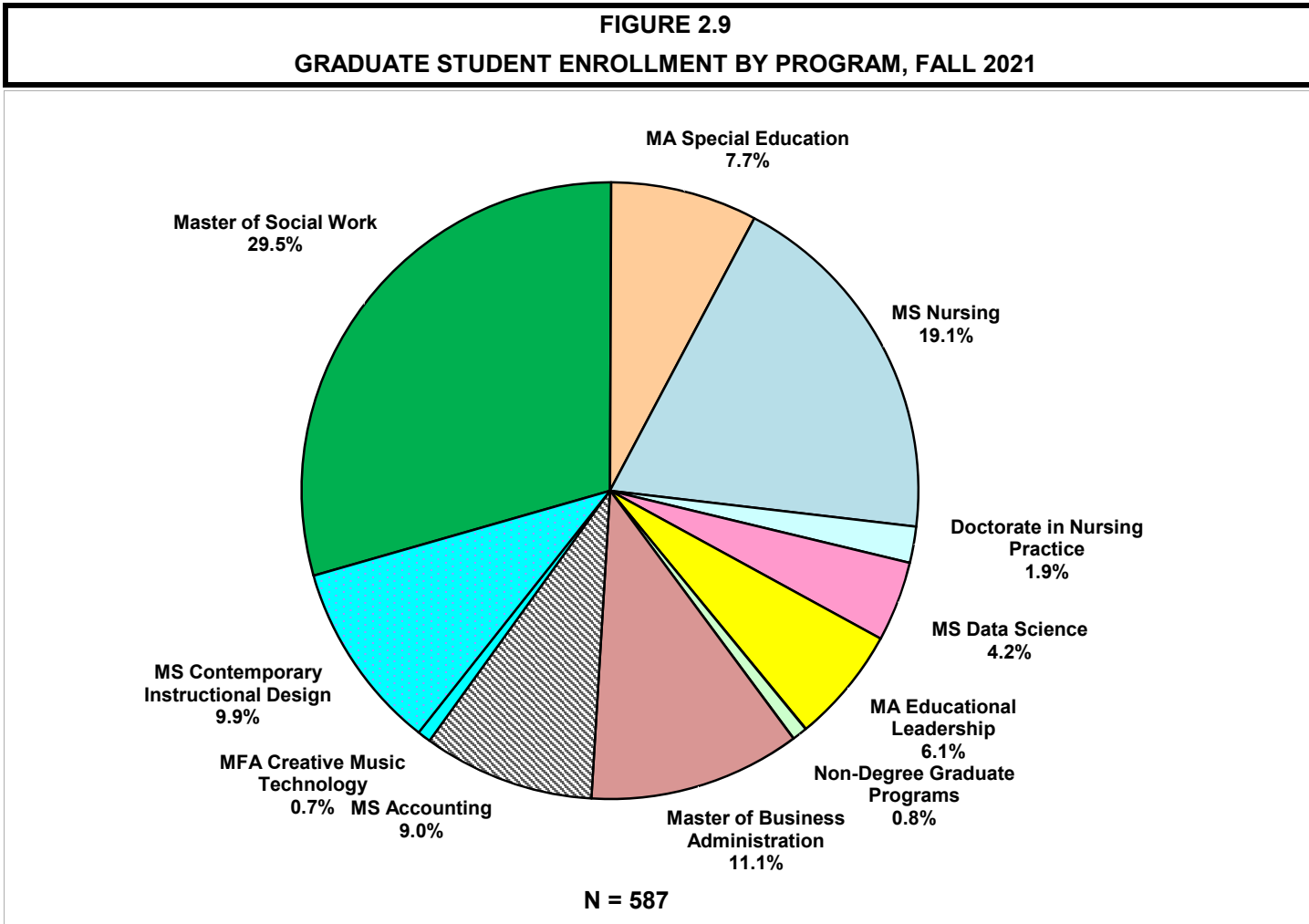

BY SCHOOL AND INITIAL ADMIT TYPE, FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

