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Introduction & Acknowledgments

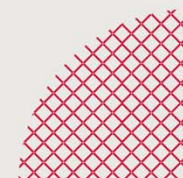

The Fact Book is an important document for the institution as it provides a comprehensive picture of the institution, including information regarding its growth and vitality. The Fact Book is an evolving document, and we have made efforts to include information that is pertinent, succinct, and beneficial to the users of the document, including adding the executive summaries to each chapter. Most importantly, the Fact Book provides trend data for demographics of our students and employees, enrollment in programs, and student outcomes. The longitudinal data is available from fall 2020 to Fall 2024 for the most part, but may vary by fiscal year, depending on data availability. We expect that the information in the current Fact Book will assist the college community in understanding the college's progress, support decision-making, and provide data to various external constituencies as needed.

Currently, Ramapo College offers over 44 bachelor's degrees in the arts, business, humanities, social sciences and the sciences, as well as in professional studies, which include Nursing, Business, and Social Work. In addition, Ramapo College offers courses leading to teacher certification at the elementary and secondary levels. As of spring 2024, the College offers 11 graduate programs and 1 doctoral program in Nursing Practice. Ramapo has articulation agreements with 8 institutions in the health professions in New York and New Jersey.

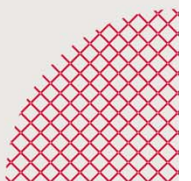

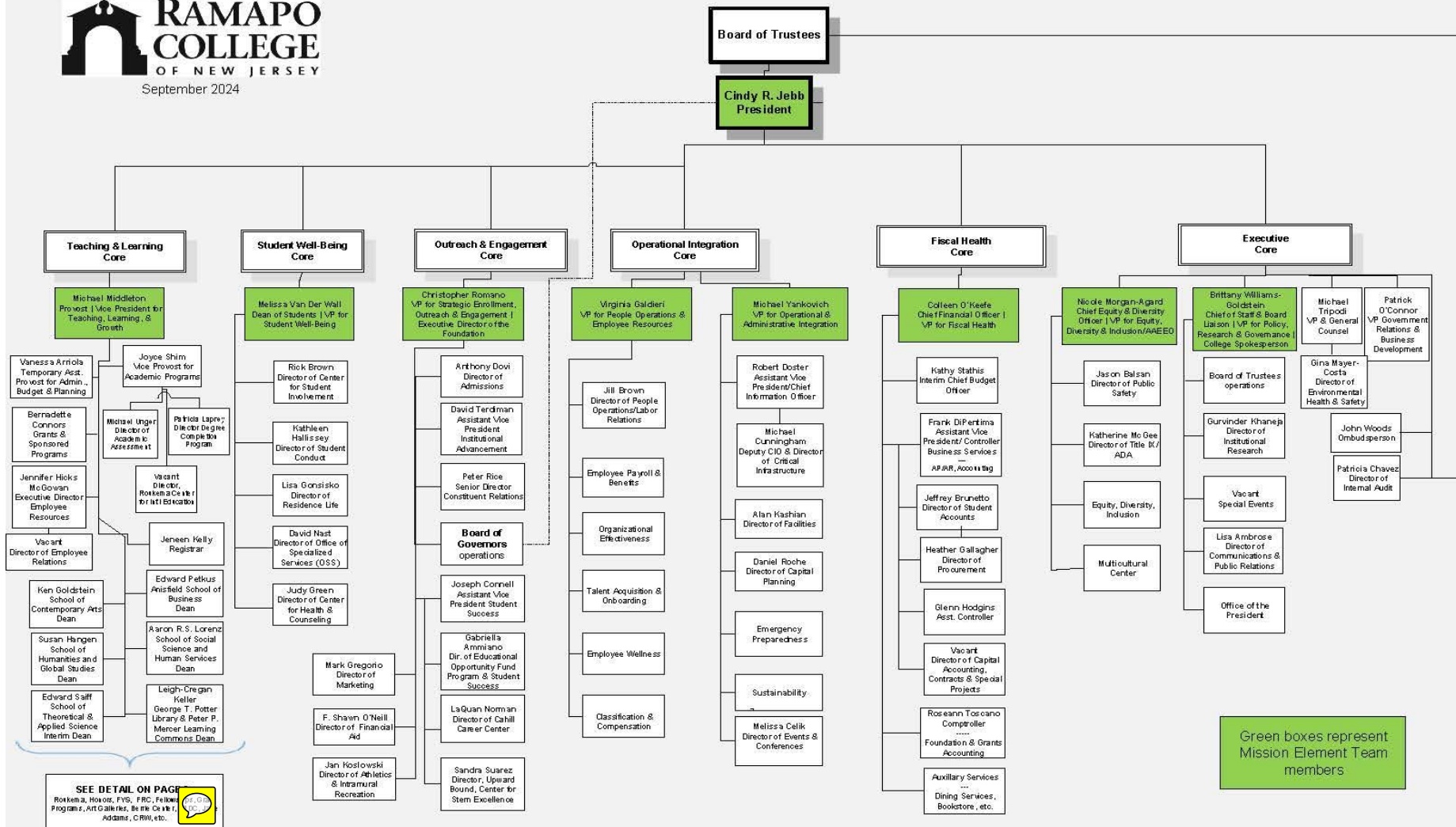

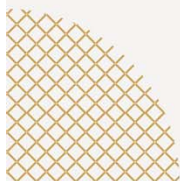

Chapter 1: New Students



Executive Summary

- Ramapo College welcomed its largest cohort of new first-time degree-seeking students in 2024, with a total of 1,126 students. (**Table 1.1, page 1**)
- The percentage of first-time, first-generation students who accepted Pell Grants increased from 54.4% in 2020 to 62.2% in 2024. (**Table 1.4.3, page 14**)
- Bergen County accounted for **46.4%** (n = 178) of the incoming transfer students; additionally, there was a **34.1%** increase in transfers from Bergen County Community College between 2023 and 2024. (**Table 1.9, p. 25; Table 1.13, p. 48**)
- There was a **37.9%** increase in first-time graduate degree-seeking students aged 18 to 24 from 2023 to 2024. (**Table 1.15.1, page 51**)
- The percentage of minority students among first-time graduate degree-seeking students rose from **28.8%** in 2023 to **37.3%** in 2024, (**Table 1.15.2, page 52**)

Important Highlights:

- RCNJ's popularity as a first-choice school rebounded strongly by Fall 2024 after a dip in 2021. **(Figure 1.6, page 7)**
- From 2020 to 2024, RCNJ saw 13% growth in new students, nearly 140% growth in second B.A. students, and declines in Transfer Students (-7.5%) and Re-Admits (-26.2%). **(Table 1.2, p 8)**
- SAT submissions were high in 2020 (~90%) but dropped sharply after a test-optional policy launched in Fall 2021. High school rank submissions also dropped to near-zero in 2021 and 2024, with moderate reporting in 2022–2023 (~35–39%). **(Table 1.3, page 10)**
- The RCNJ student body is majority female, with a growing gap. Age distribution across students remains stable and youthful, dominated by the 18–24 range. Overall, enrollment has seen a healthy increase of nearly 13% over five years. **(Table 1.4.1, page 11)**
- Hispanic enrollment is the fastest growing group among RCNJ's first time degree seeking students, with a 50% increase since 2020. **(Table 1.4.2, page 12)**
- The number of first-generation RCNJ students is steadily rising, with a notable increase in Pell Grant recipients. In addition, female first generation representation remains strong and is increasing faster than male. **(Table 1.4.3, page 14)**
- Hispanic students, particularly those identifying as Hispanic and White, are the fastest-growing significant racial group among first-time, first-generation RCNJ students. **(Table 1.4.4, page 15)**
- Most RCNJ students still originate from New Jersey (93.7%), but the percentage of out-of-state and international students has grown steadily since 2020. While Bergen County remains the largest contributor in raw numbers, the largest relative increases are coming from underrepresented or historically small counties and out-of-state populations. **(Table 1.5, page 16)**
- ASB programs with significant growth in FT/FT enrollment include Finance, International Business, and Information Technology Management. While small increases among FT/FT students are seen in English & Literary Studies and Spanish, HGS enrollment is shrinking overall. In CA steady growth is observed among FT/FT students in Theater and Communication Arts. **(Table 1.6, page 18)**
- Overall enrollment by FT/FT students in SSHS has increased by 14.5% since 2020. Growth occurred in five of the nine SSHS programs for which there is five years of data. Overall enrollment by FT/FT students in TAS has increased by 20% with notable growth observed in Biology and Medical Imaging Sciences. **(Table 1.6, page 19)**
- Enrollment of first-time, degree-seeking students by school remained steady between 2020 and 2024. **(Figure 1.9.b, page 20)**
- RCNJ experienced a notable decline in transfer student interest between 2015–2021. Since 2021, there's been a steady recovery, with 2024 marking a 3-year high in transfer student applications, admissions, and enrollments. Yield among transfer students has remained relatively steady over the decade. **(Figure 1.10, page 22)**
- RCNJ transfer students aged 18–24 dominate, but older age groups are growing, particularly those 40 and older. **(Table 1.8.1, page 23)**
- Only the 18–24 age group saw growth in first-time graduate student enrollment. **(Table 1.15.1, p. 51)**

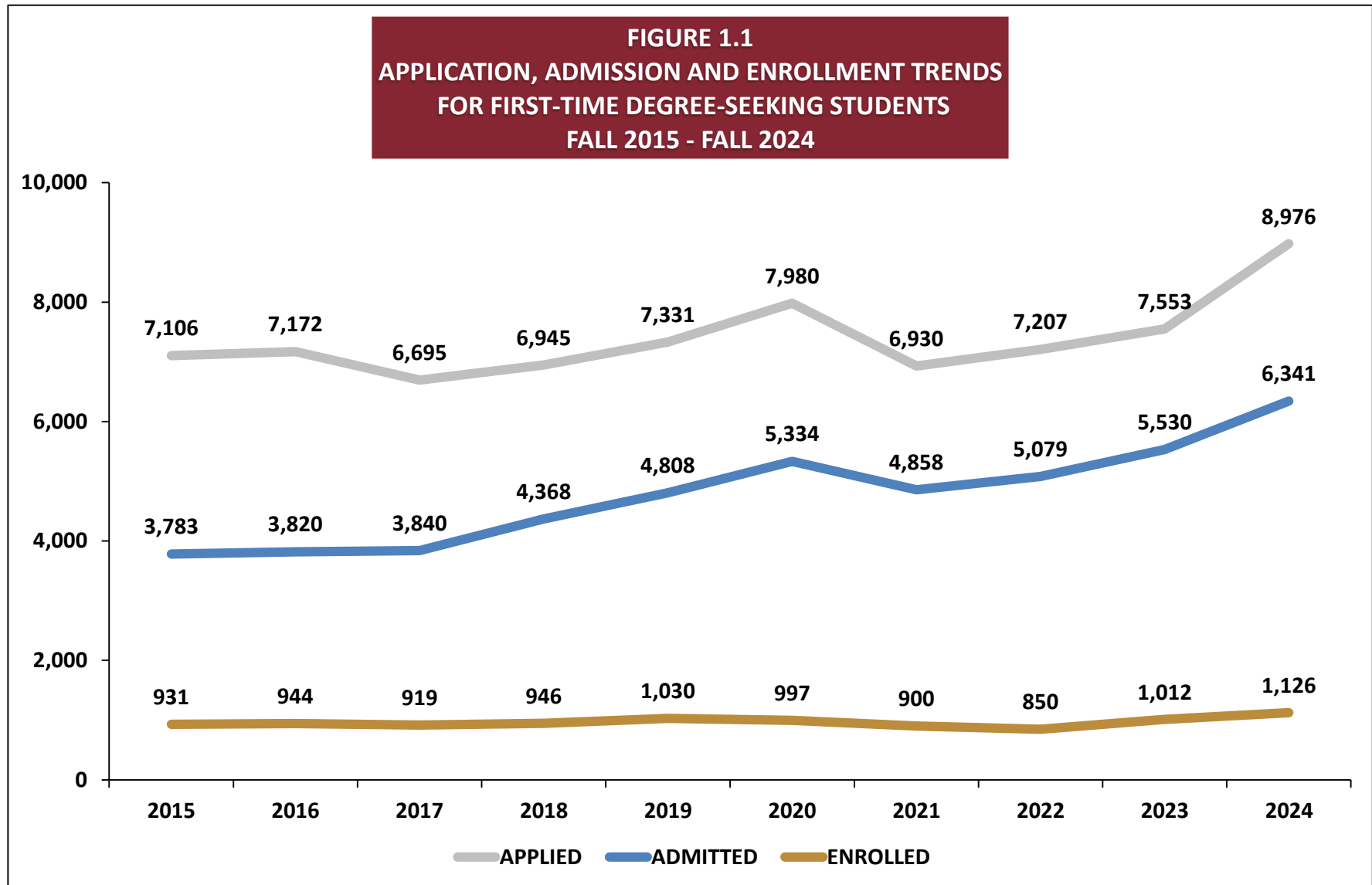

NEW UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANTS BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

