





NEW UNDERGRADUATE ADMITS BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2022



NEW UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2022





FIGURE 1.7 NEW UNDERGRADUATES BY ADMISSION CATEGORY, FALL 2022













NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2022



NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2022








ALL UNDEGRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2022



ALL ENROLLED UNDERGRADUATES BY COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2022



ALL GRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2022








BY PROGRAM, FISCAL YEAR 2021-22







INTO THE SECOND SEMESTER BY ADMISSION TYPE, FALL 2018 - FALL 2022



INTO THE SECOND YEAR BY ADMISSION TYPE, FALL 2017 - FALL 2021 COHORTS





FIGURE 3.10 RAMAPO ALUMNI IN USA - FALL 2022







FALL 2022



FIGURE 4.4 COURSES^[1] TAUGHT BY ADJUNCT FACULTY BY SCHOOL FALL 2022



FIGURE 4.5 EMPLOYMENT CATEGORIES* FOR FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES FALL 2022



FIGURE 4.6a FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES BY RACE/ETHNICITY FALL 2022




FIGURE 4.6b ALL ENROLLED STUDENTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY FALL 2022








FIGURE 5.3 STATE APPROPRIATIONS AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL REVENUES FISCAL YEAR 2022





STATUS PROJECT

Completed During 2022

- 1 Construction of Learning Commons: Library Rehabilitation and Learning Commons Addition. Construction began in August 2019. The project was completed in 2022 and is fully occupied and in use.
- Campus-Wide Residence Hall Lock Replacement: Project was successfully performed over summer 2021 and was completed on time for fall move-in to occur. Over 2,000 lock mechanisms were replaced under this project.
- Refurbishments in The Lodge, C-Wing, ASB and CPA Ambulance Building: Renovation work and moving was substantially completed over summer 2021 with minor remaining work completed in fall 2021.
- 4 **Multicultural Center:** The Multicultural Center was completed in winter 2022. The Center provides an inclusive and welcoming space to host programs and workshops designed to help foster constructive intercultural dialogue.
- 5 ASB Data Science Classroom: The Center for Data, Mathematical, and Computational Sciences opened for fall 2022 classes.
- 6 Core 4 Academic Building Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) Replacement: Work onsite began in September 2021 and the new UPS unit was activated in January 2022.

Under Construction (or Completed) In 2023

- ASB Emergency Generator Replacement: The existing ice storage tanks were drained in December 2021. Existing generator decommissioning, demolition and removal work went to be bid in spring 2022. A new natural gas generator will be delivered and installed over summer 2023.
- Recovery Housing/Renovation of Redwood Building: The project had been delayed due to Covid-19 issues, and was completed in winter 2022. Ramapo Recovery Housing offers students the opportunity to have a fulfilling residential experience living within a supportive community with other students in recovery.
- 3 Athletic Field Sports Lighting: The project was delayed due to Covid-19, but has restarted with an expanded scope. Project is under construction and will be completed in spring 2023.
- 4 Investigative Genetic Genealogy Lab: A new classroom/laboratory space in the Learning Commons is in design and will be completed in summer 2023.
- 5 Elevator Replacements in Mackin & Pine Hall: Full elevator replacements to take place in summer 2023 with completion for fall 2023 semester.
- 6 Roof Replacements: Complete roof replacements will be performed on Mackin and Bischoff Halls over summer 2023