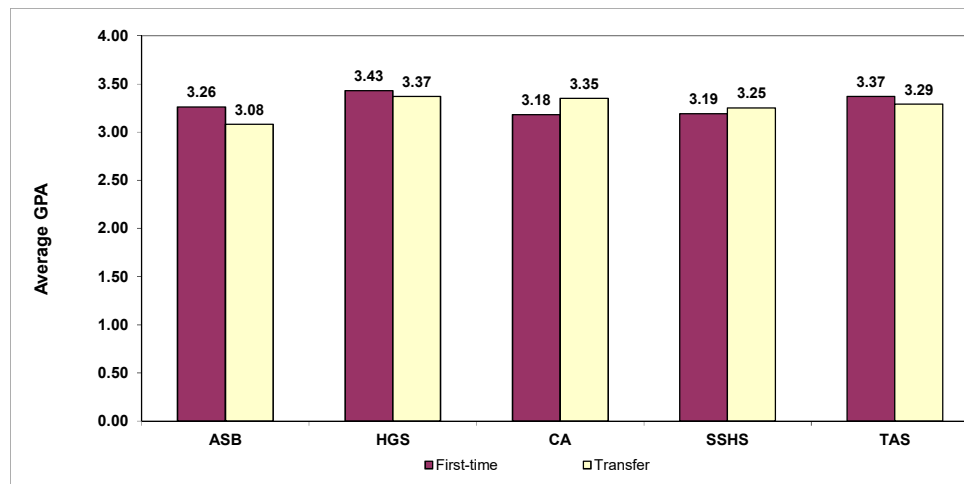

BY PROGRAM, FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

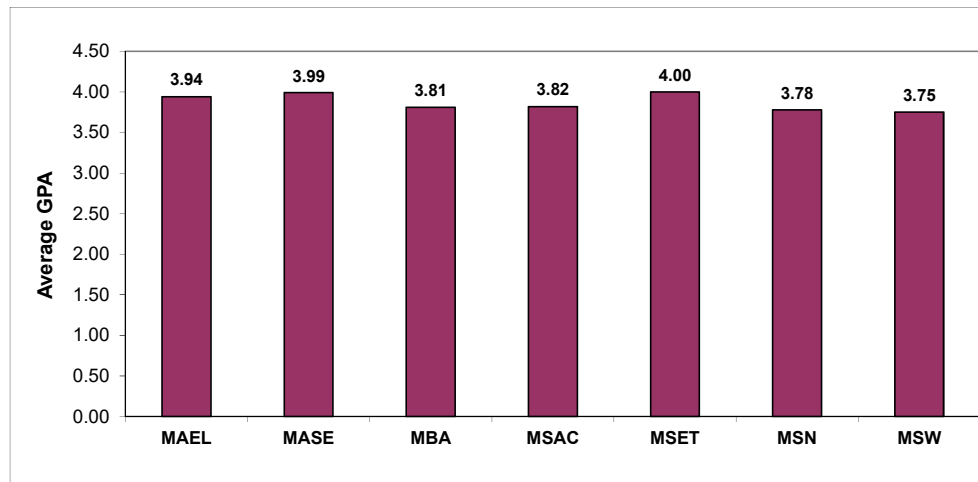


FIGURE 3.7