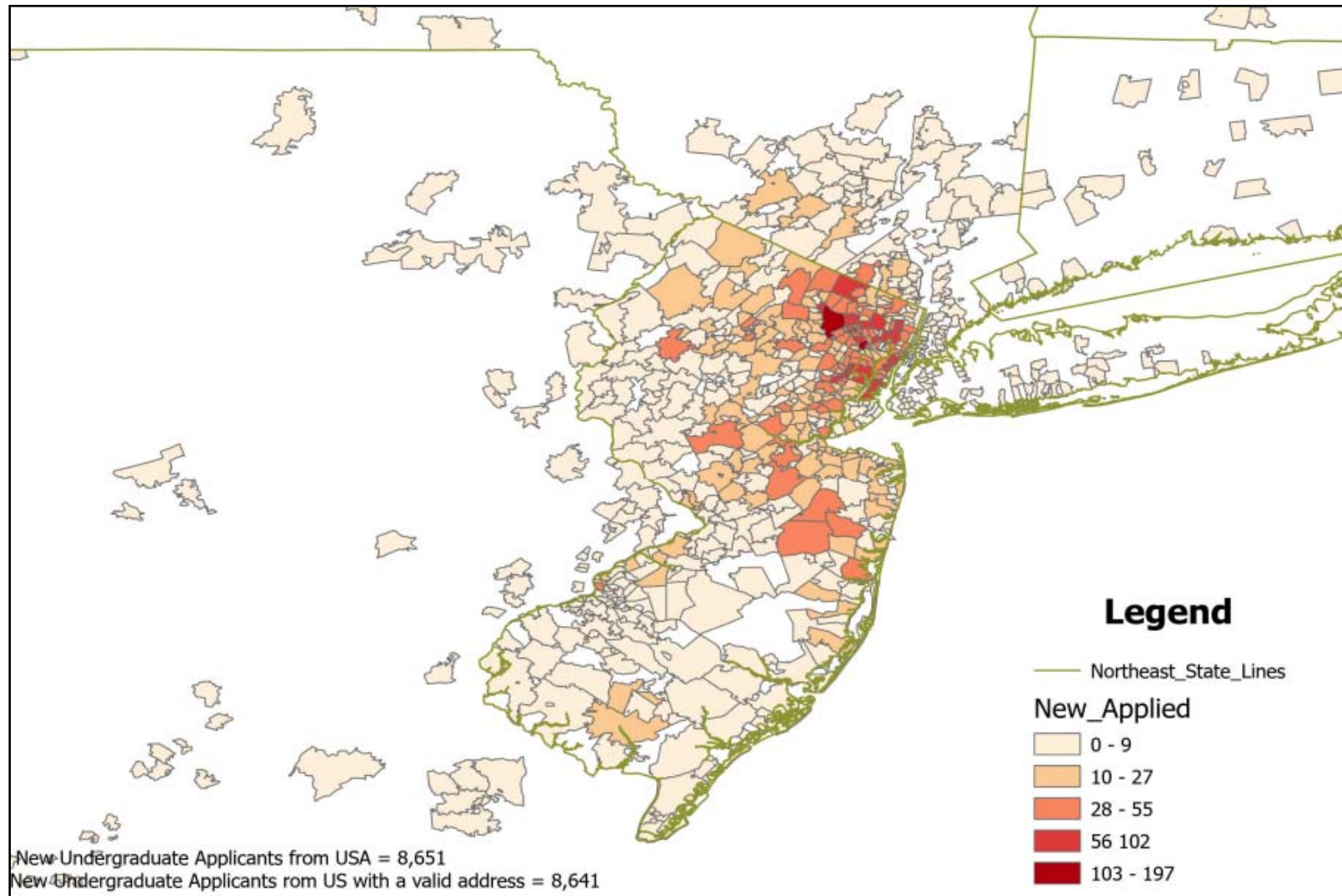

NEW UNDERGRADUATE ADMITTED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

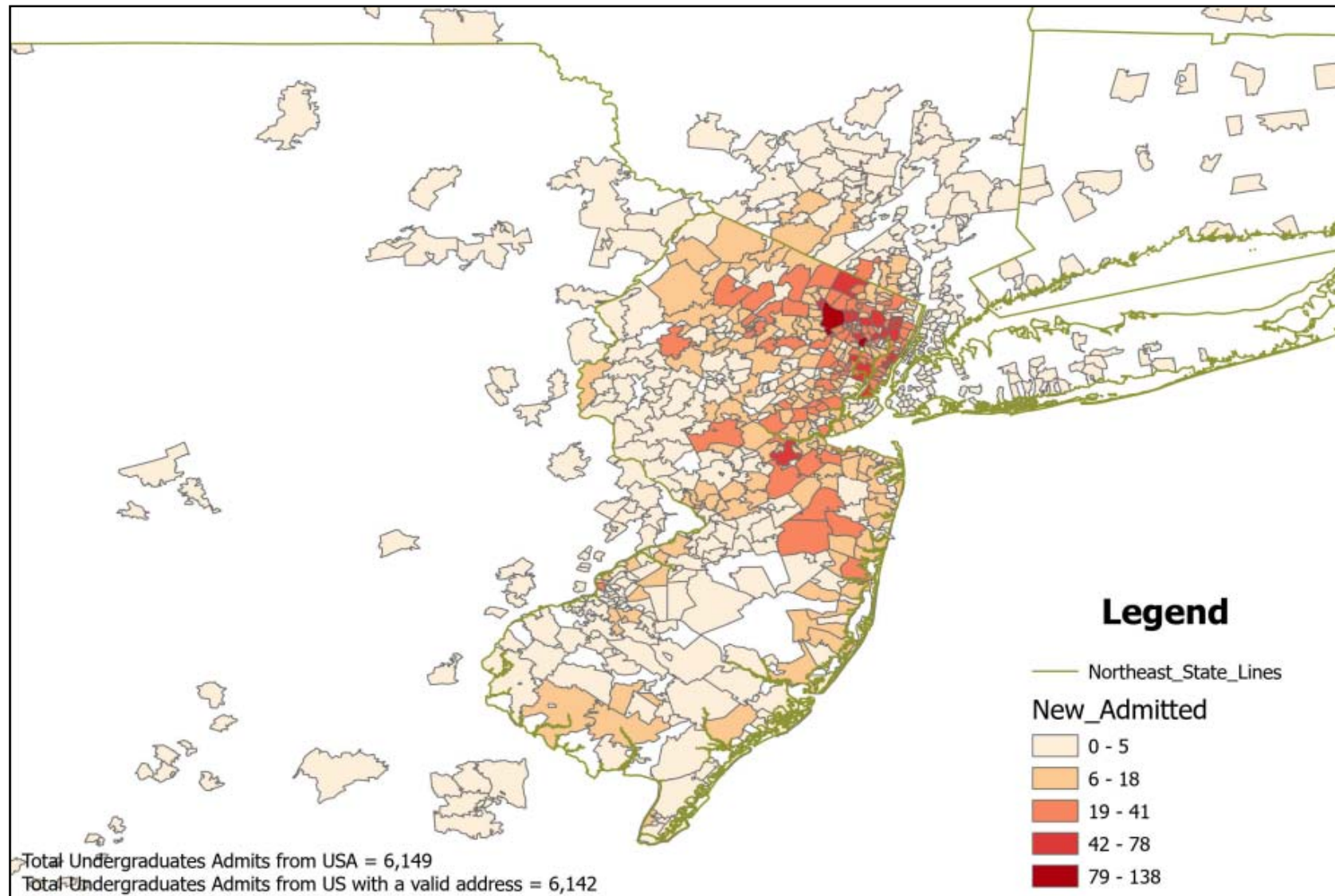

NEW UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

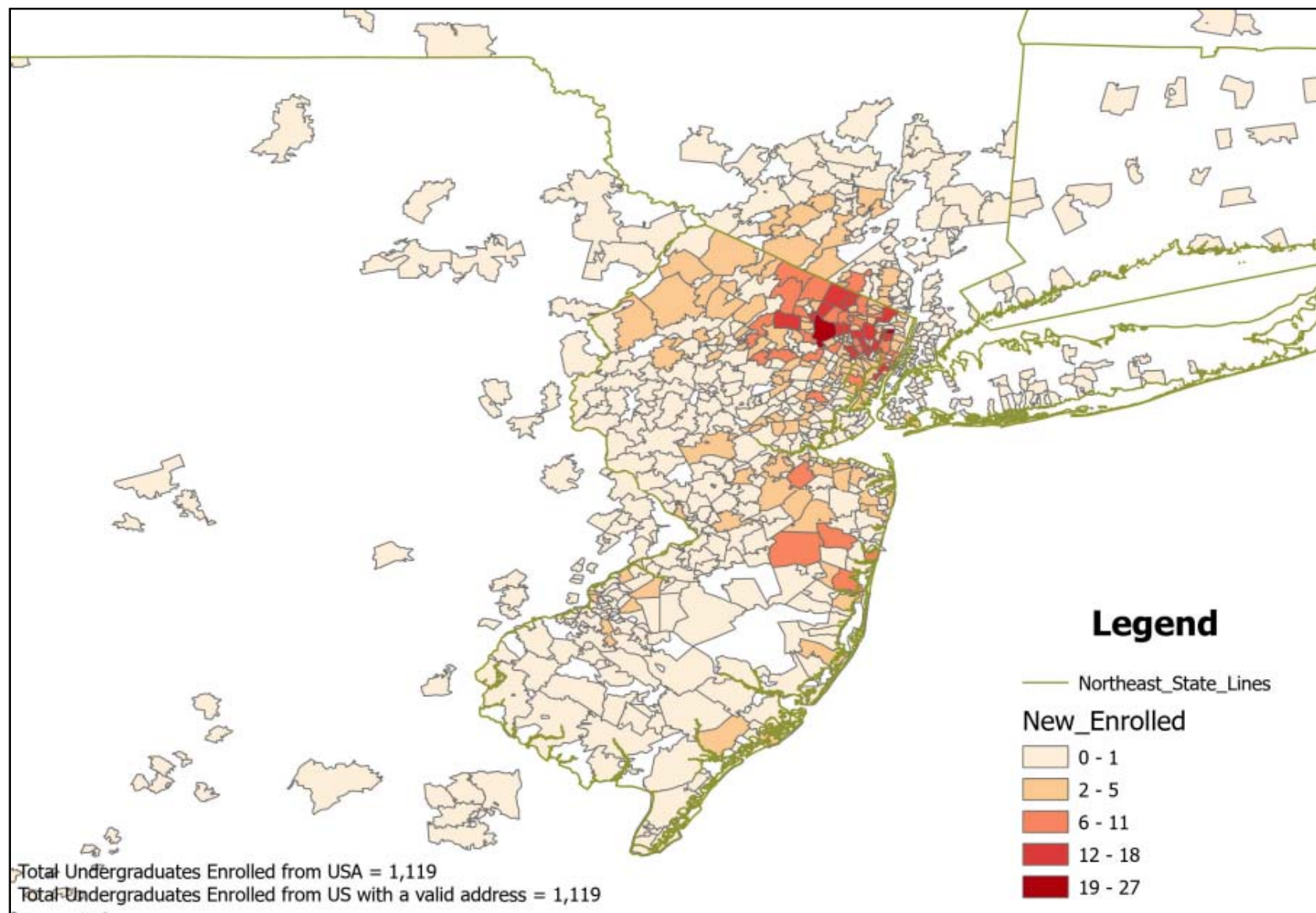
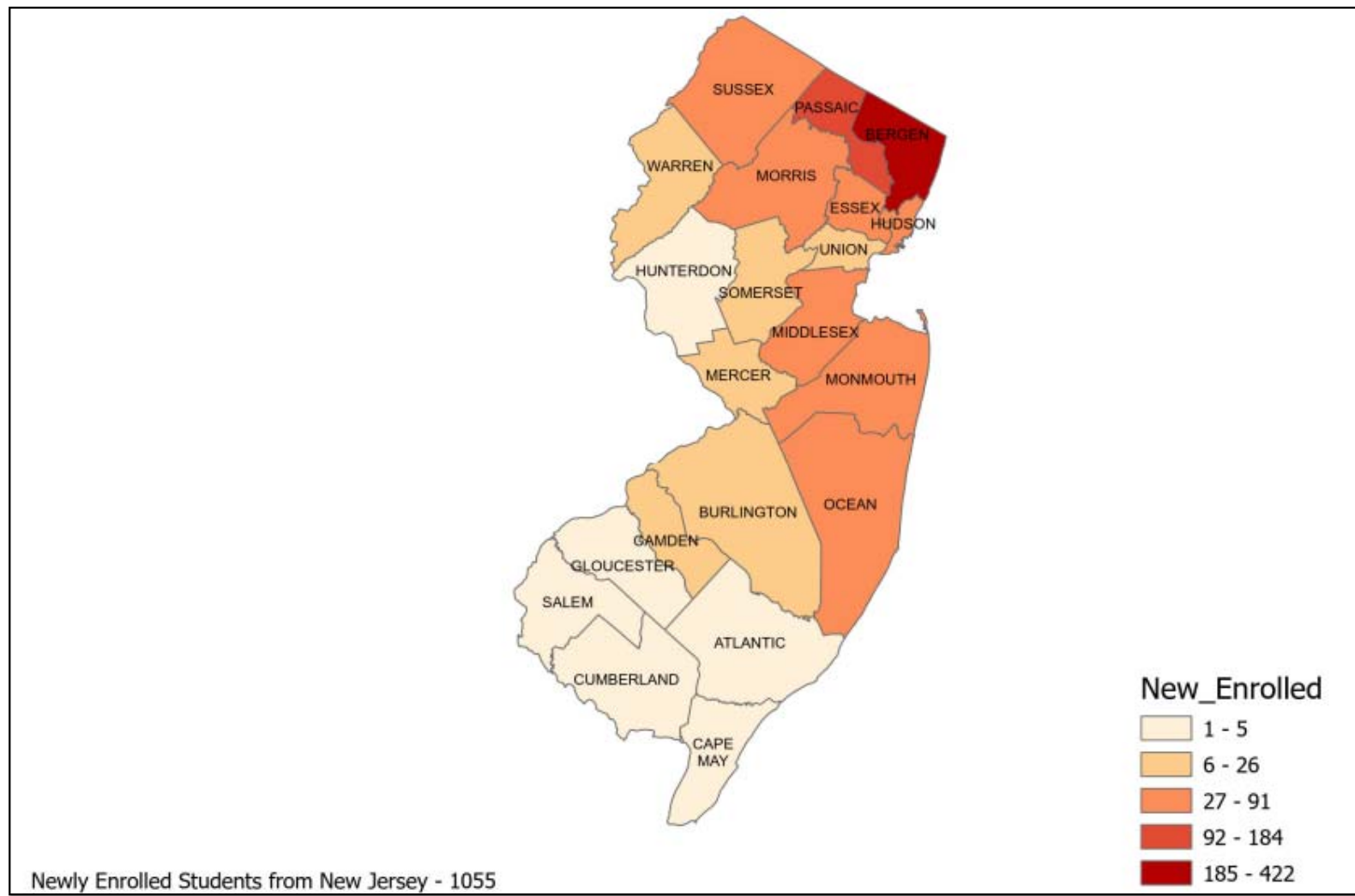
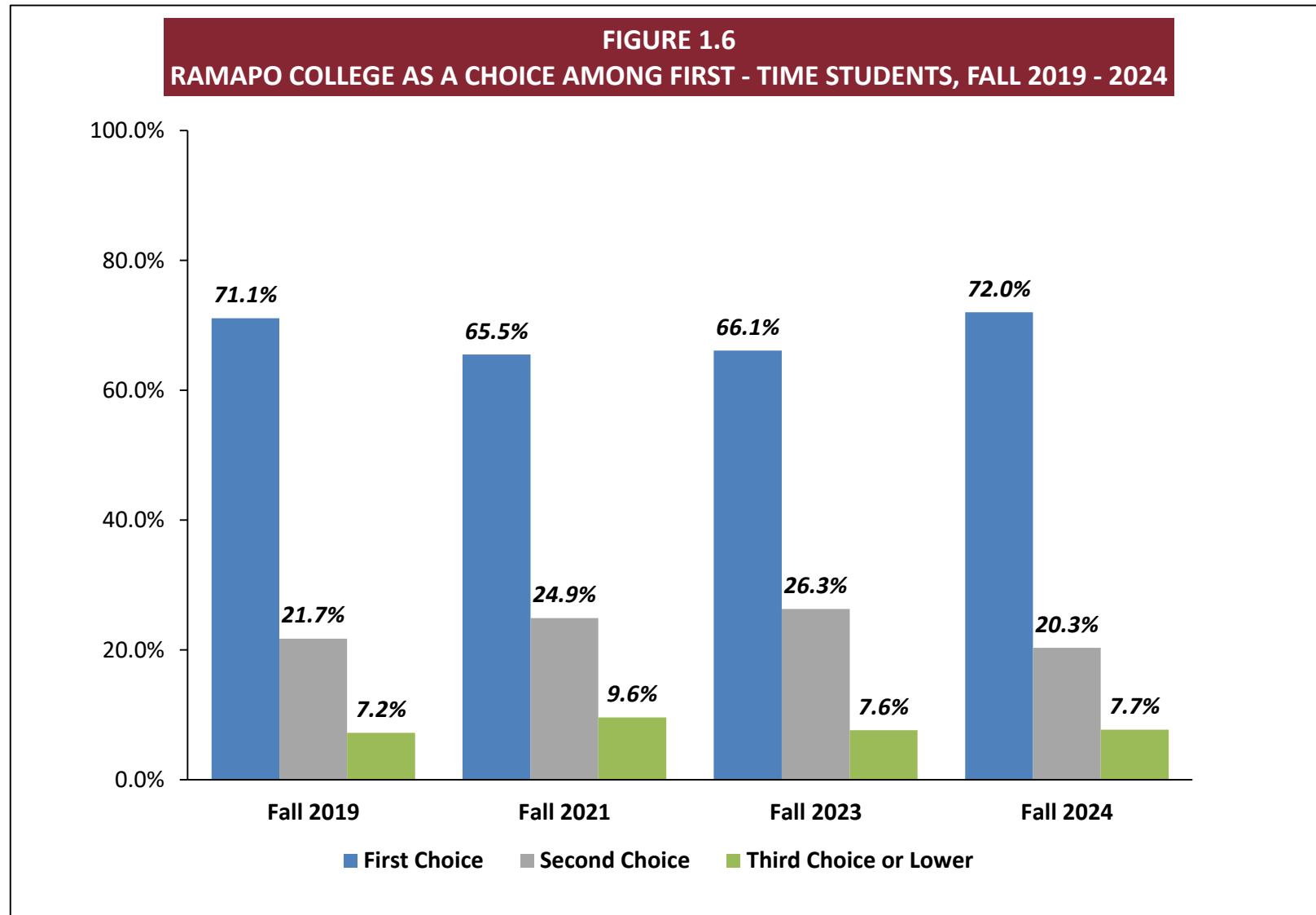