OVERALL GRADE DISTRIBUTION, FALL 2021

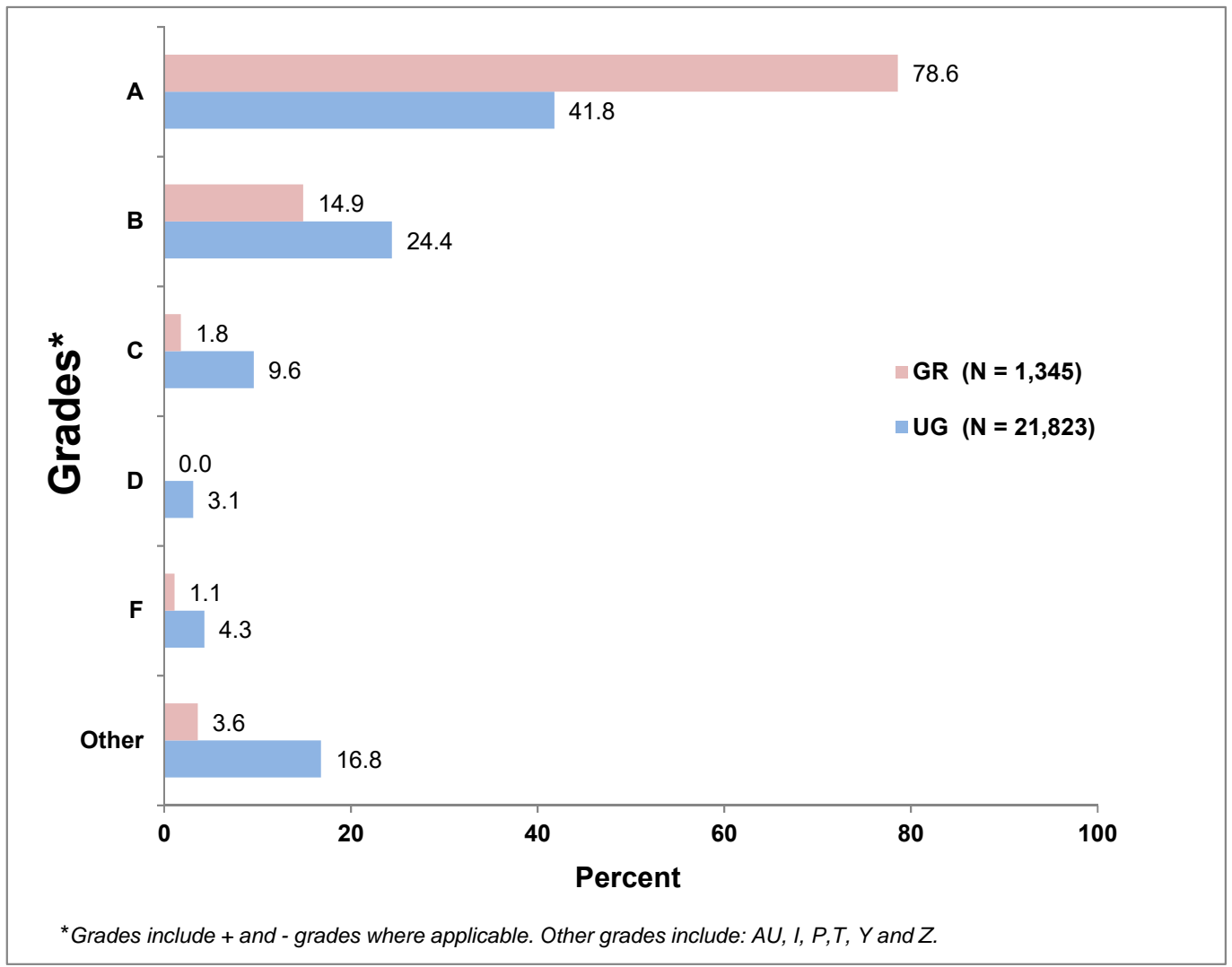

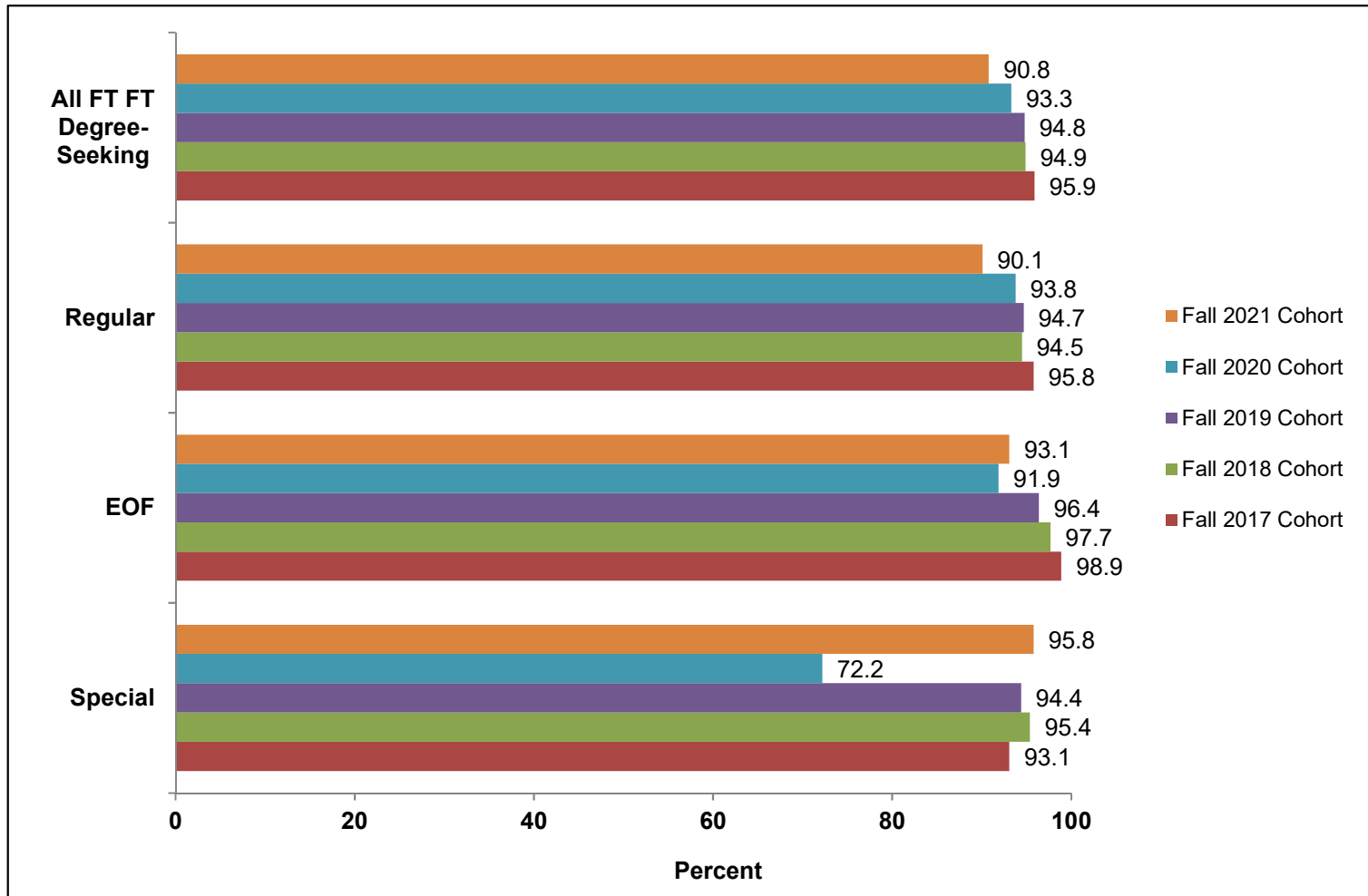

INTO THE SECOND YEAR BY ADMISSION TYPE, FALL 2016 - FALL 2020

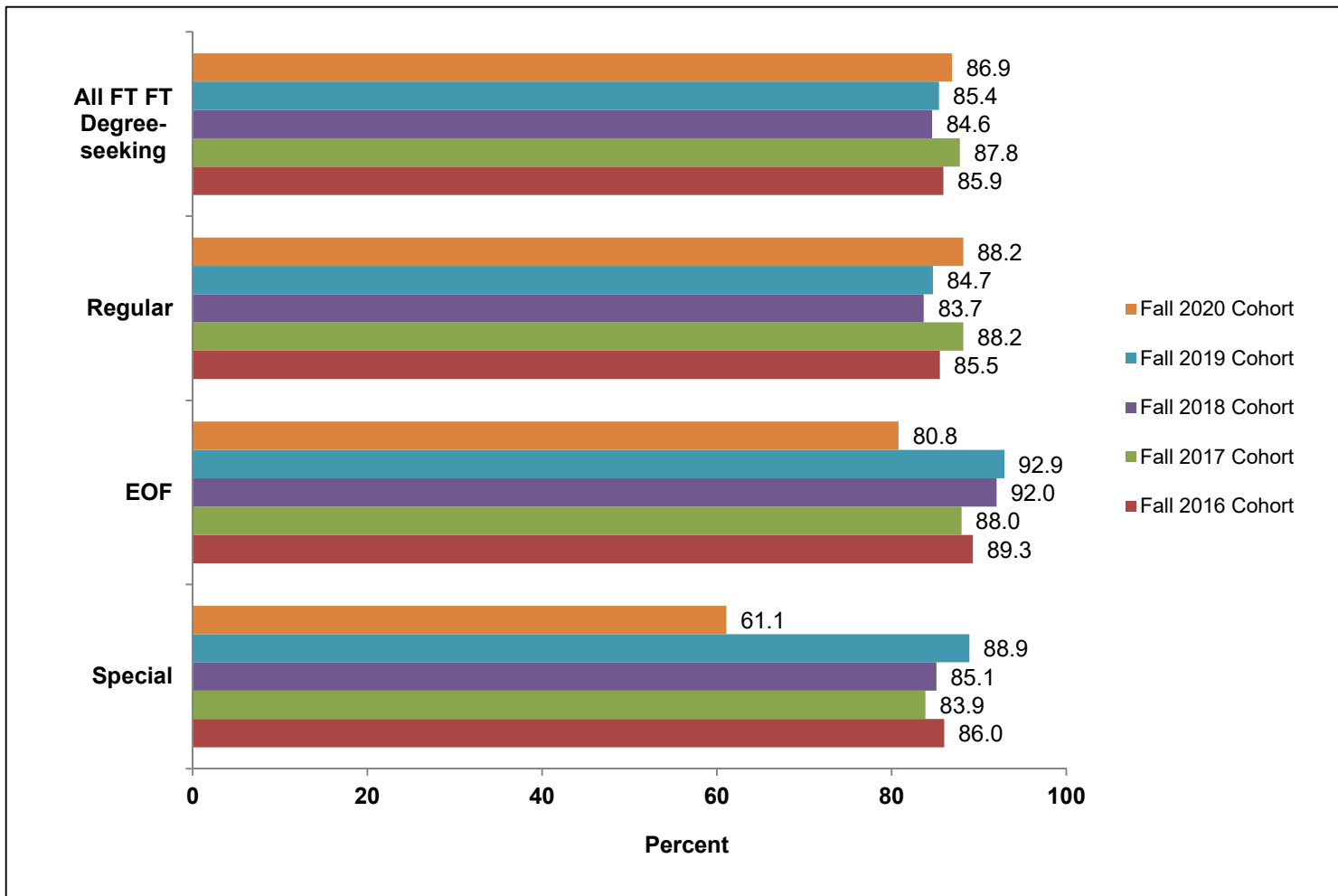

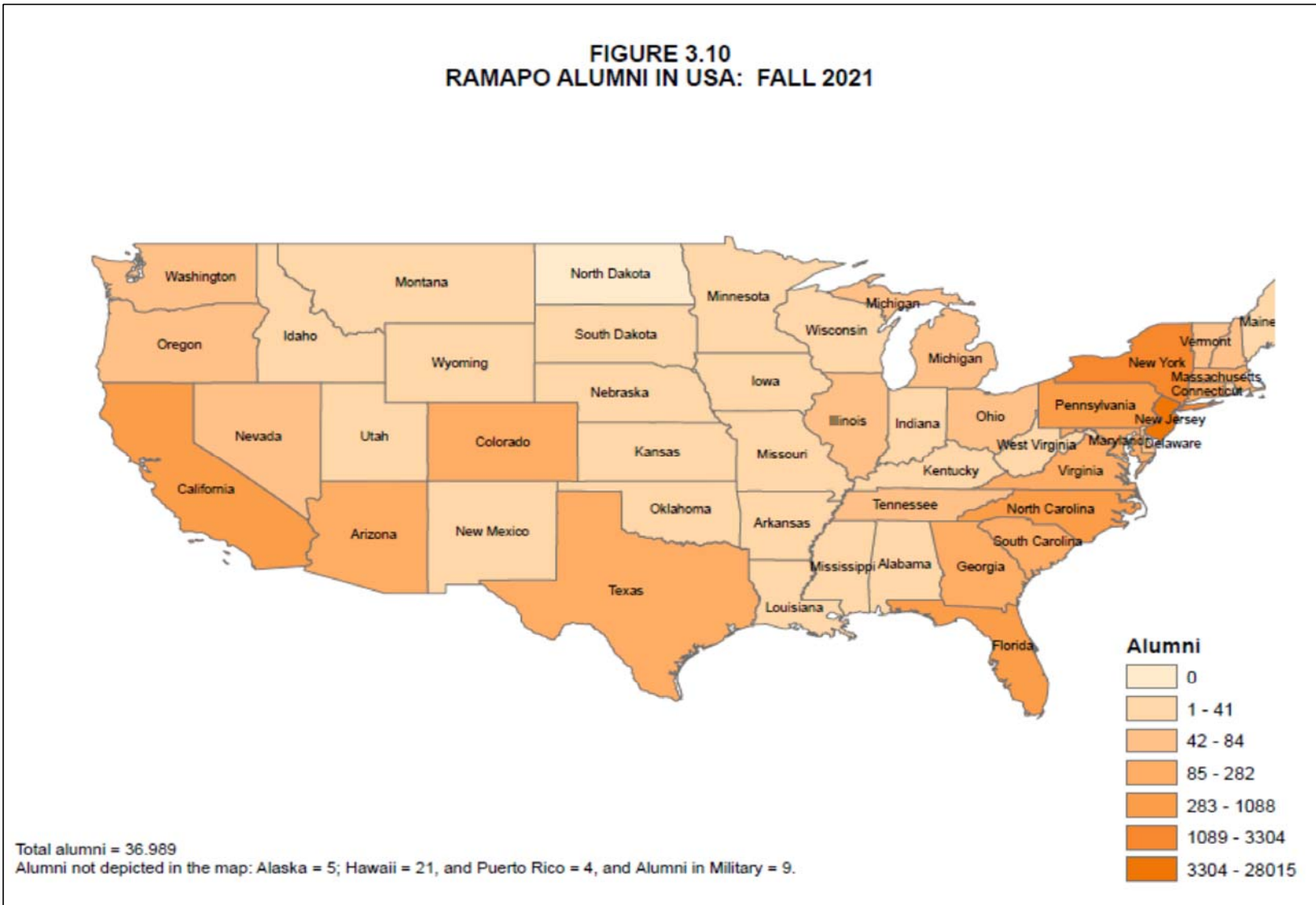

RAMAPO ALUMNI BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2021**