NEW UNDERGRADUATES BY ADMISSION CATEGORY, FALL 2024

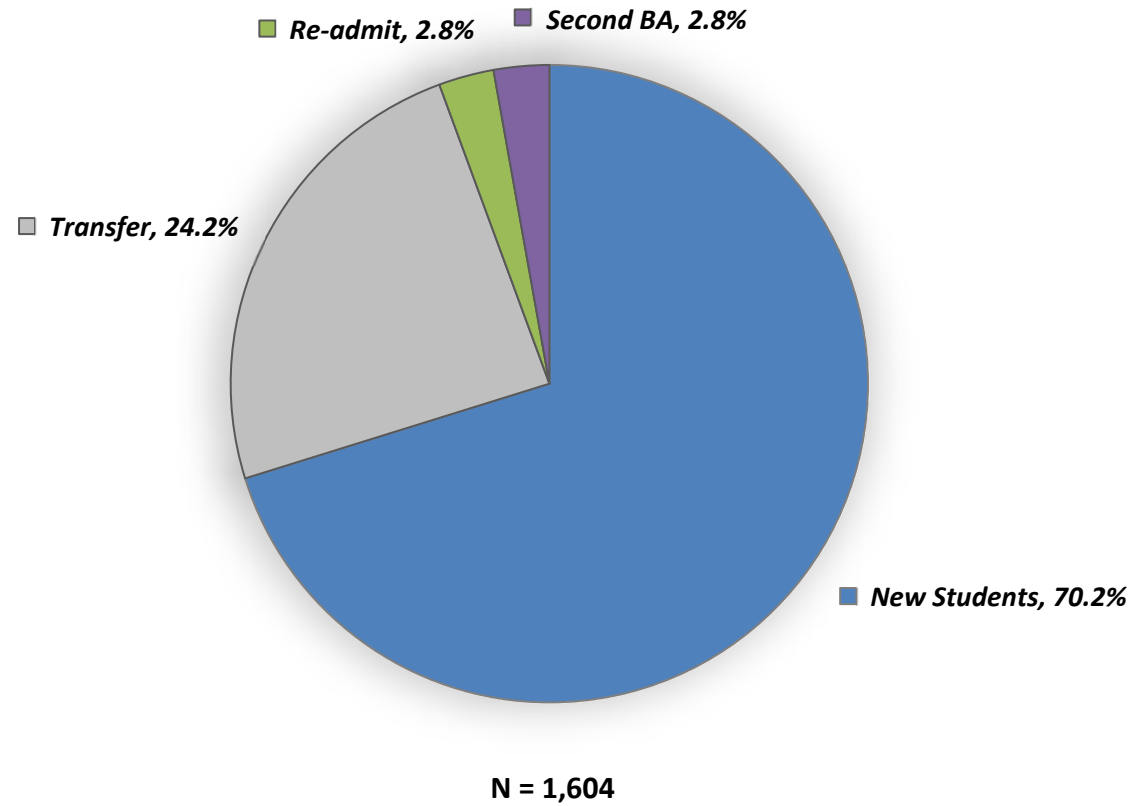

RACE/ETHNIC CATEGORIES BY SEX OF ALL FIRST-TIME DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS , FALL 2024

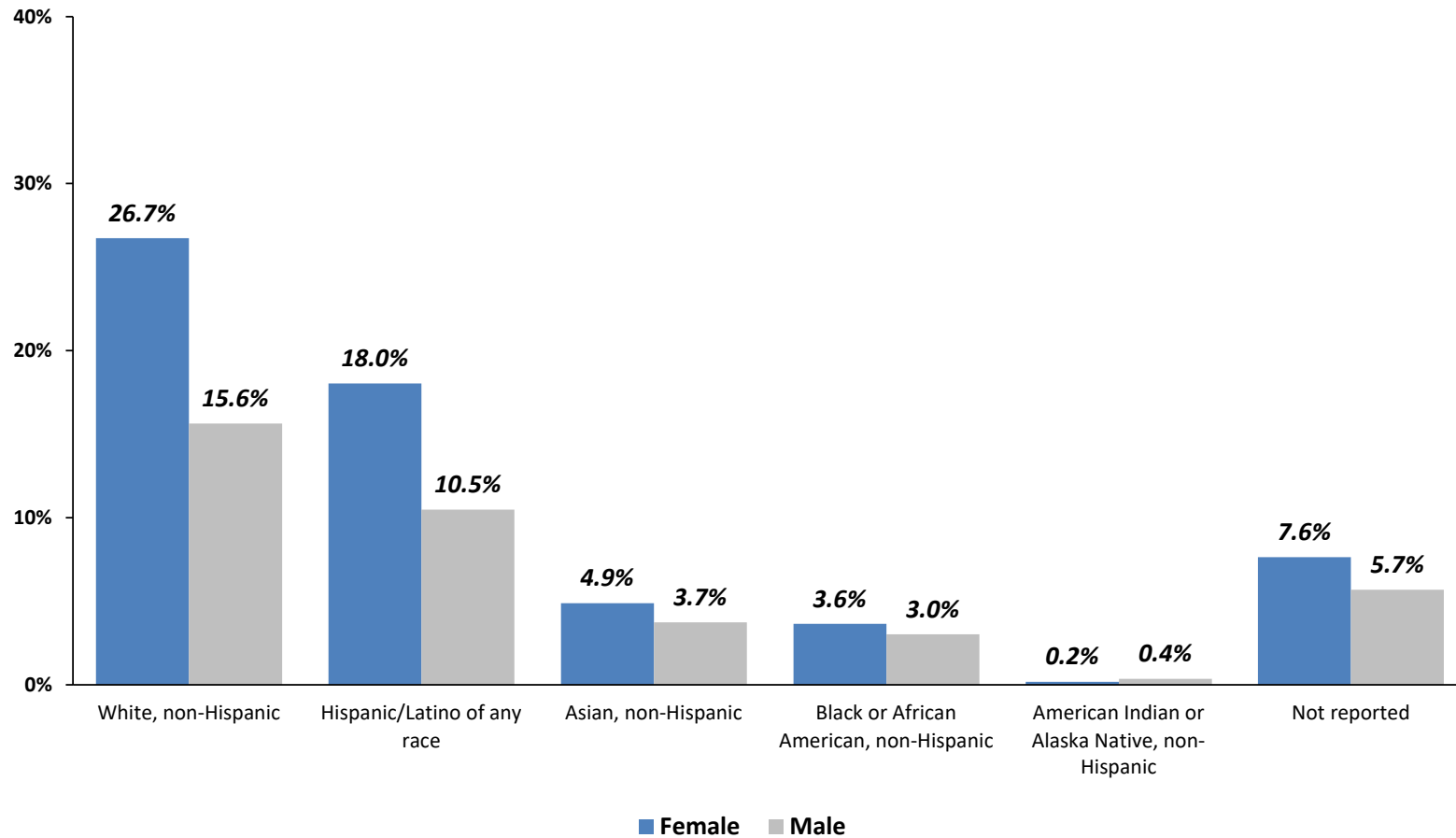

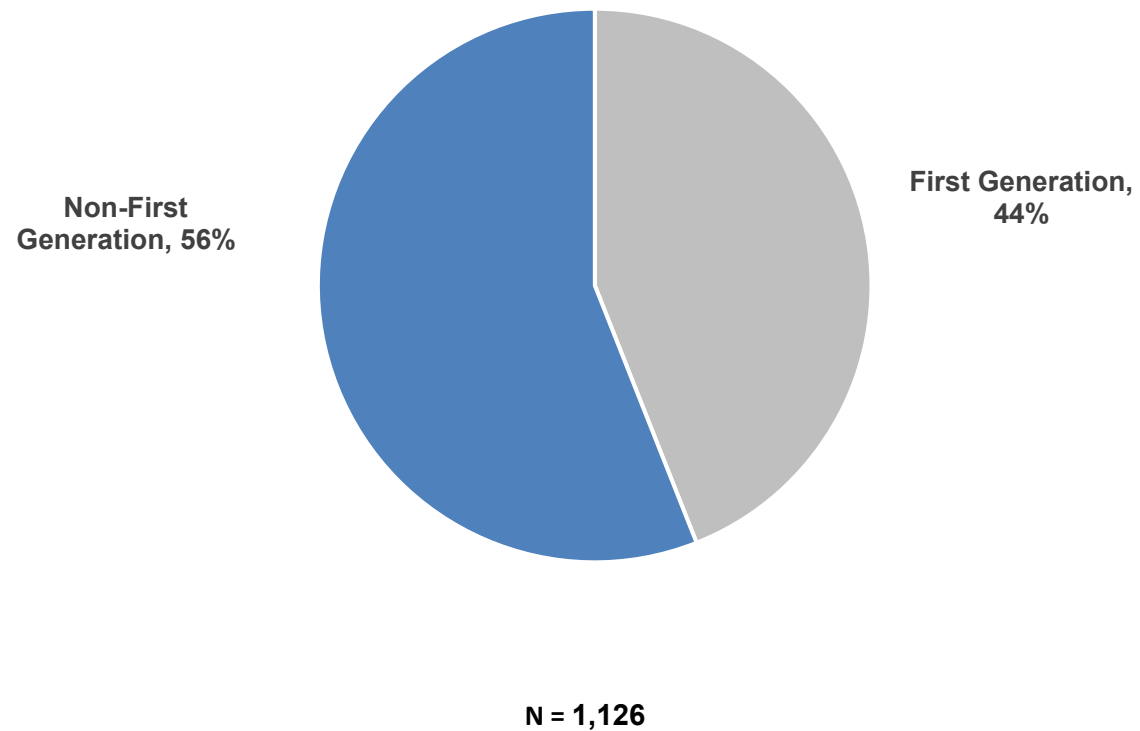

ENROLLMENT OF FIRST-TIME DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS BY SCHOOL, FALL 2024