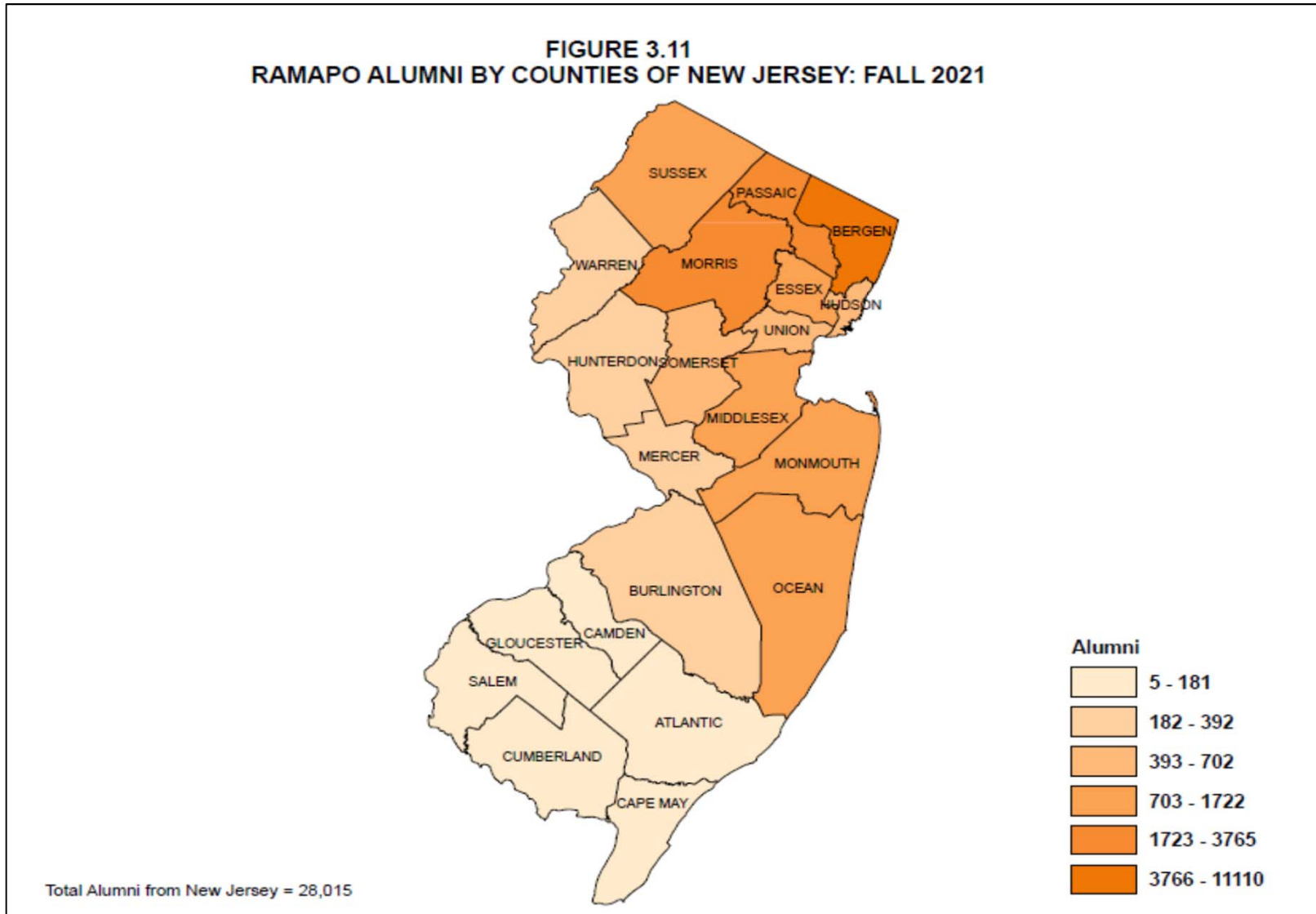

FALL 2021**

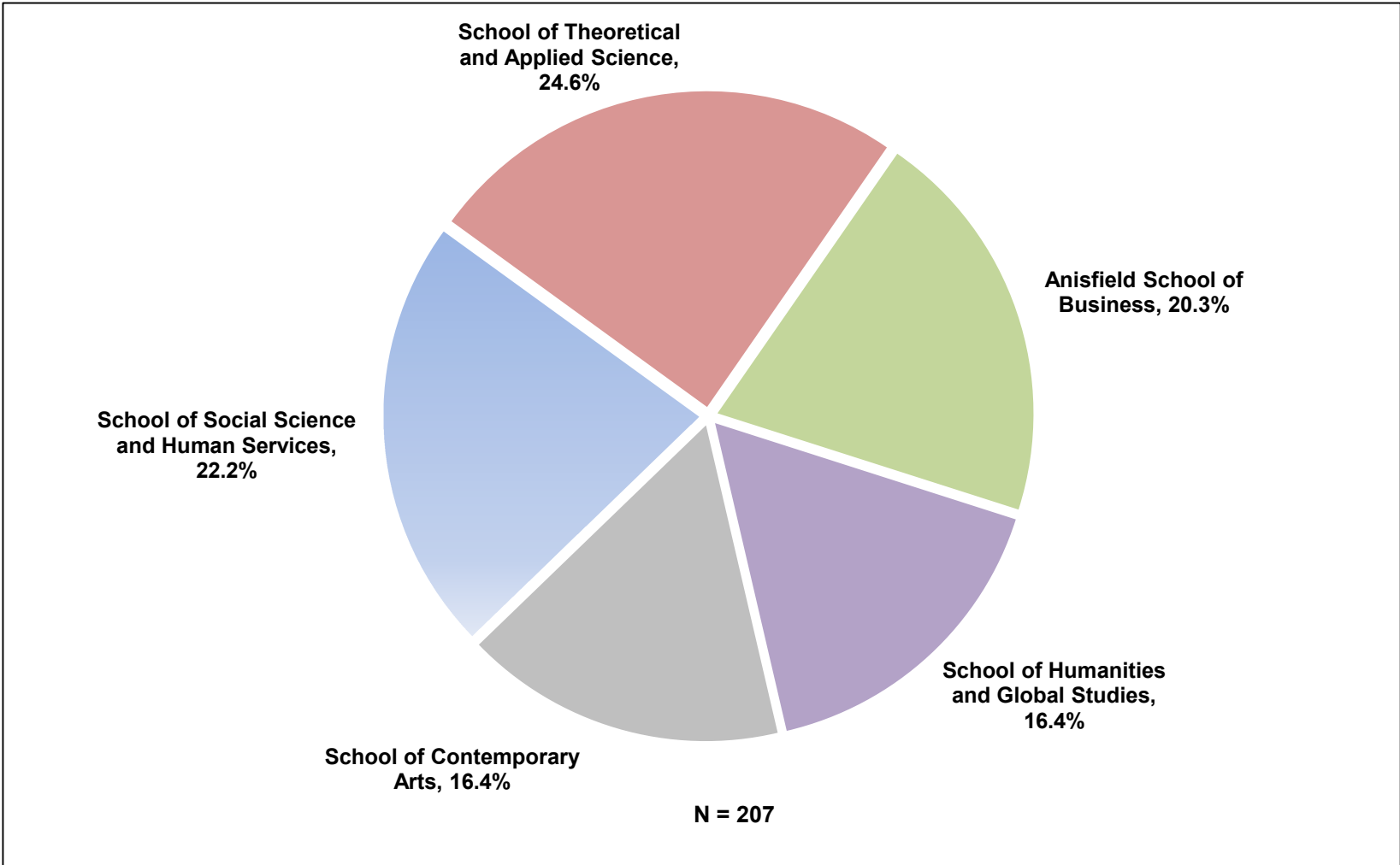

FALL 2021

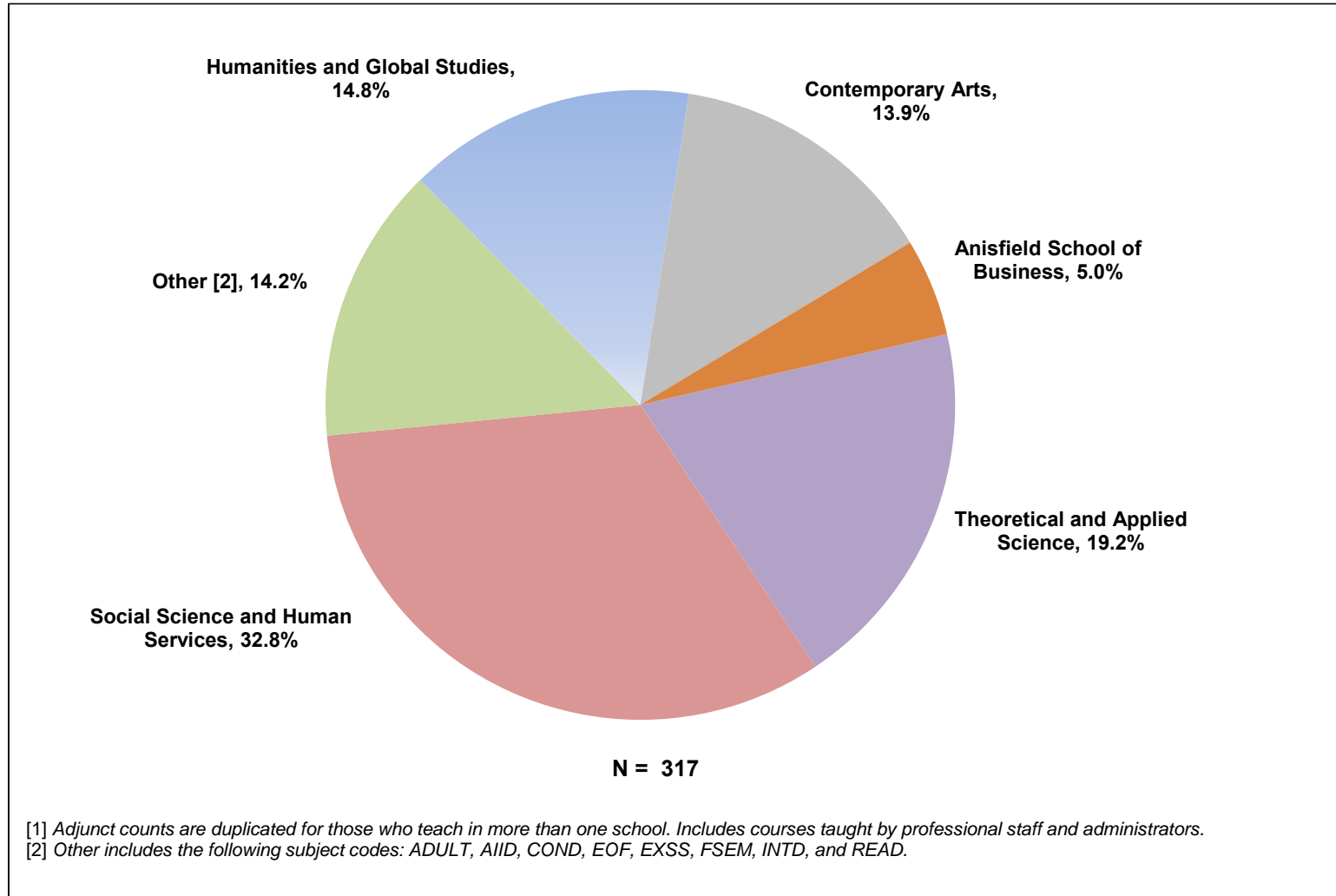
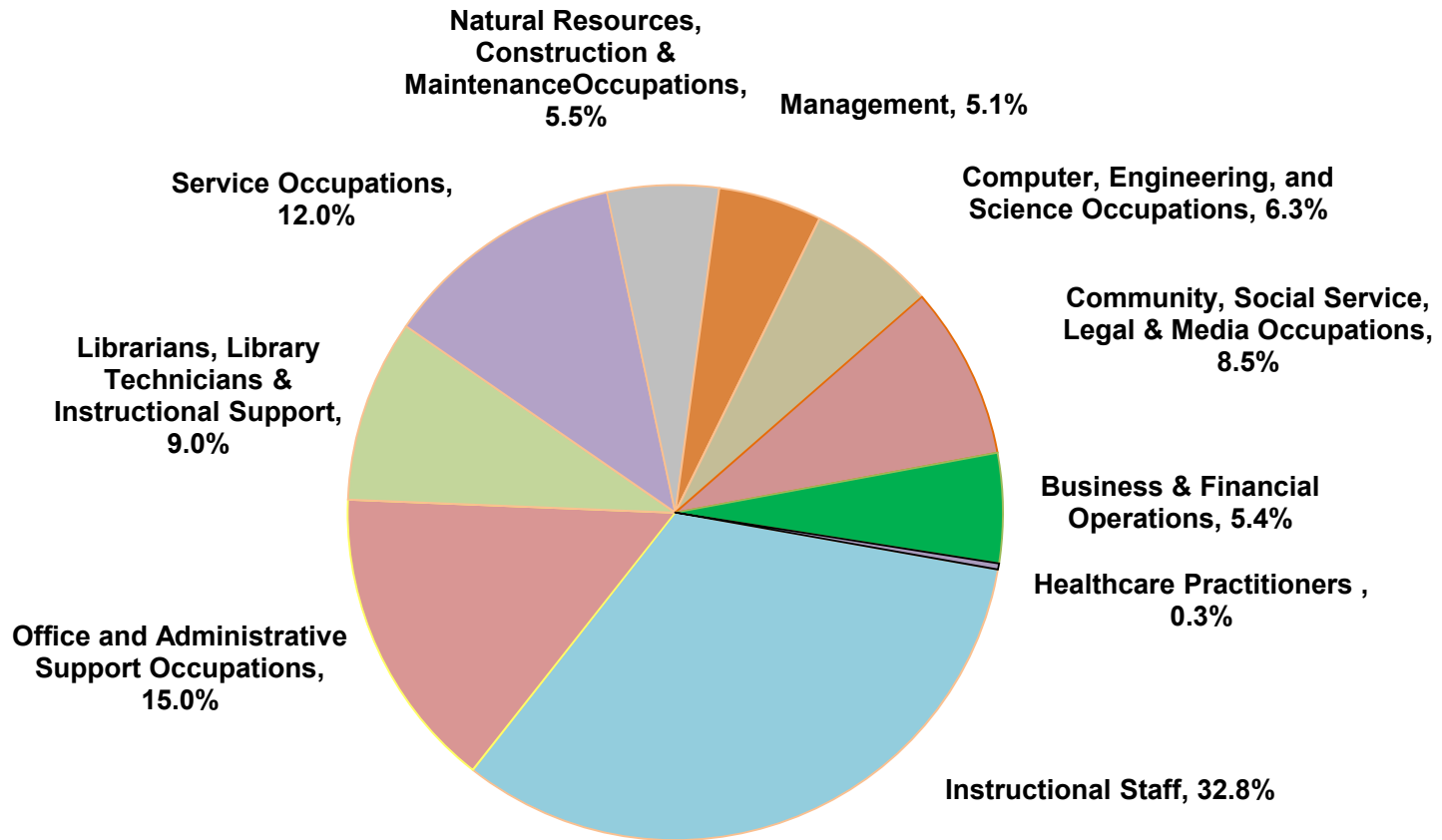