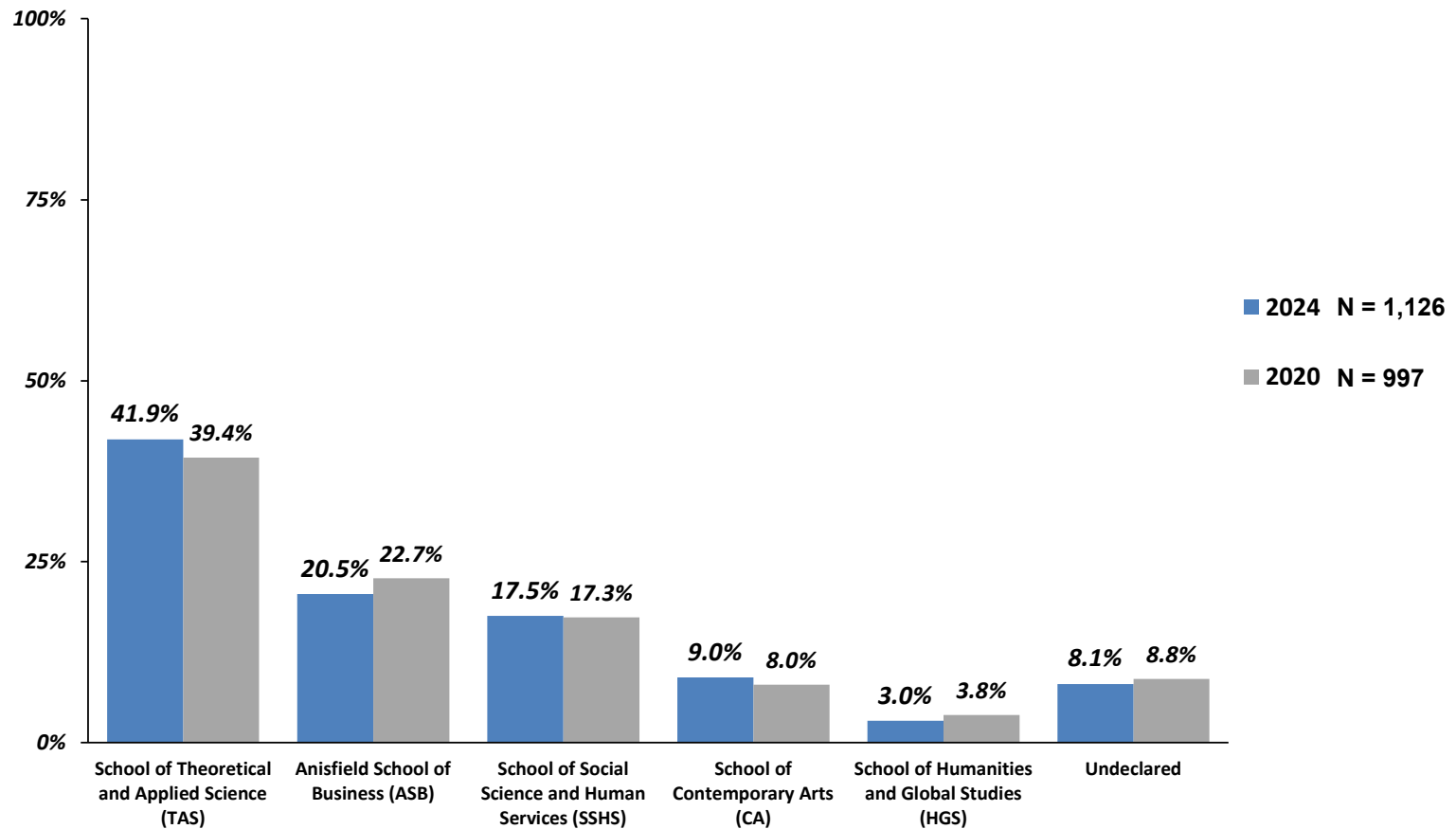

OF ENTERING TRANSFER STUDENTS, FALL 2015 - FALL 2024

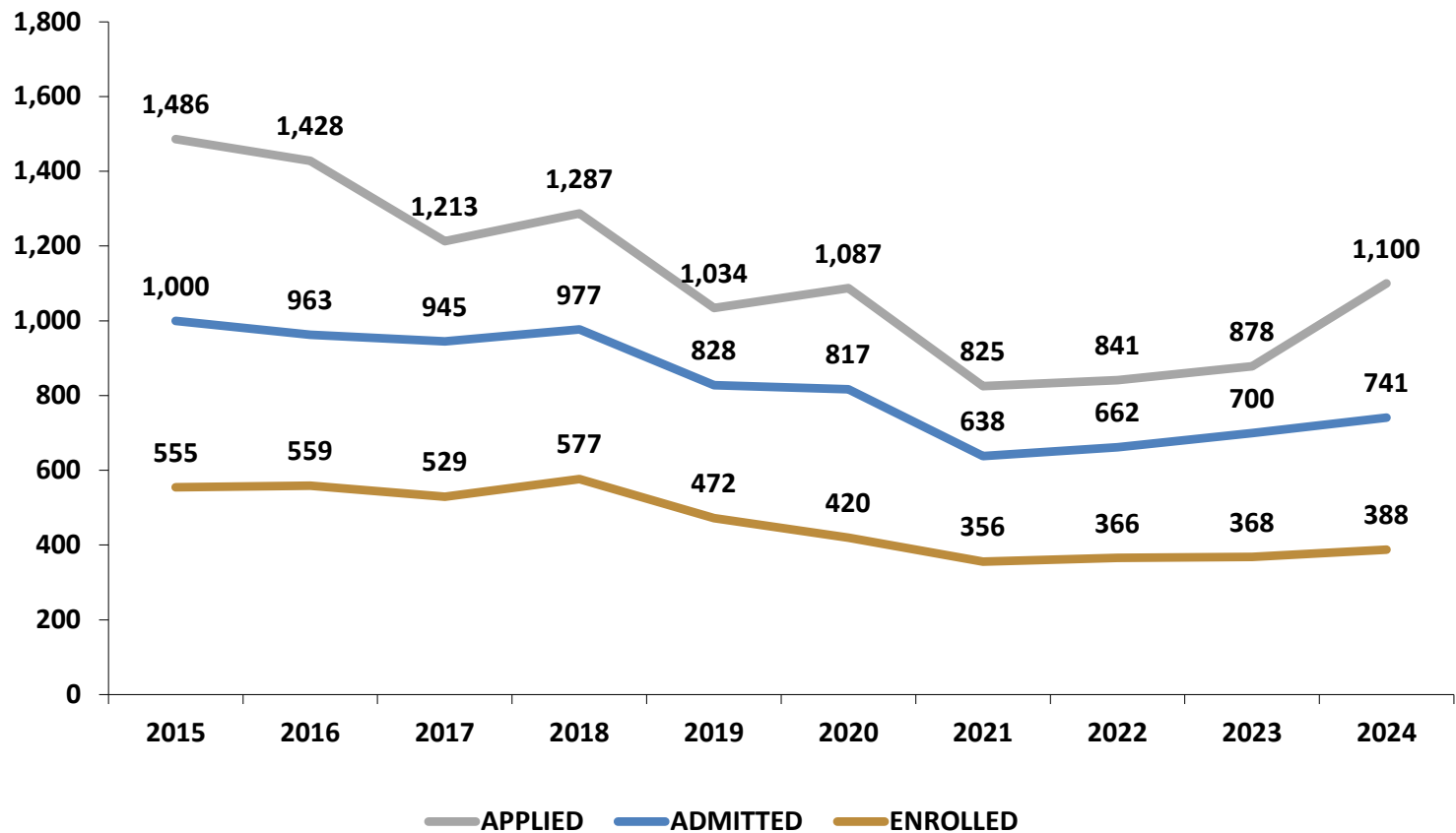

NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

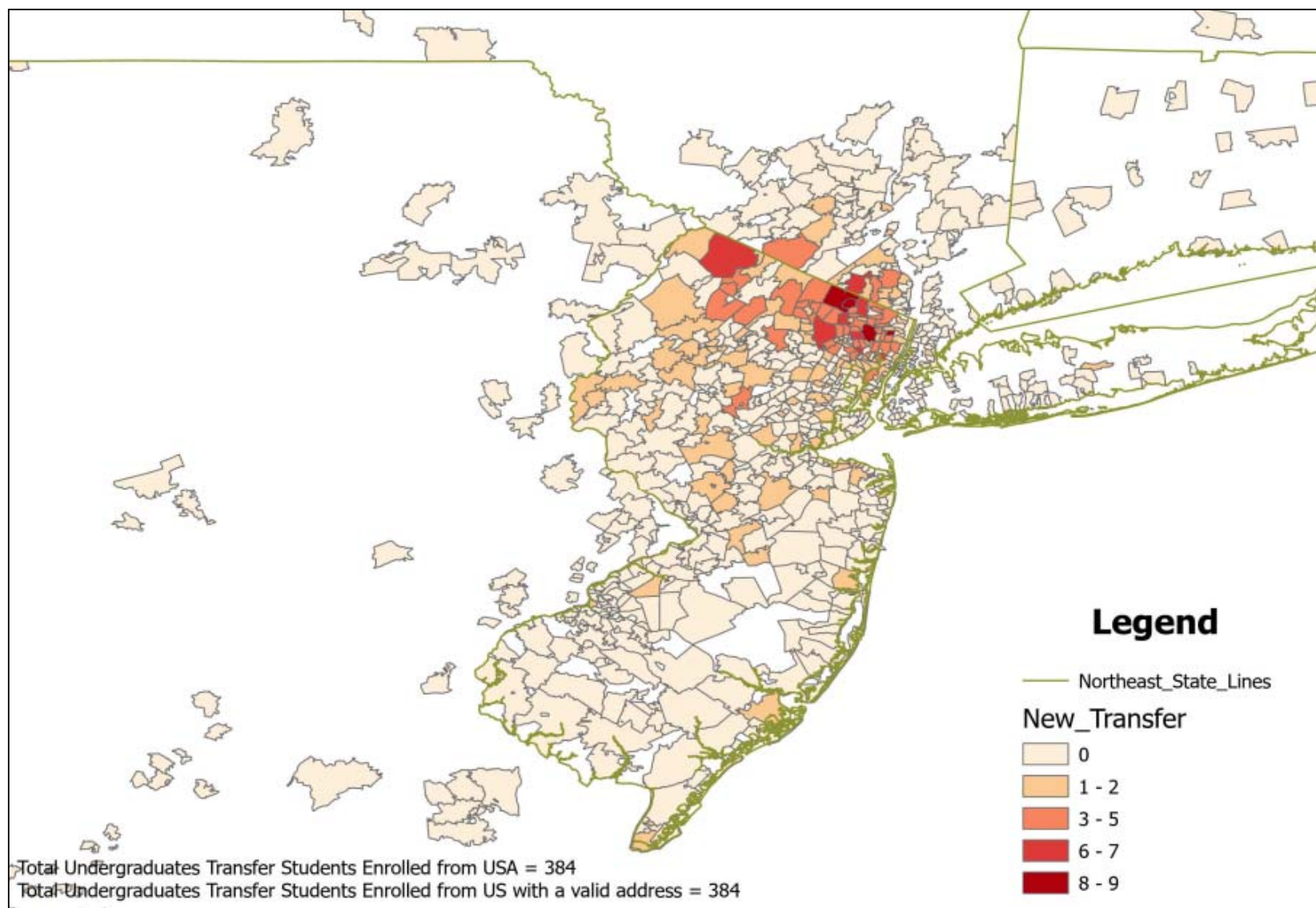

NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS ENROLLED FROM COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2024

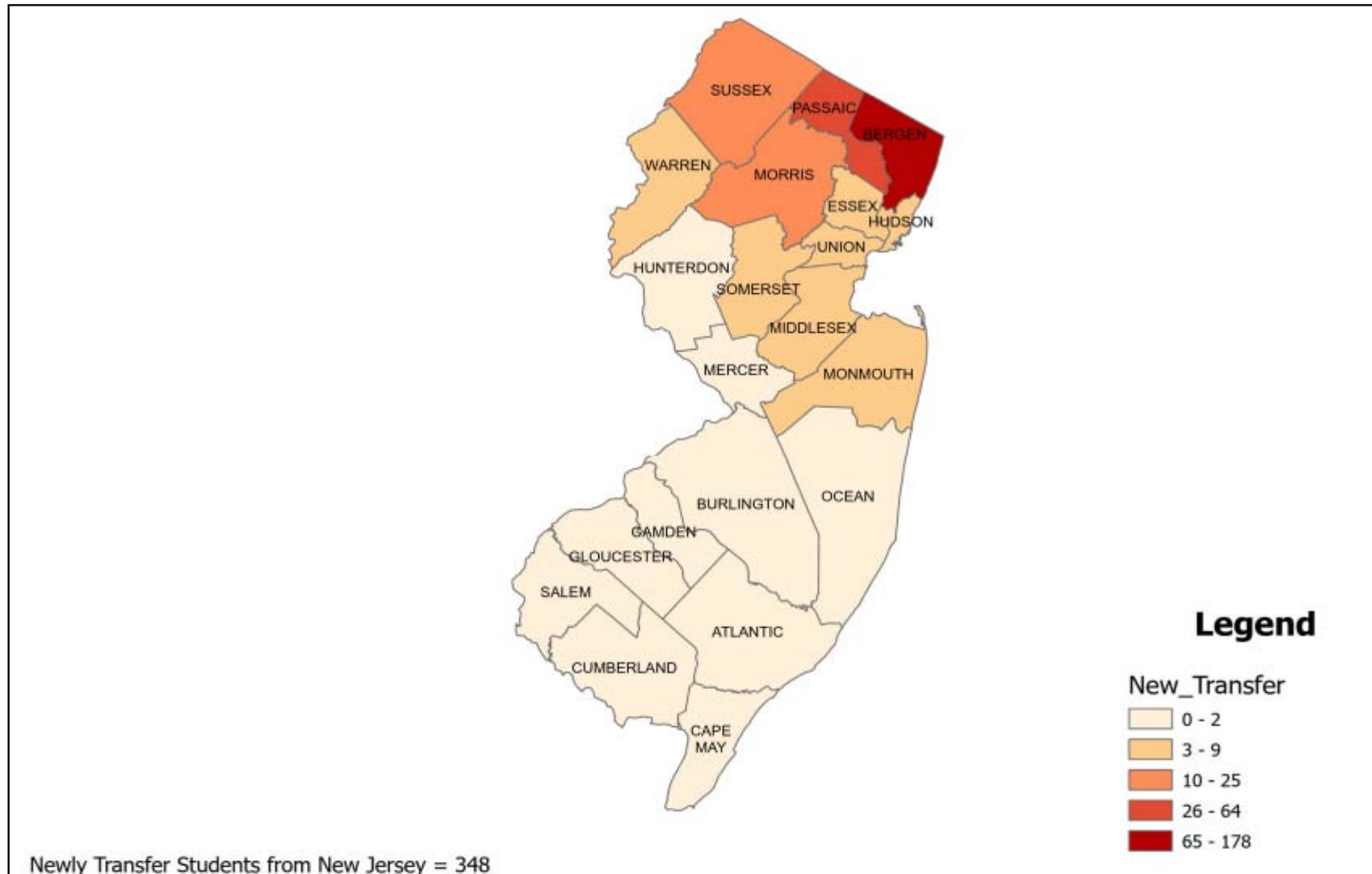

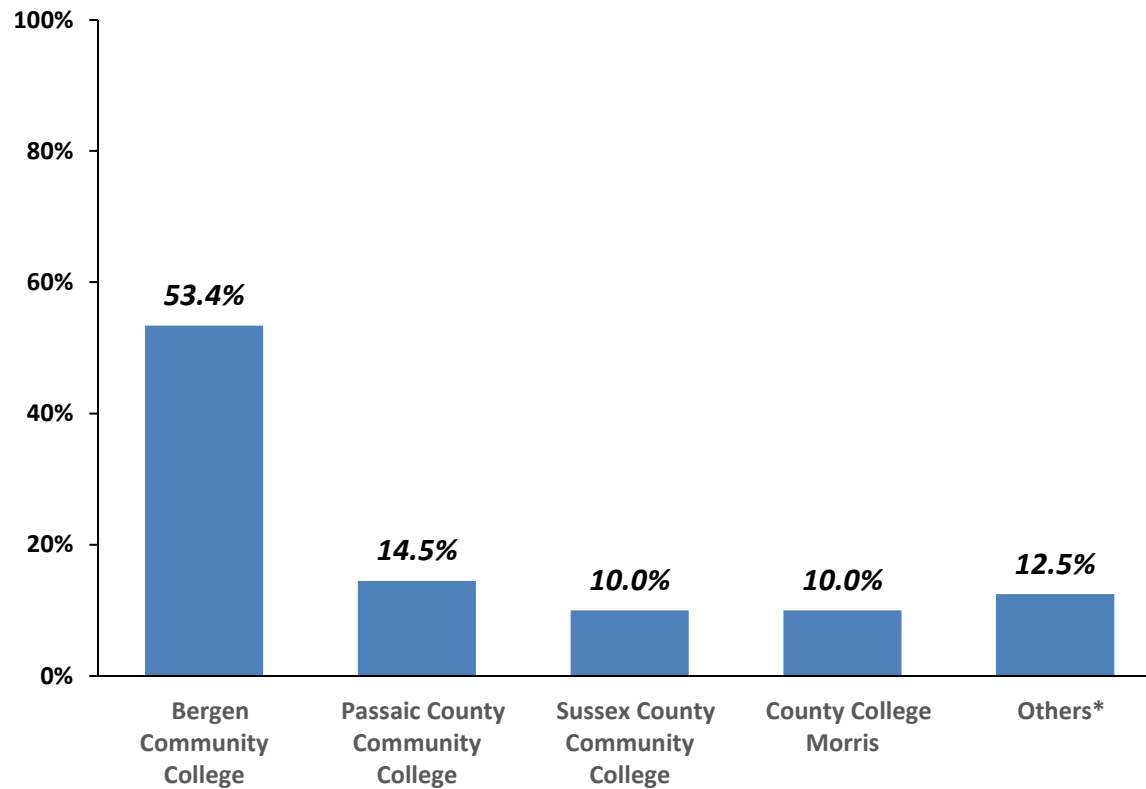

NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE IN NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

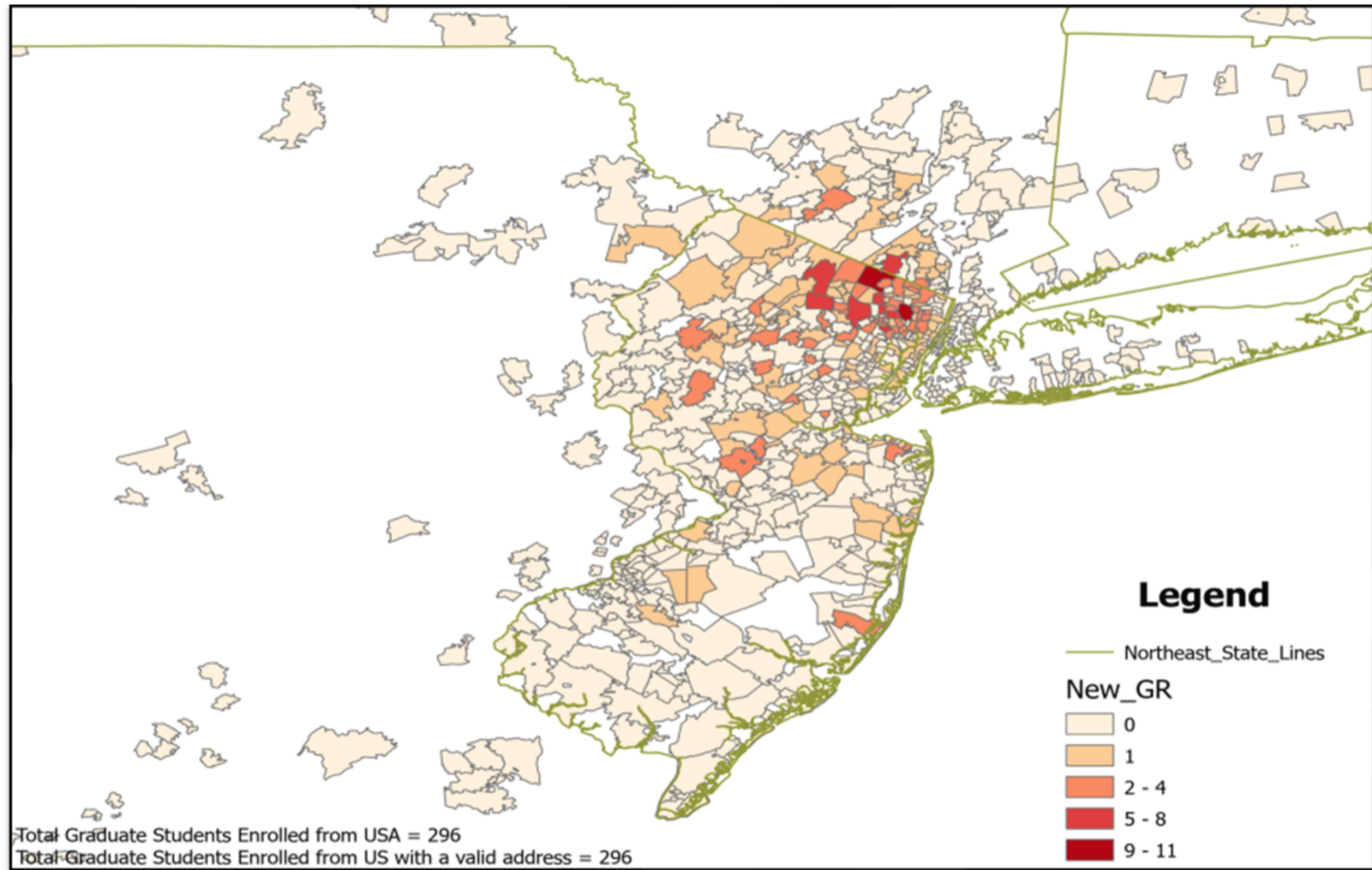
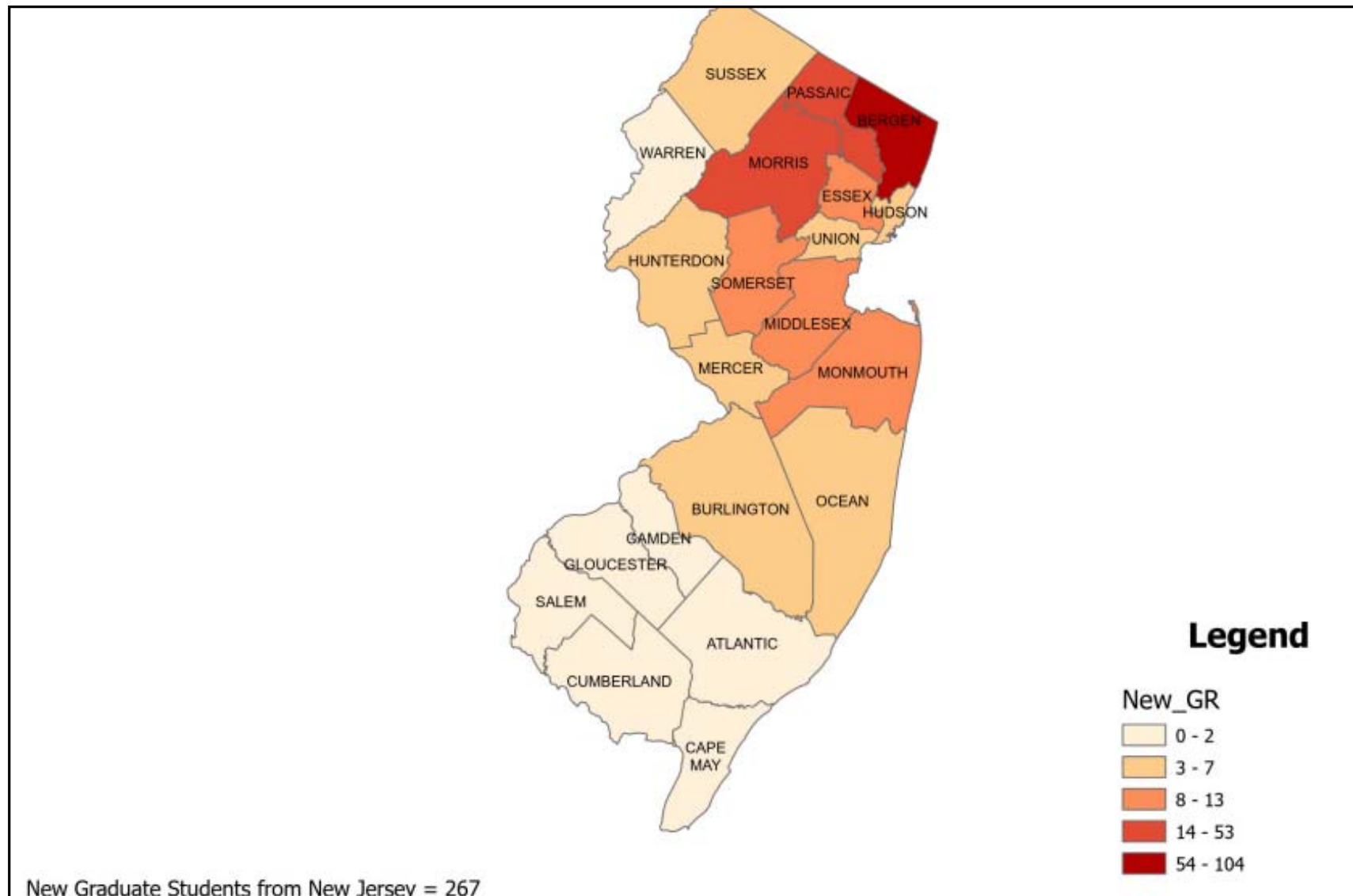


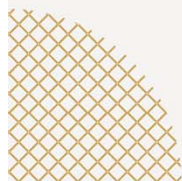

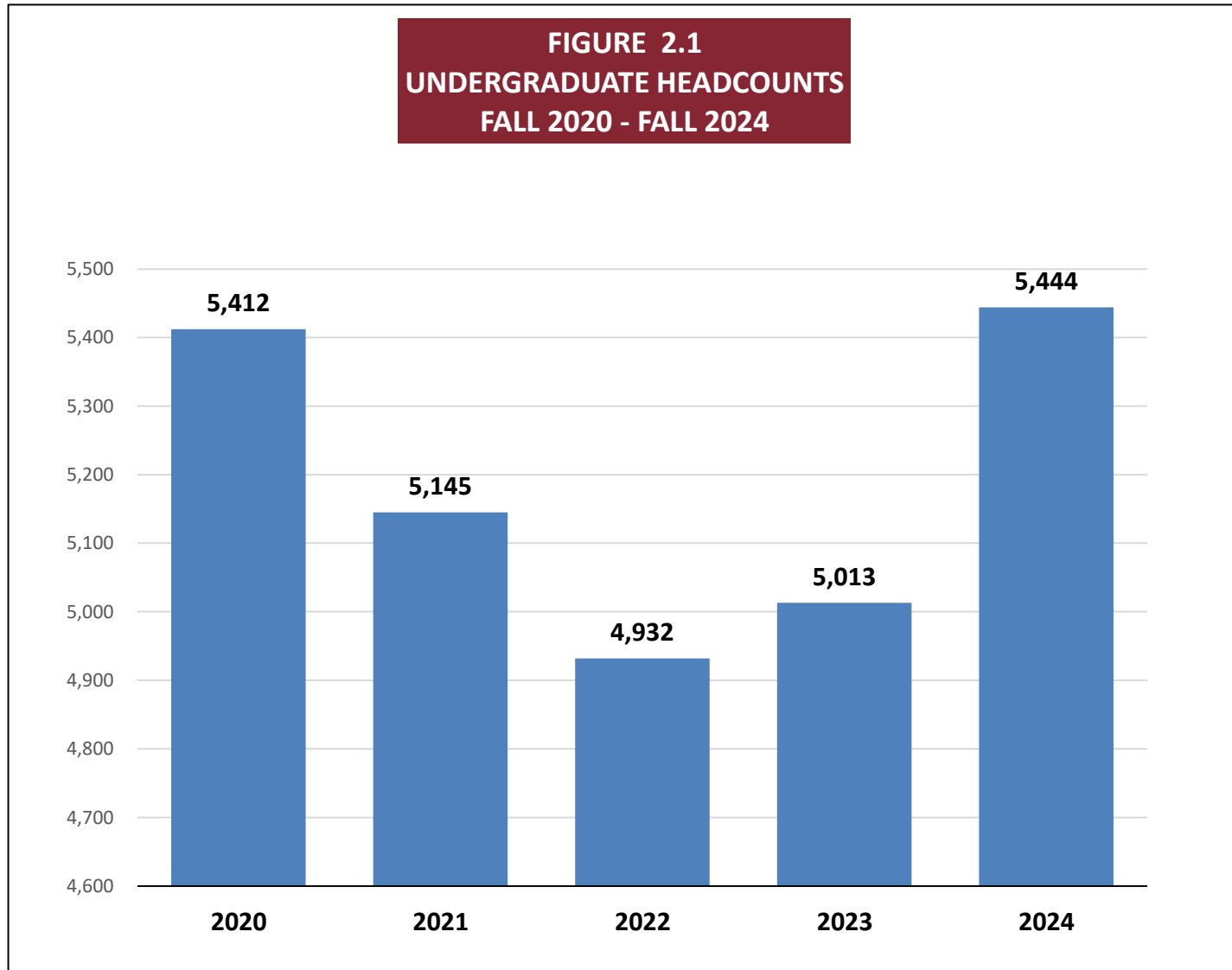


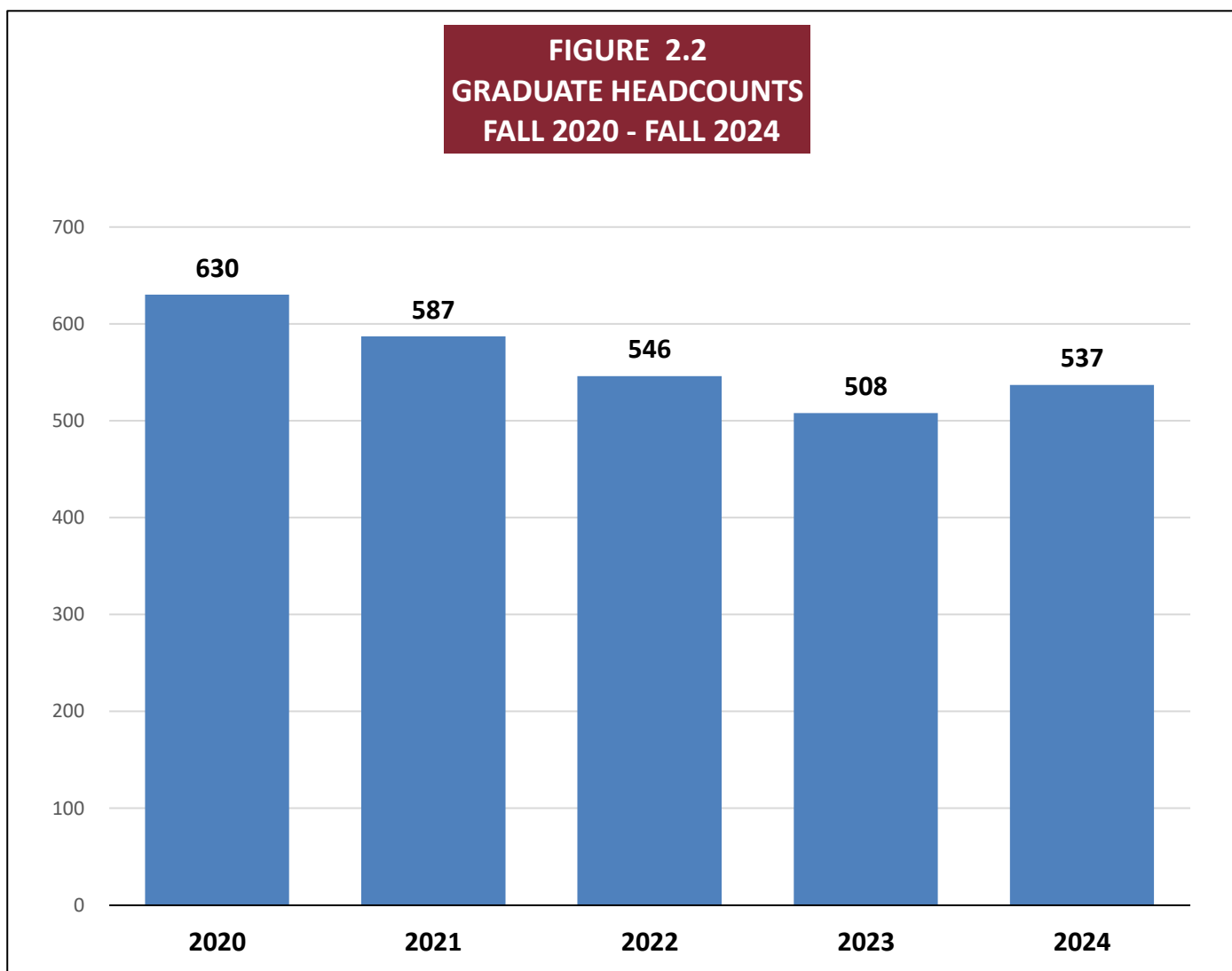
Executive Summary

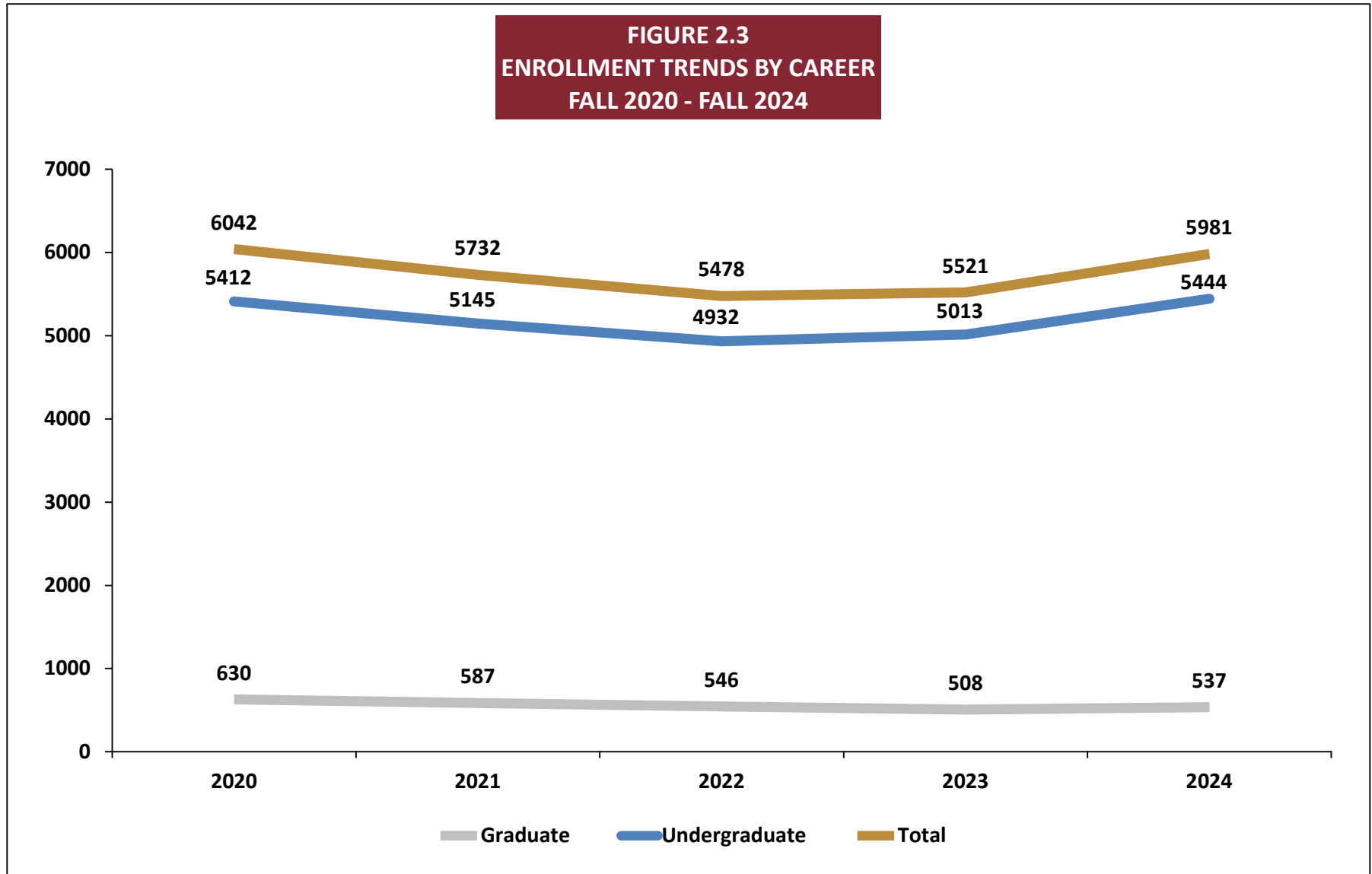
- In 2024, Ramapo College's undergraduate enrollment reached a five-year high of 5,444 students. In contrast, graduate enrollment fell to 537 students—its second lowest level in the past five years. **(Figures 2.1 and 2.2, pp. 56–57)**
- From 2023 to 2024, the number of male graduate students grew by 24.3%, compared to 9.5% growth of male undergraduate students.. **(Table 2.4, page 62)**
- From 2023-2024 the number of Hispanic undergraduate students rose by 14.7%, and the number of Hispanic graduate students rose by 15.6%. **(Tables 2.5.1 and 2.5.2 ,pp. 65-66)**
- In 2024, 37.3% of all graduate students were from minority backgrounds, representing an increase of 6.2% over the previous year, and an increase of 11.6% over the past five years. **(Table 2.5.2, page 66)**
- The number of unclassified/non-degree-seeking students rose by 56.4% from 2023 to 2024, and by 105.3% from 2020 to 2024. **(Tables 2.6 and 2.12, pp. 68, 79)**
- The number of international students among undergraduates decreased by 18.4%, contributing to an overall decline of 21.8% across both undergraduate and graduate student populations from 2023 to 2024. **(Table 2.7, page 69)**
- Pell aid recipients have steadily increased in recent years. In 2024, 53% of first-generation students received Pell Grants, compared to 30.8% of all undergraduates. **(Table 2.24, page 100)**