HIGHEST DEGREE ATTAINED BY FULL-TIME FACULTY, FALL 2021

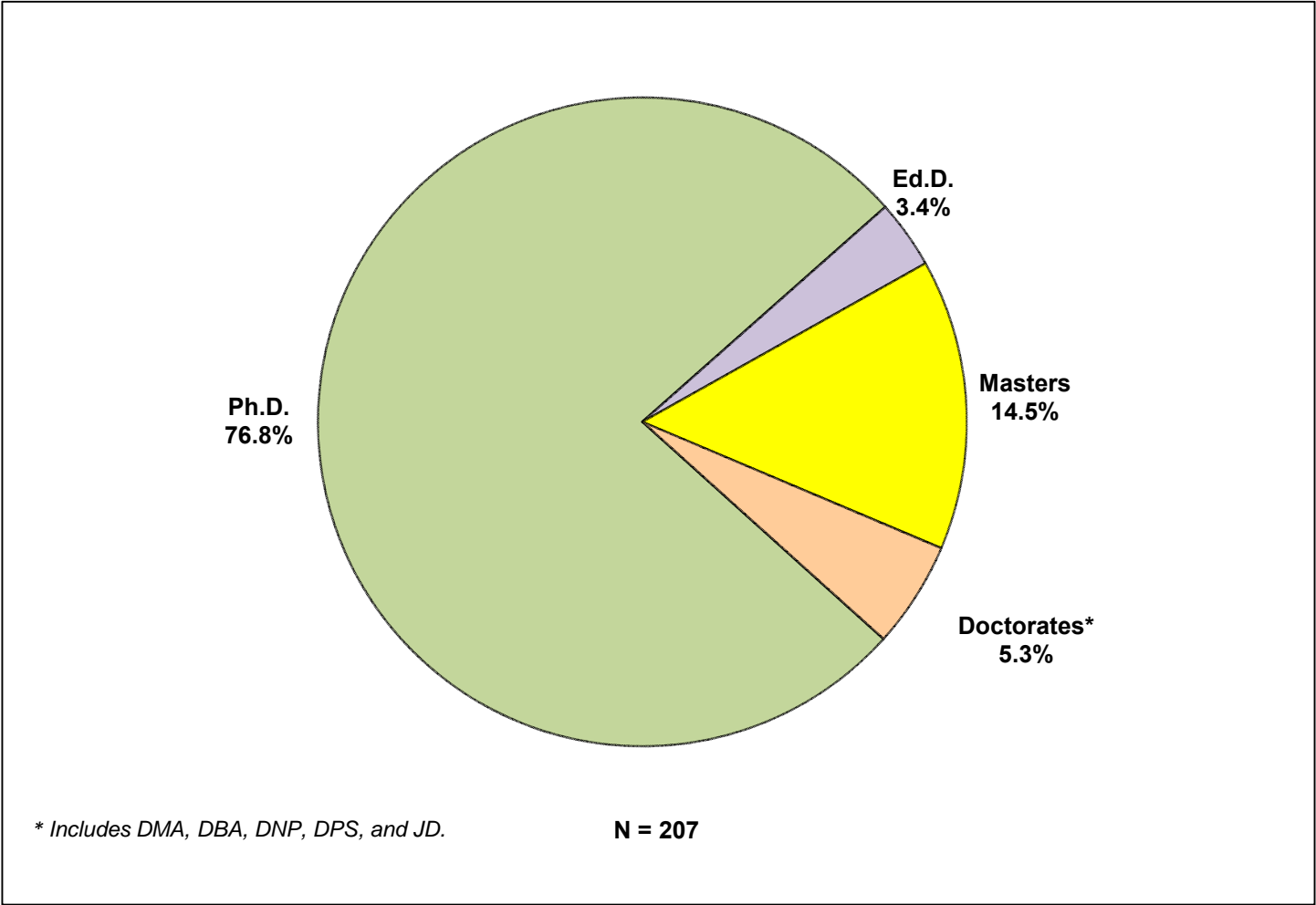

FALL 2021