ALL UNDERGRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

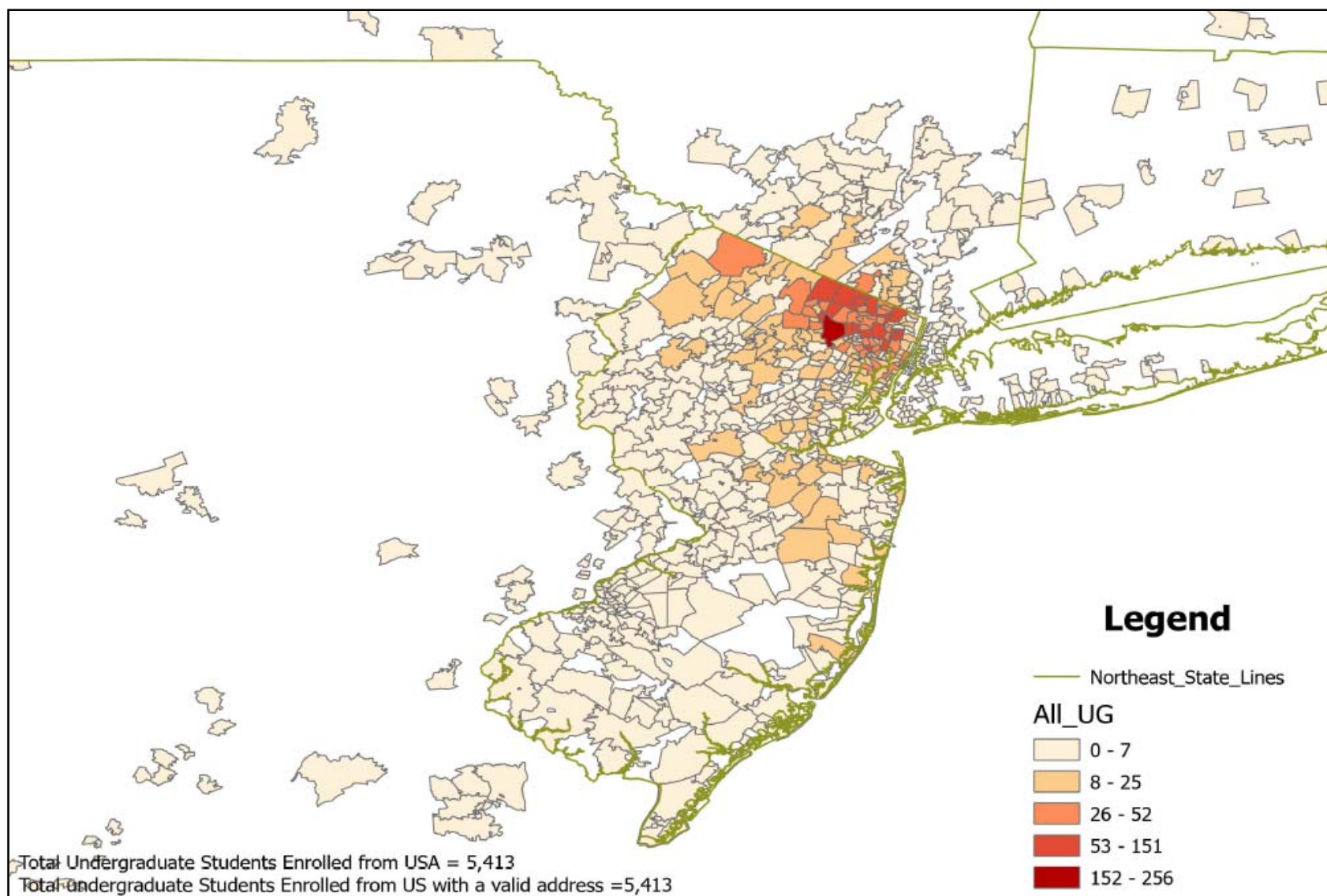

ALL UNDERGRADUATES ENROLLED FROM COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2024

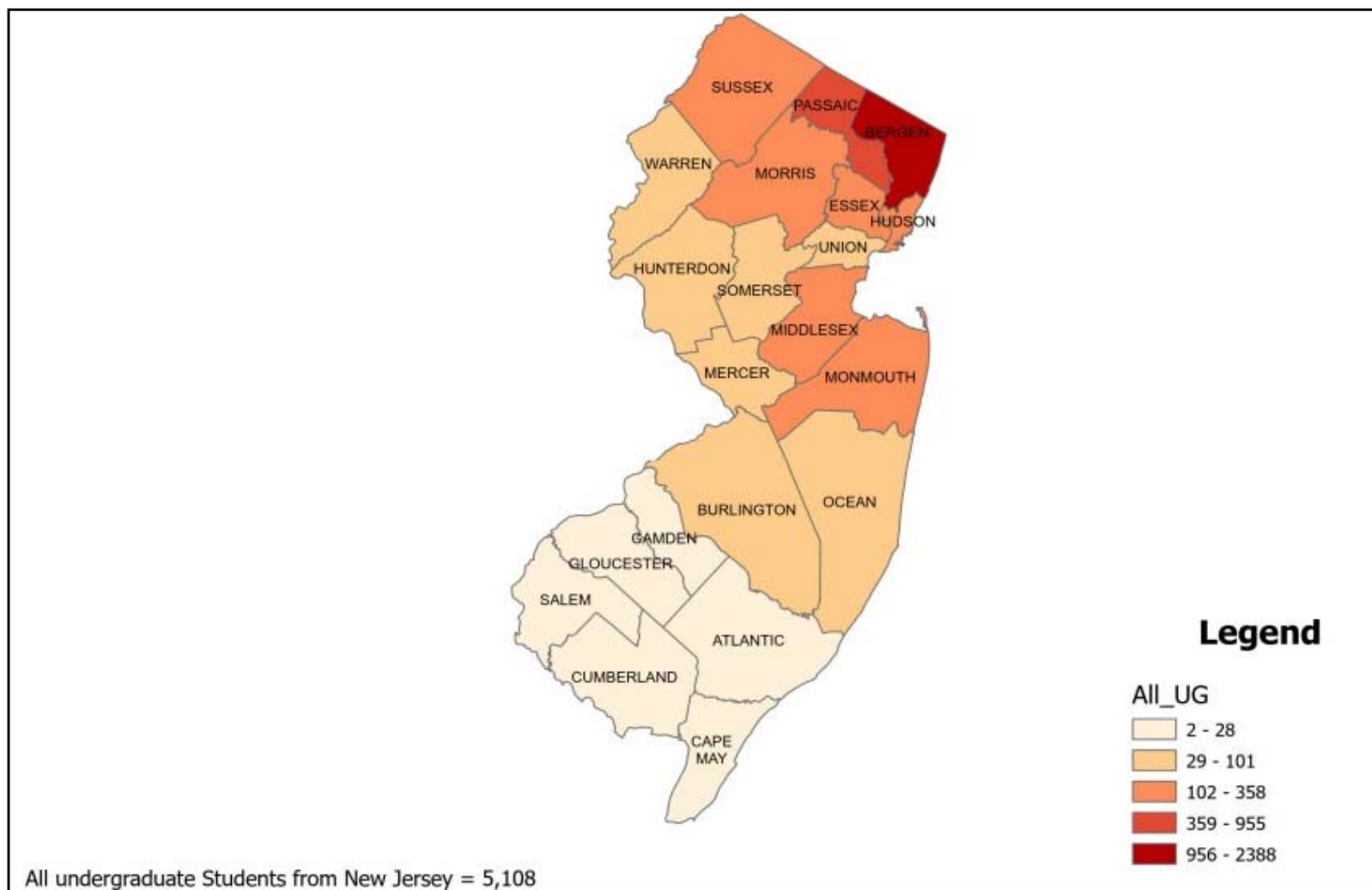

ALL GRADUATES ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2024

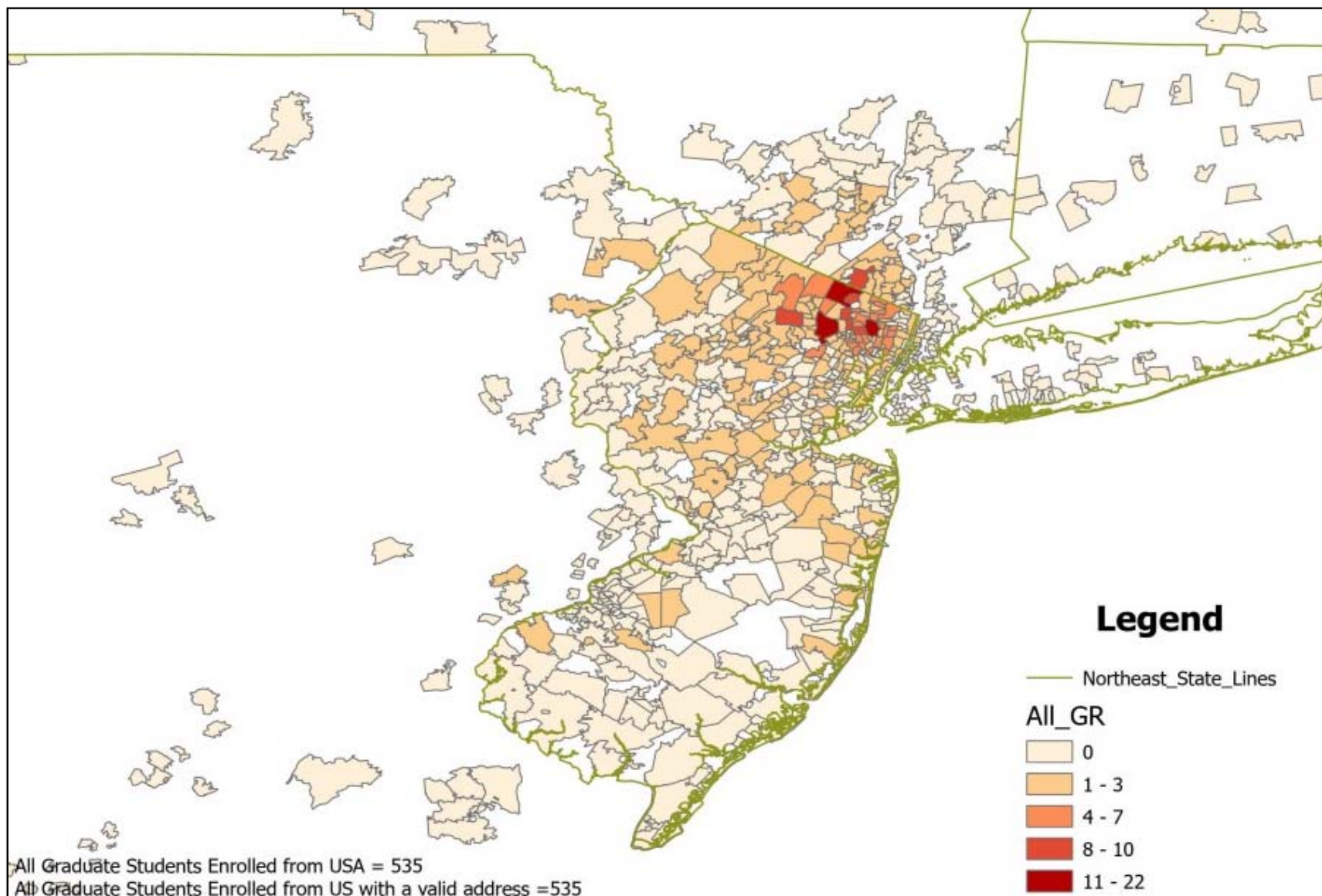

ALL GRADUATES ENROLLED FROM COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2024