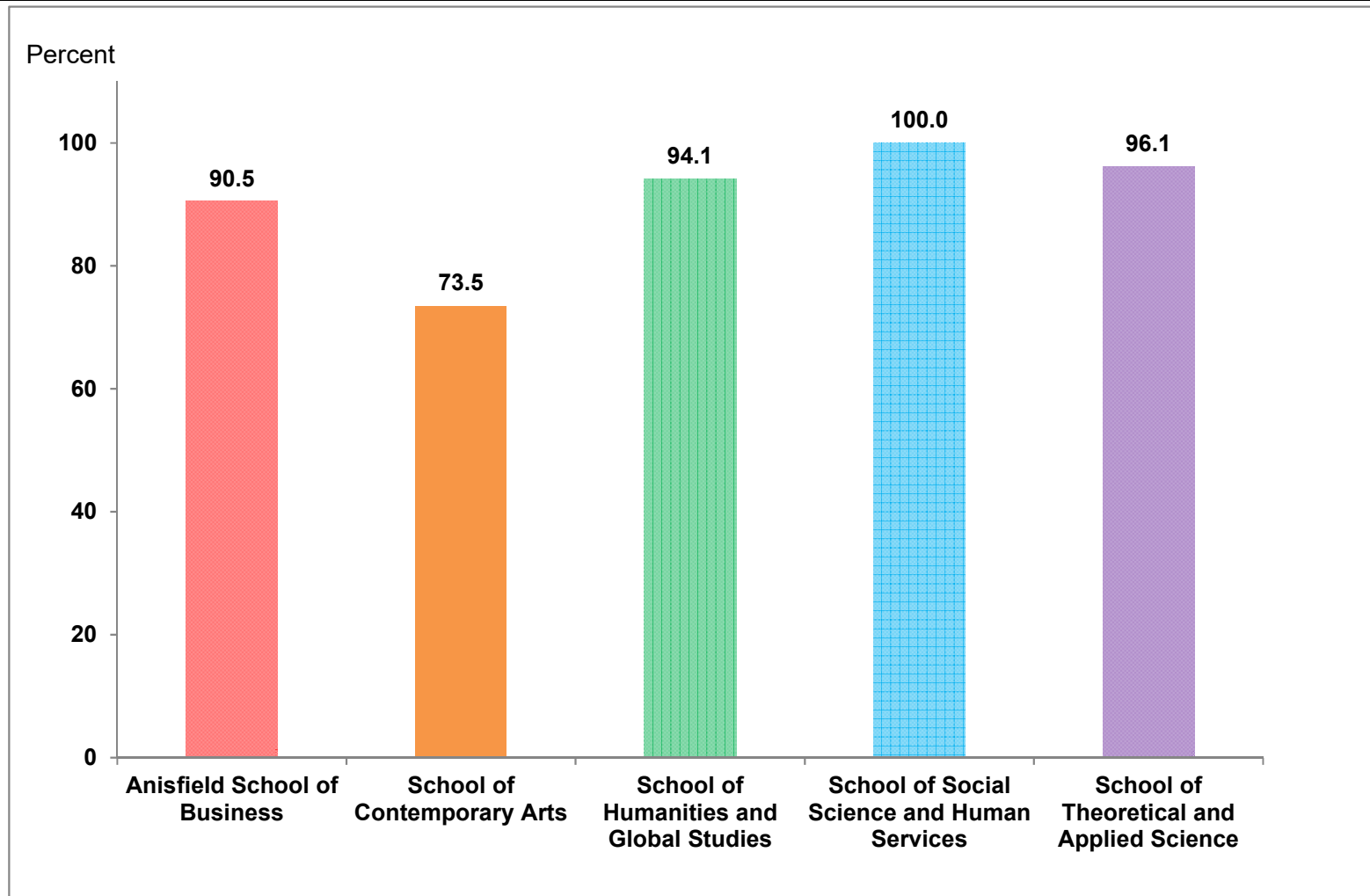

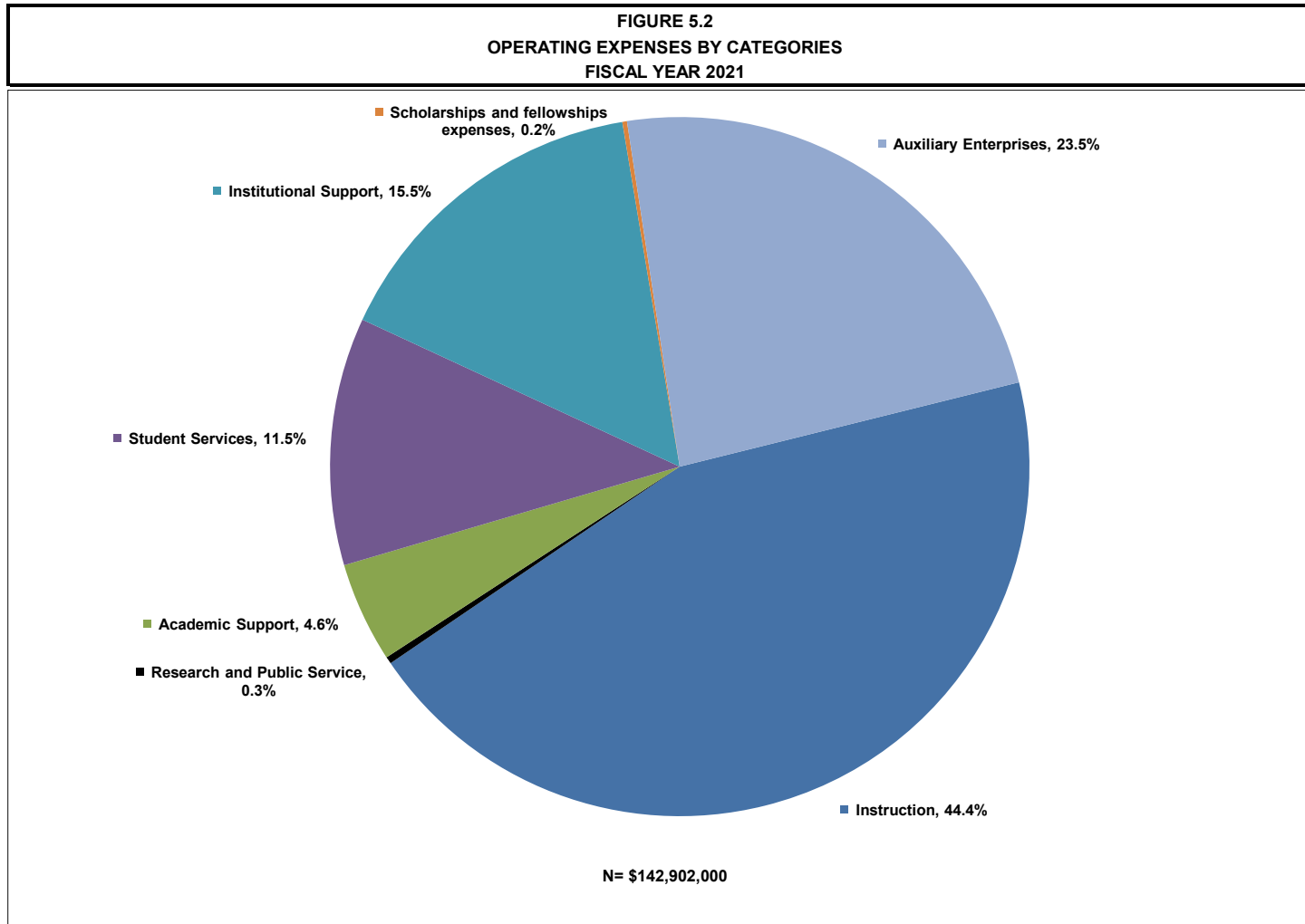
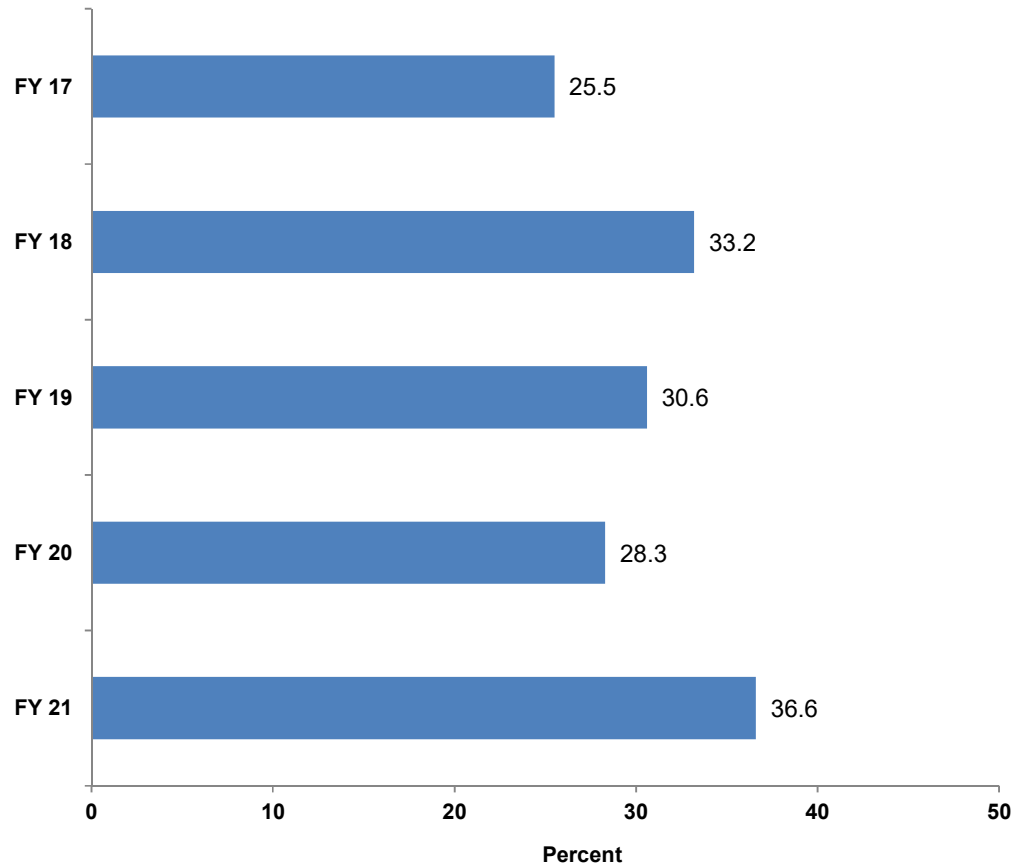