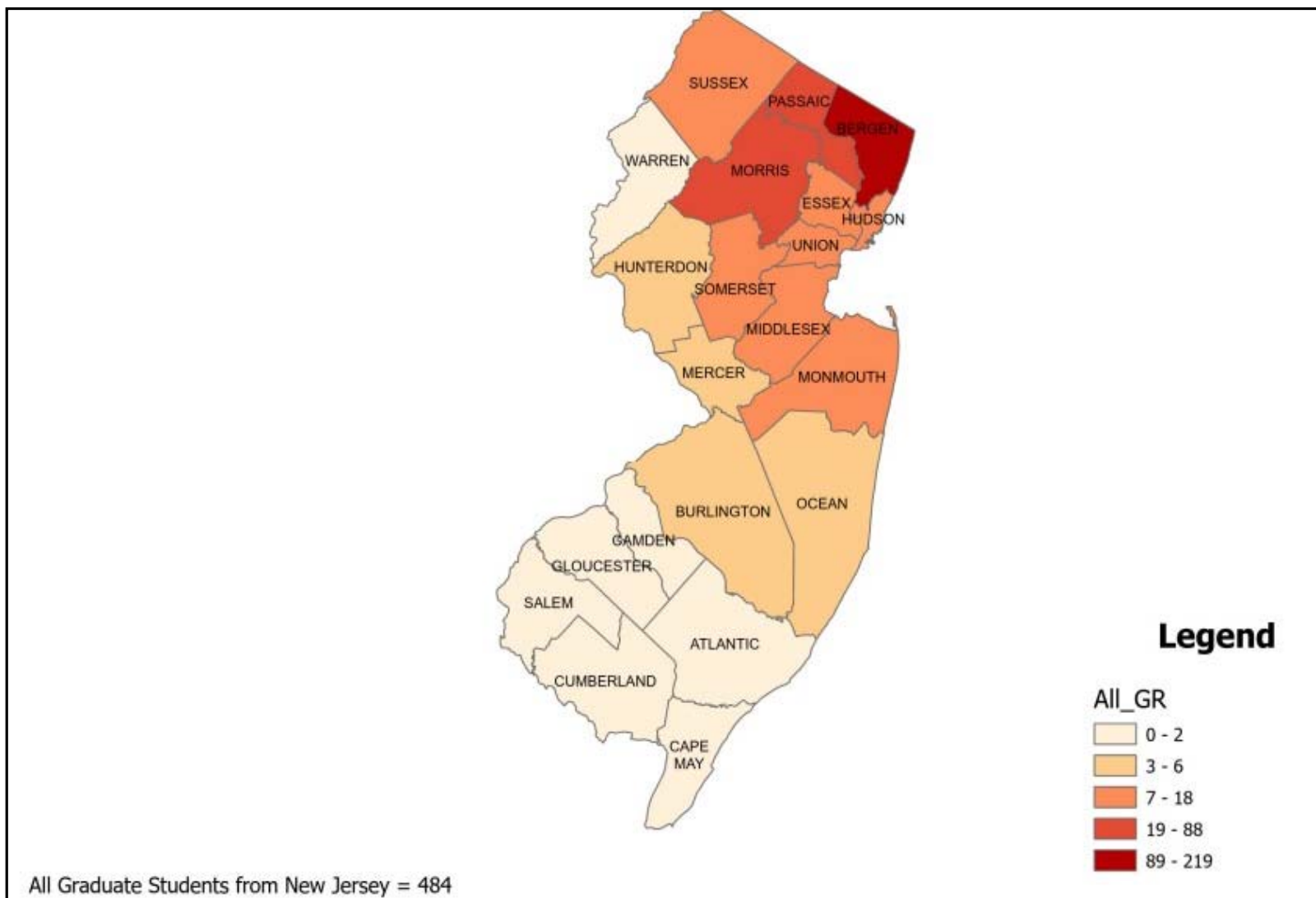

UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY SCHOOL, FALL 2024

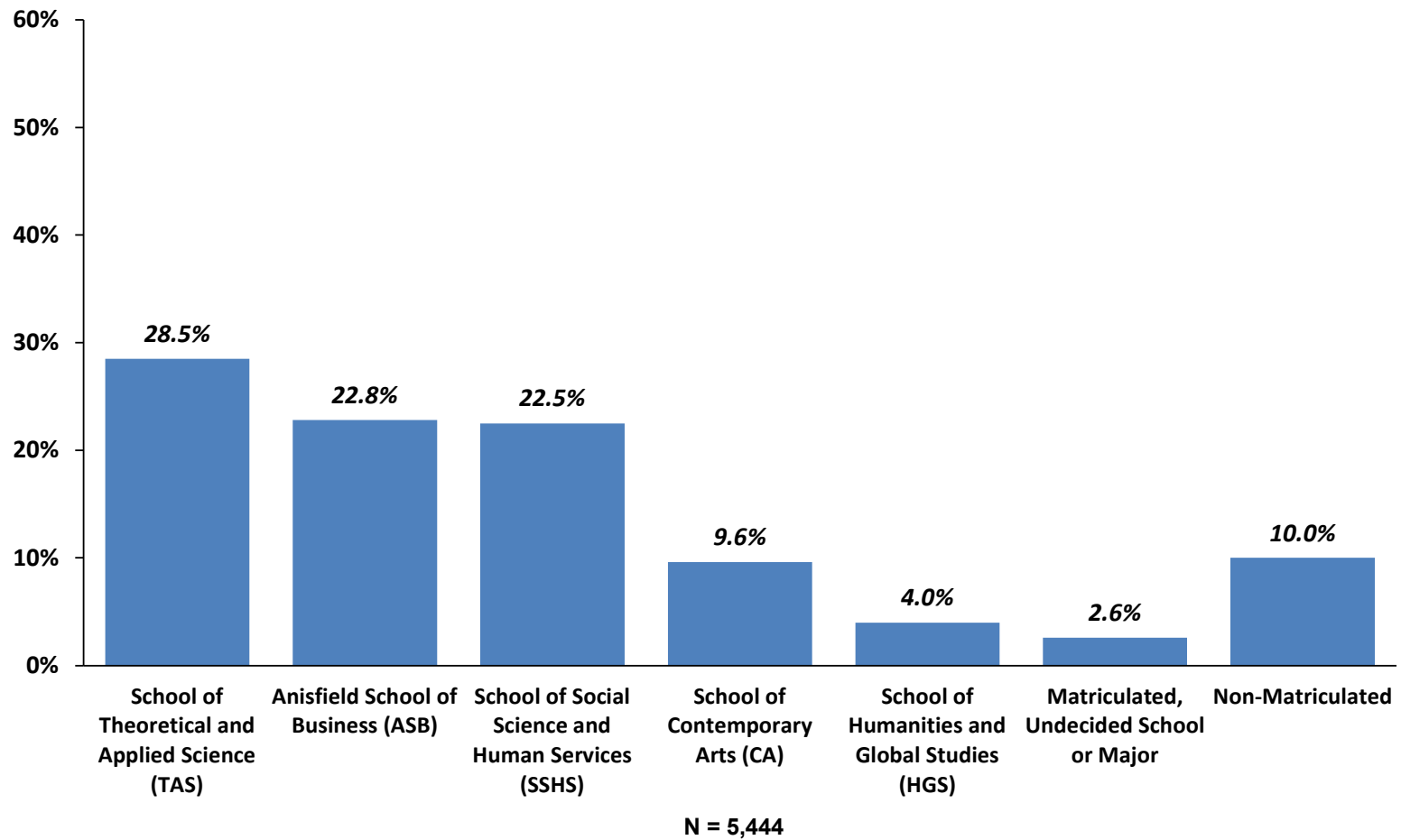

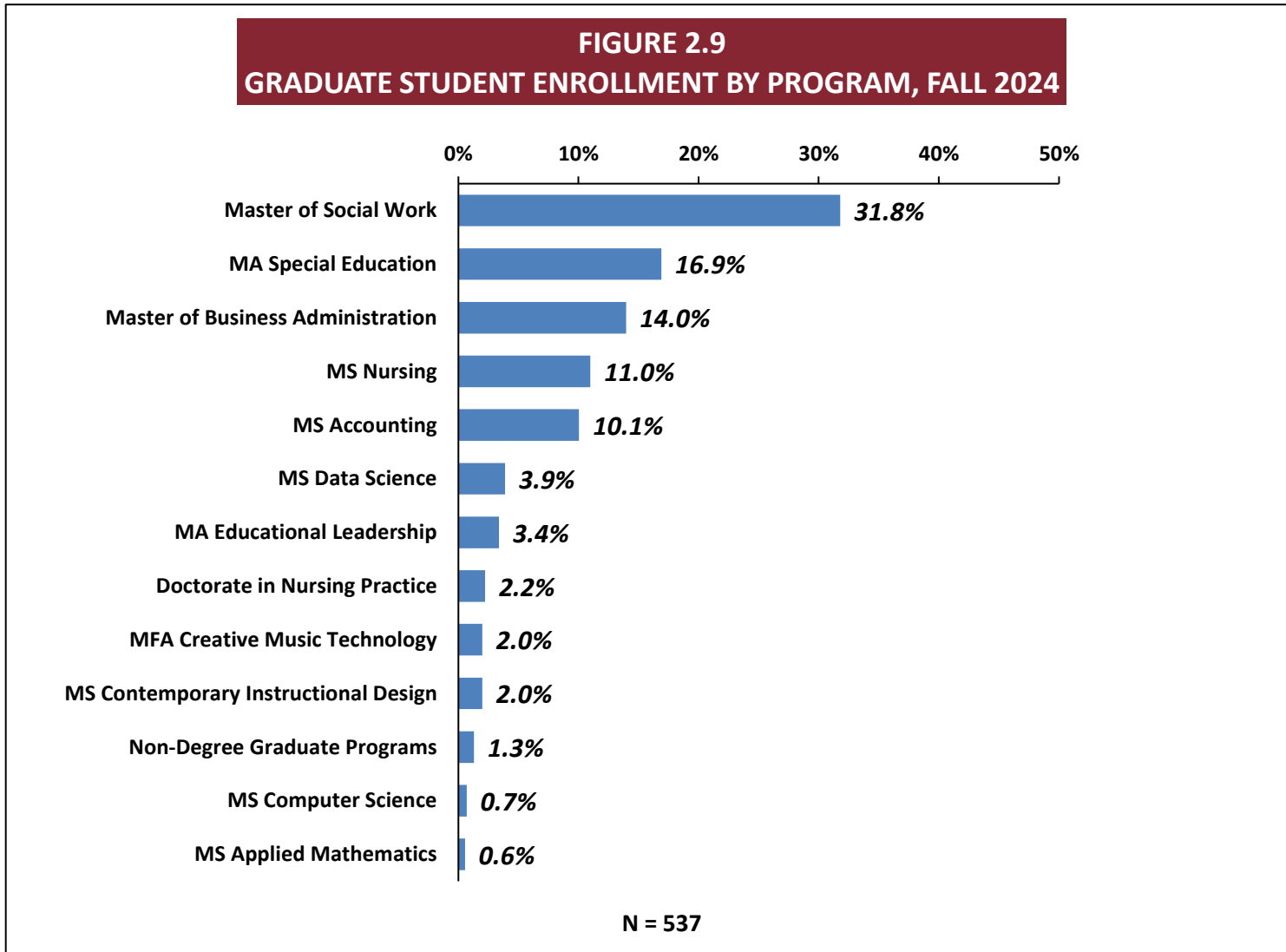

ALL UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLED FIRST GENERATION STUDENTS, FALL 2024

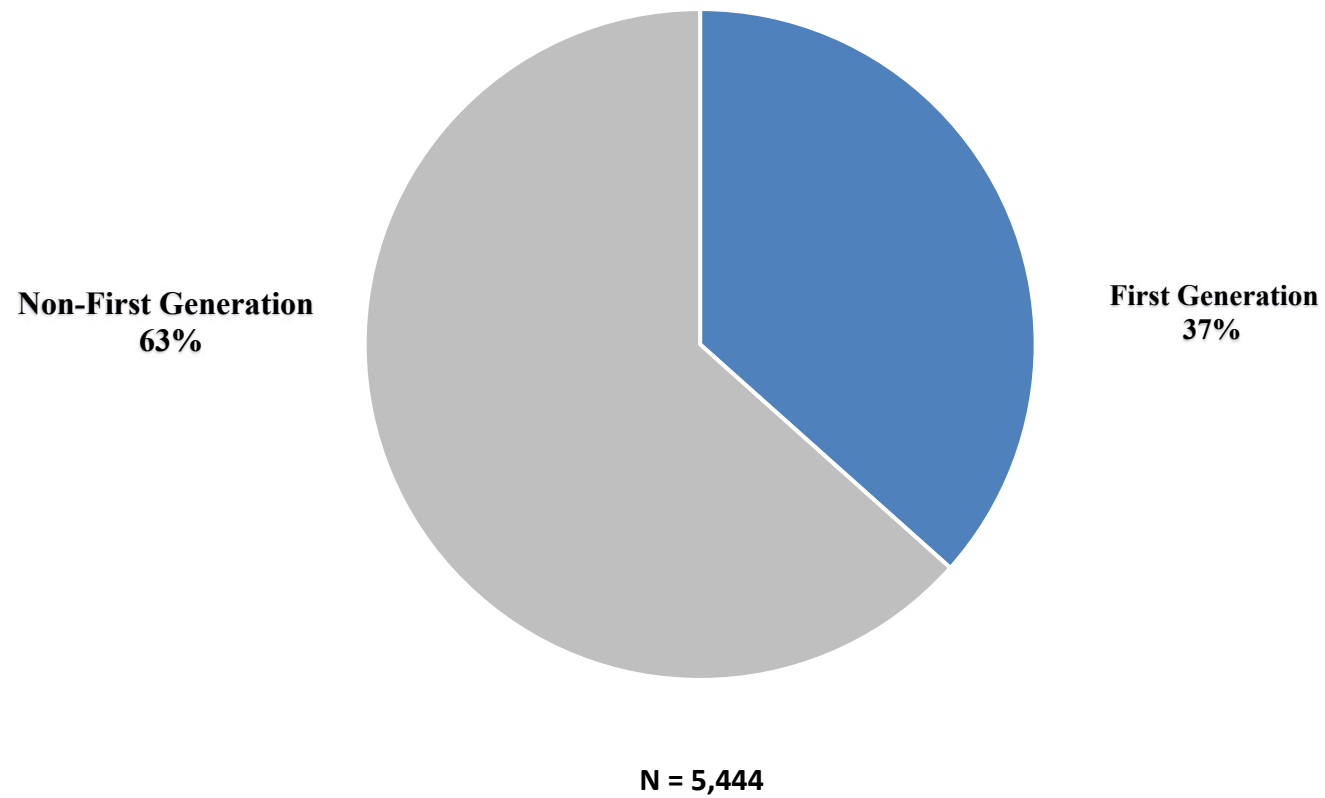
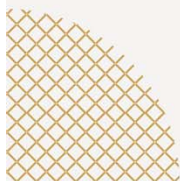

Executive Summary

- Of the 2023 cohort, 93.5% of FT/FT degree-seeking students continued into their second semester, and 83.6% continued into their second year. Of the 2024 cohort, 94% of FT/FT degree-seeking students continued into their second semester. **(Table 3.16, p.135)**
- Among the 2023 cohort, Asian students had the highest second year retention rate at 90.2%, far exceeding the cohort's average second year retention rate of 83.6% across all race/ethnicity and citizenship categories. **(Table 3.17, p.139)**
- Of the 2023 cohort, 89.7% of transfer students continued into their second semester, and 81.8% continued into their second year. Of the 2024 cohort, 88.7% of transfer students continued into their second semester. **(Table 3.20, p.146)**
- Overall, first time students tend to have slightly higher GPAs than transfer students. Also, unlike the other four schools, the School of Theoretical and Applied Science shows a noticeable gap between first time students mean GPA of 3.45, and transfer students mean GPA of 3.22. **(Table 3.14, Figure 3.5, p.132)**
- Female students continue to consistently outperform male students in 4-year graduation rates with an average gap of 14 percentage points between female and male students across the eight cohorts for which data is available. **(Table 3.18, p.141)**