SQUARE FOOTAGE BY BUILDINGS, FALL 2021

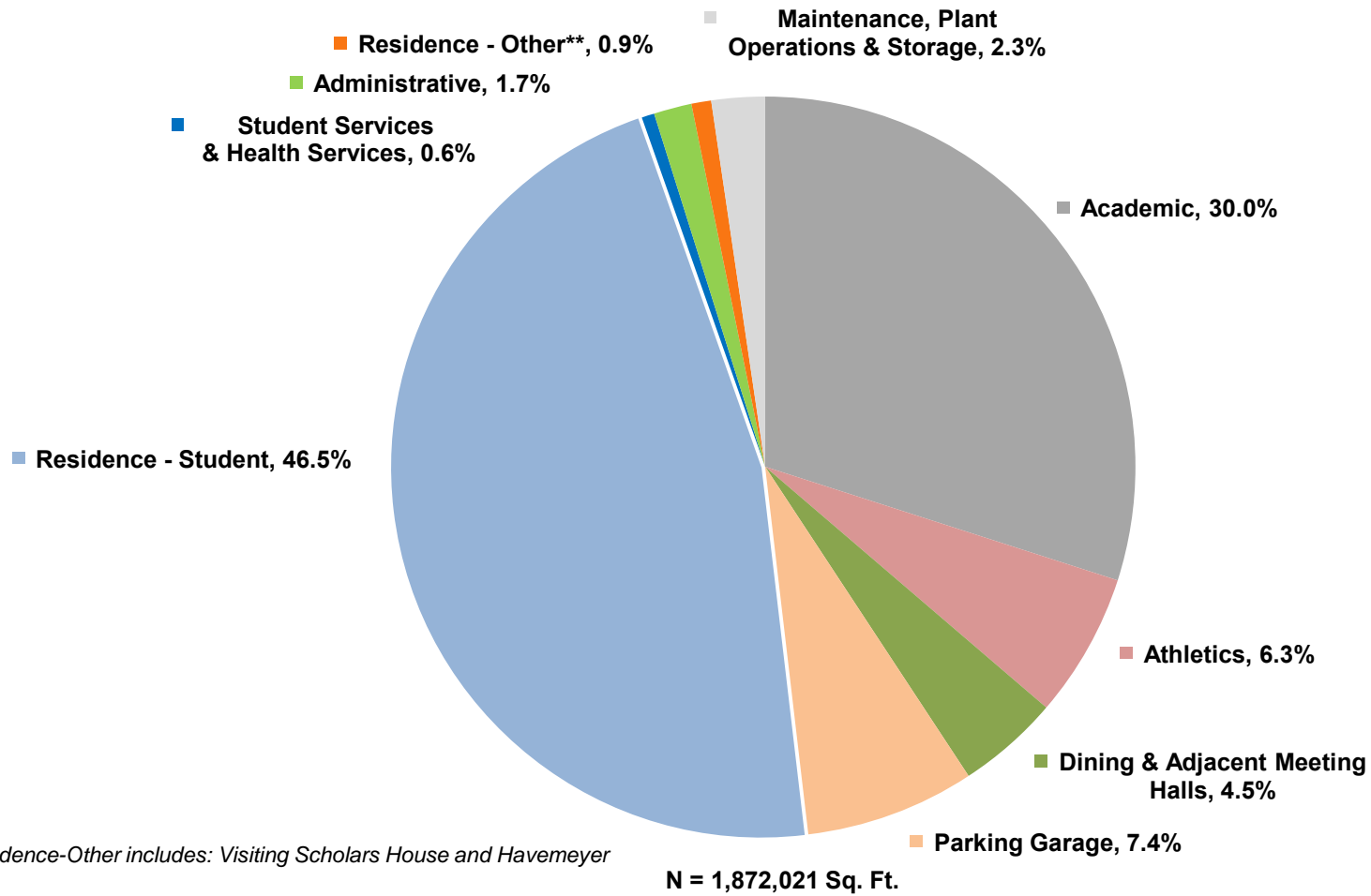

Completed During 2021

- 1 Campus-wide Fire Alarm Monitoring and Network Upgrade from a dedicated copper/fiber network to an Internet Protocol (IP) based system.

Under Construction In 2022

- 1 **Construction of Learning Commons:** Library Rehabilitation and Learning Commons Addition. Construction began in August 2019. The project was substantially completed in September 2021 and is being closed out.
- 2 **Campus-Wide Residence Hall Lock Replacement:** Project was successfully performed over summer 2021 and was completed on time for fall move-in to occur. Over 2,000 lock mechanisms were replaced under this project.
- 3 **Refurbishments in The Lodge, C-Wing, ASB and CPA Ambulance Building:** Renovation work and moving was substantially completed over summer 2021 with minor remaining work completed in fall 2021.
- 4 **ASB Emergency Generator Replacement:** The existing ice storage tanks were drained in December 2021. Existing generator decommissioning, demolition and removal work to be bid in spring 2022 with new natural gas generator to be delivered and installed over summer 2022.
- 5 **Recovery Housing/Renovation of White House:** Design was been resumed after being delayed due to Covid-19 issues. Project scope is being finalized with work to be completed by June 30, 2022.
- 6 **Athletic Field Sports Lighting:** The project was delayed due to Covid-19, but has restarted with an expanded scope which will be completed over summer 2022.
- 7 **Multicultural Center:** The Multicultural Committee and Capital Planning are finalizing wall colors, furniture selections and carpeting. Estimated completion and occupancy is for the fall 2022 Semester.
- 8 **ASB Data Science Classroom:** Computer tables, computers, chairs and Audio Visual equipment are currently being sourced and selected. Room is scheduled to be complete for fall 2022 classes.
- 9 **Core 4 Academic Building Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) Replacement:** Work onsite began in September 2021 and the new UPS unit was activated in January 2022.

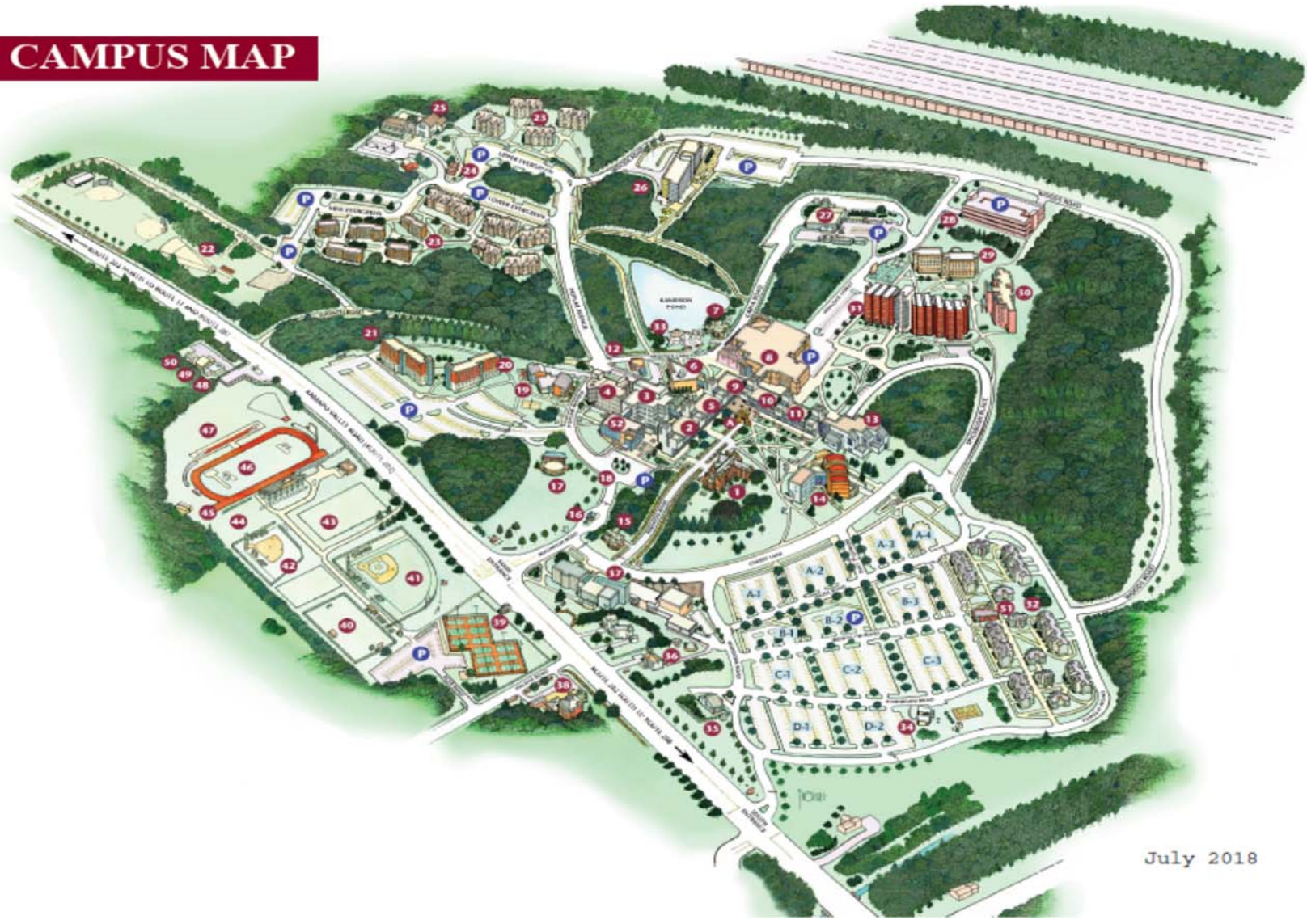

FROM WESTCHESTER AND ROCKLAND COUNTIES

Follow Route 287 West over the Mario M. Cuomo Bridge (a.k.a. the Tappan Zee Bridge) to Route 17 South. Follow directions above for "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM THE EAST

Follow Route 80 or Route 4 to Route 17 North. Follow Route 17 North. Follow directions below for "From the South, Using Route 17."