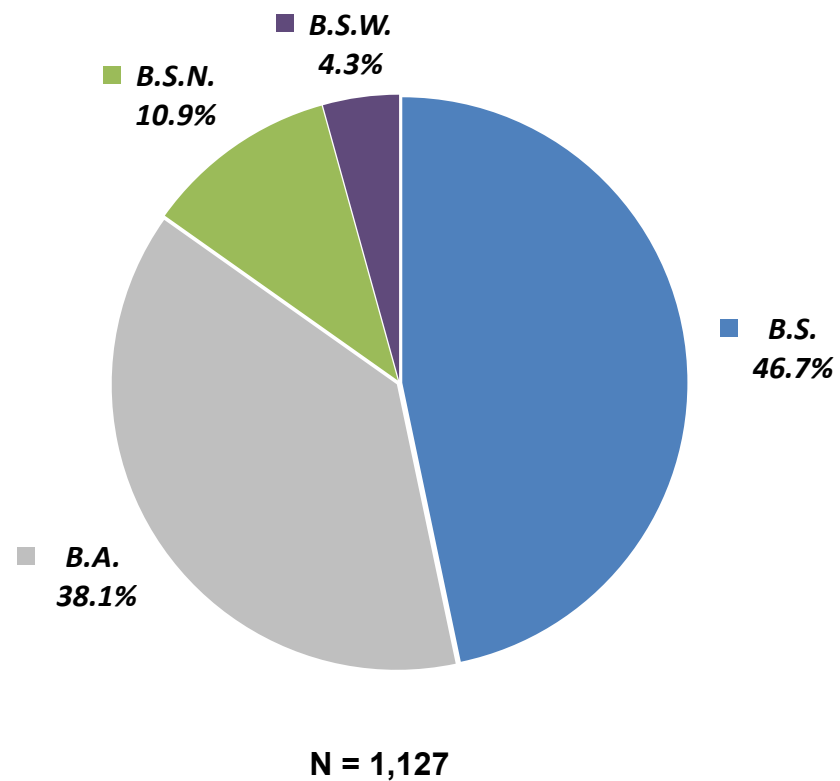

UNDERGRADUATE AWARDS BY TYPE OF DEGREE, FISCAL YEAR 2024



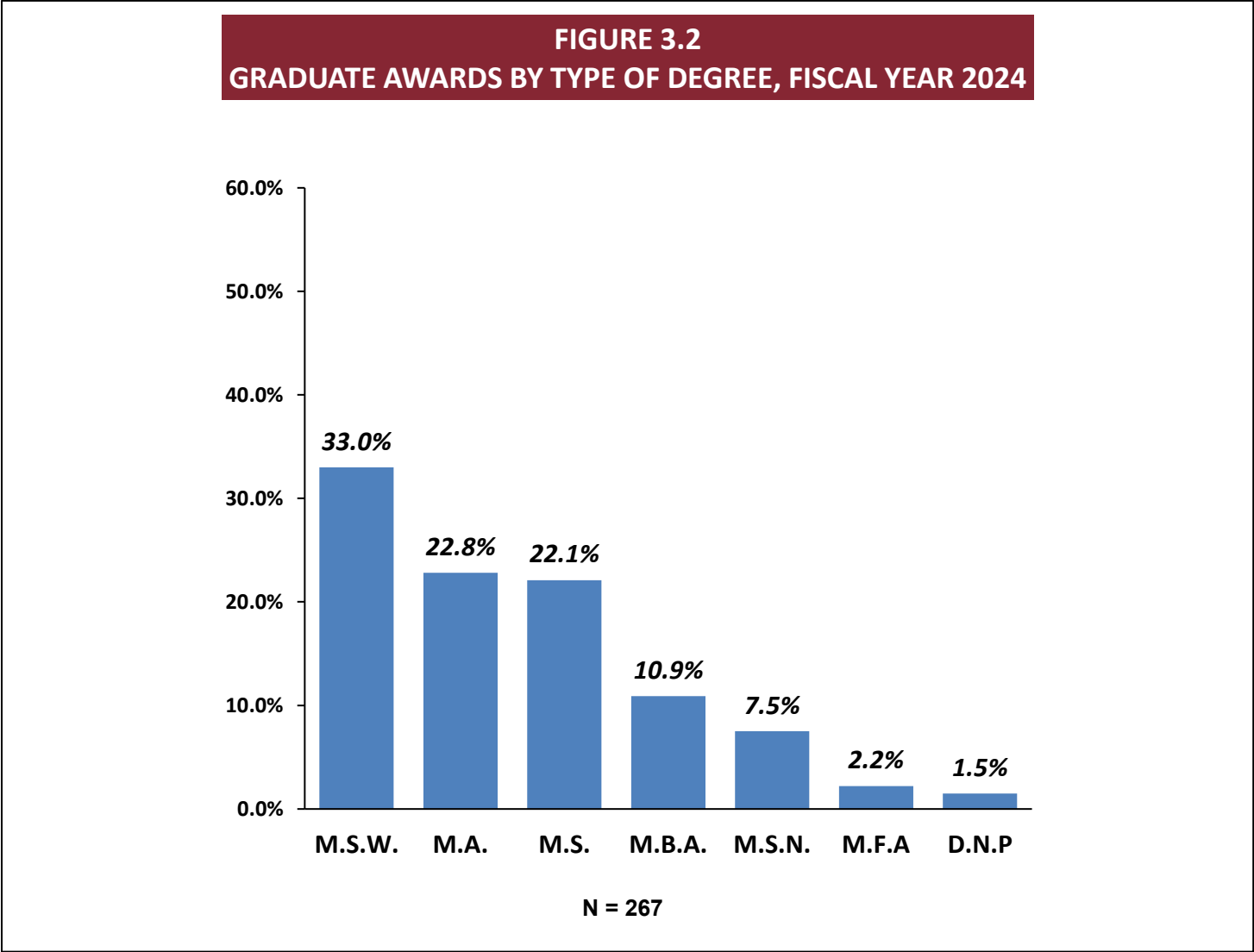
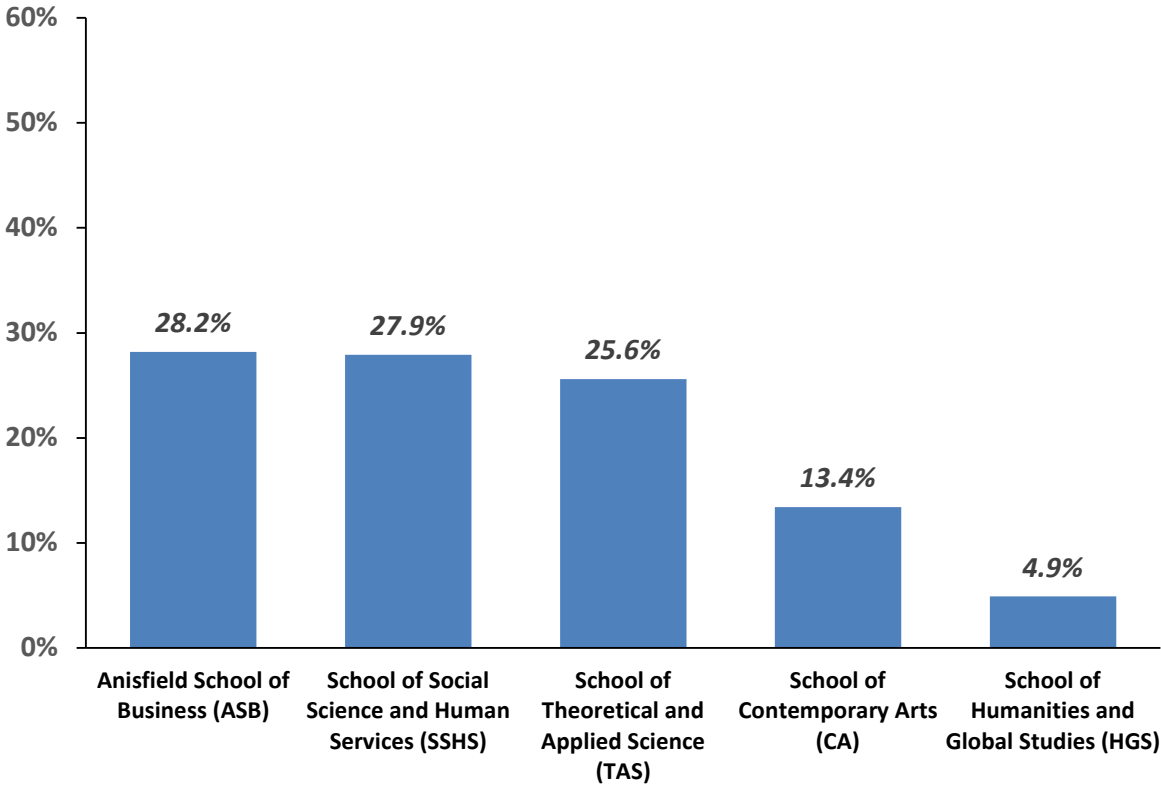

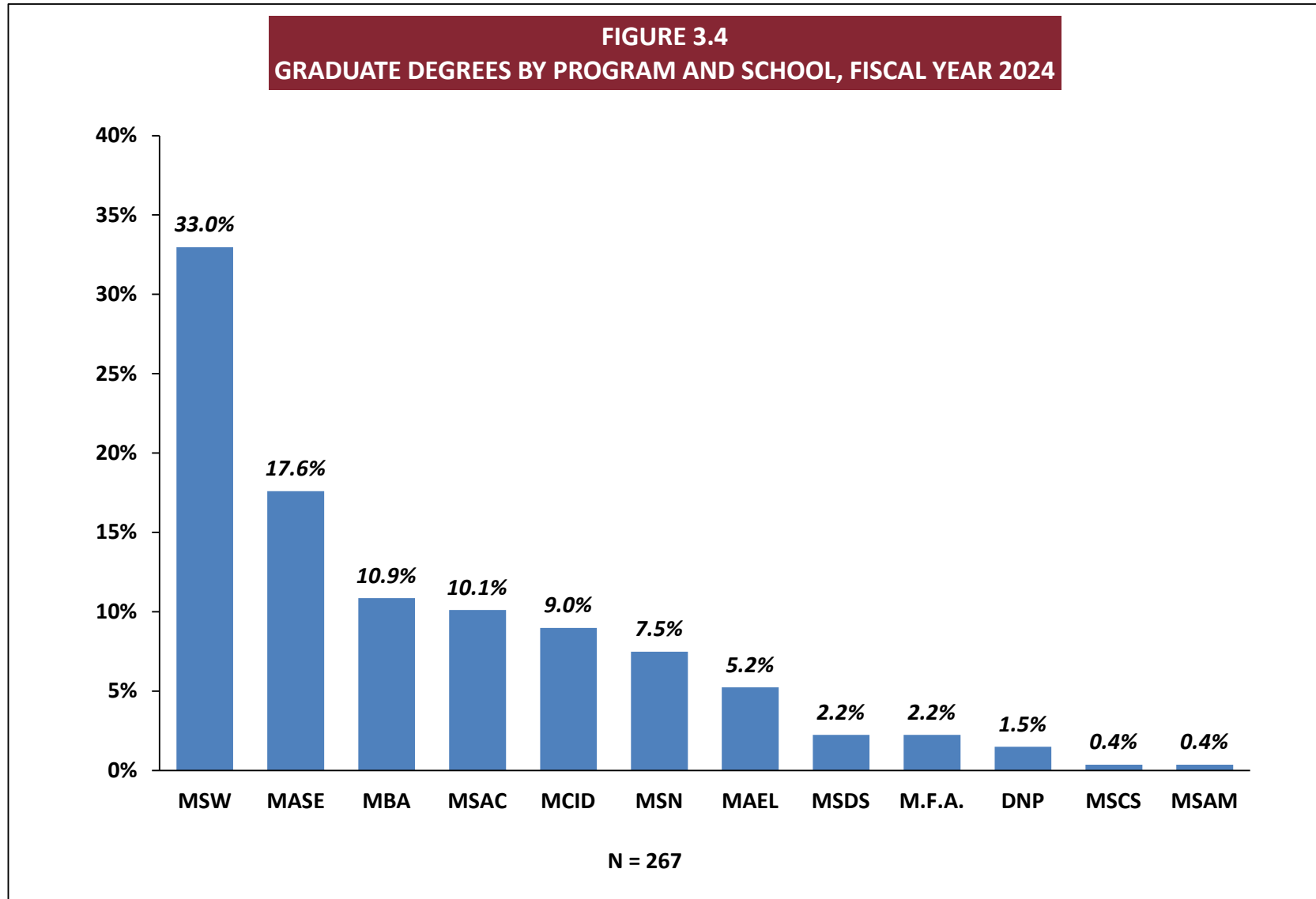

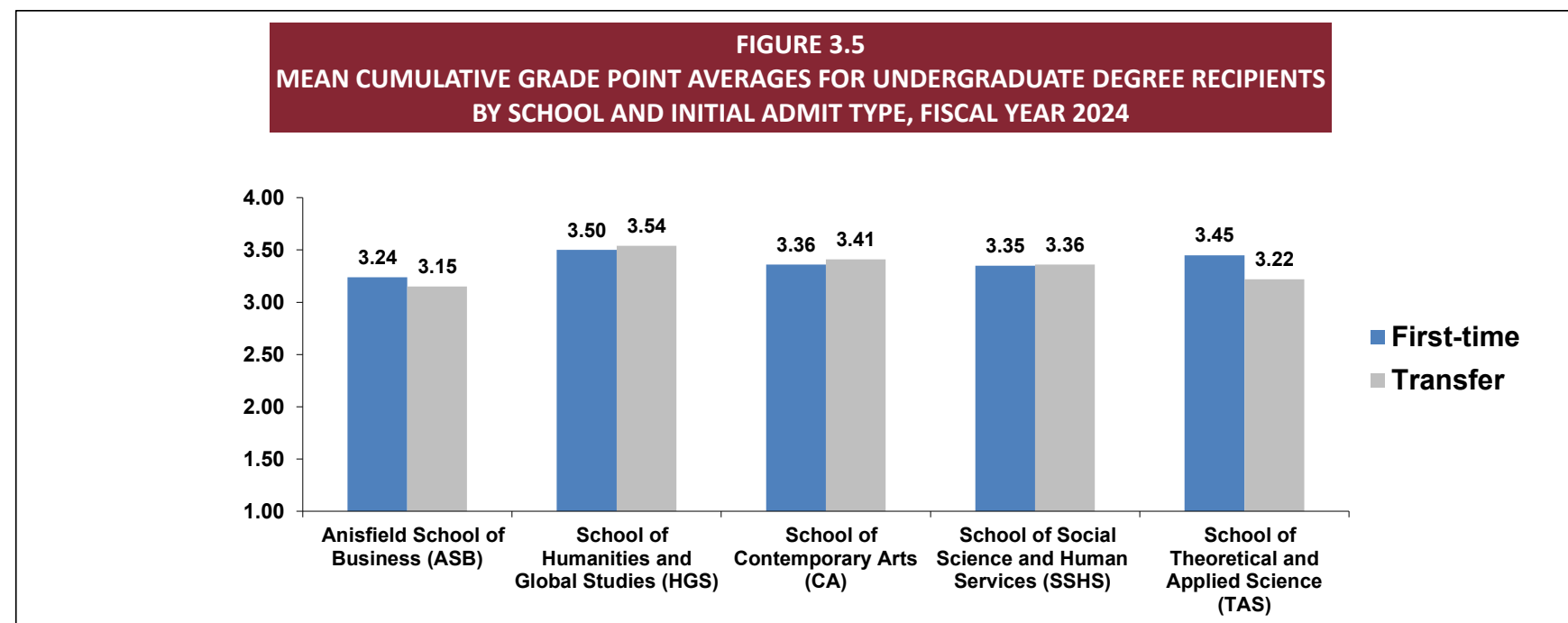
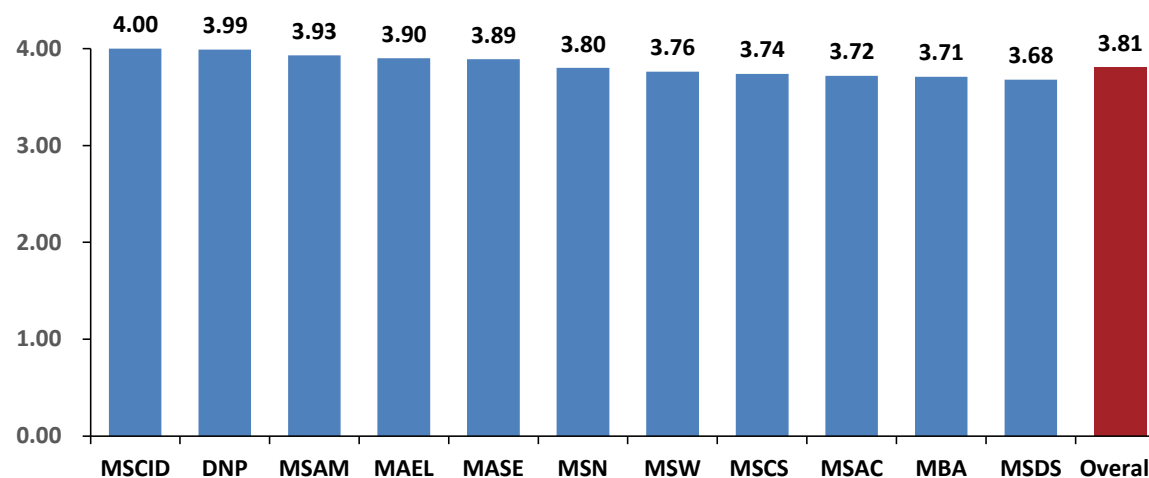
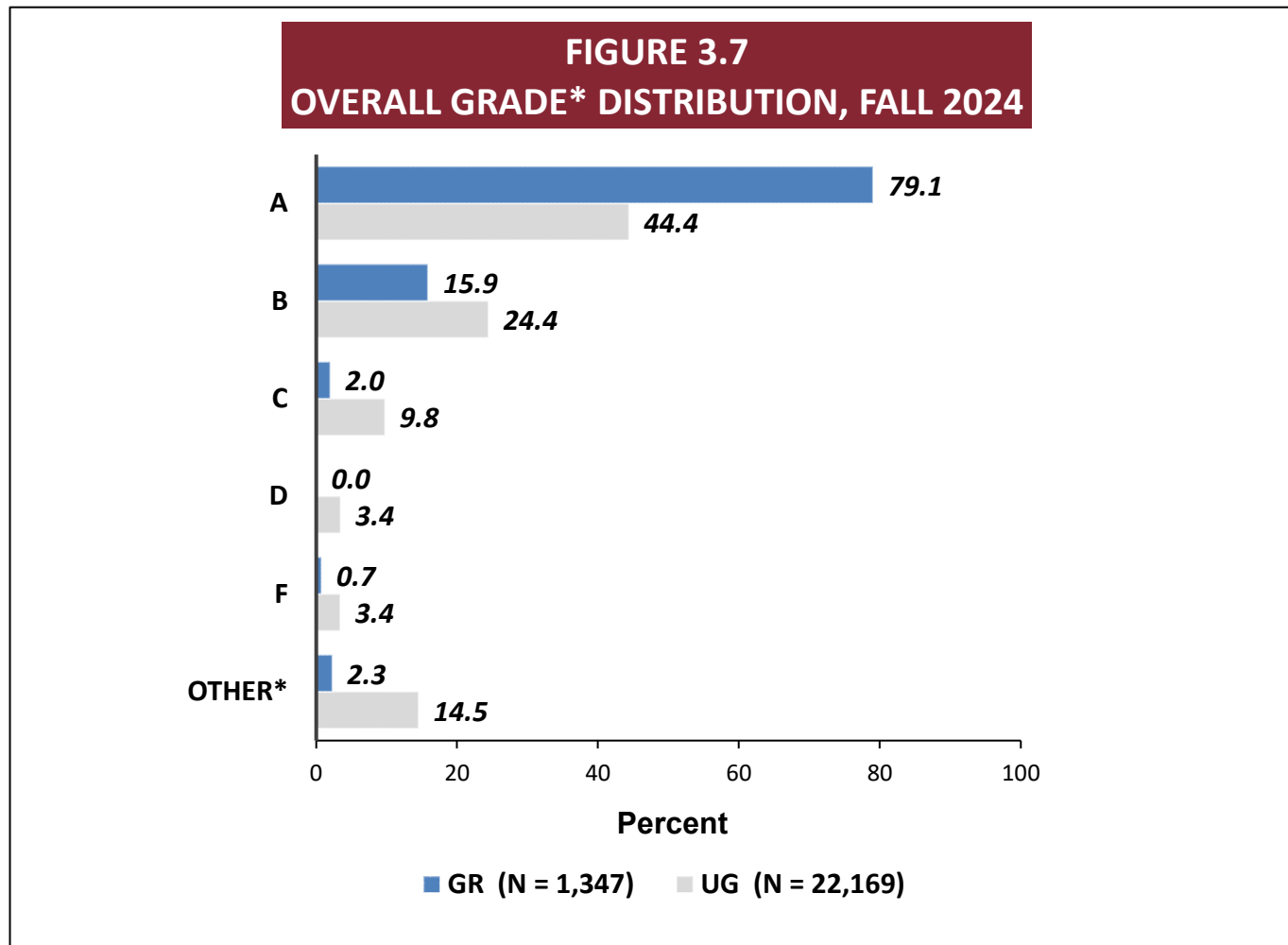

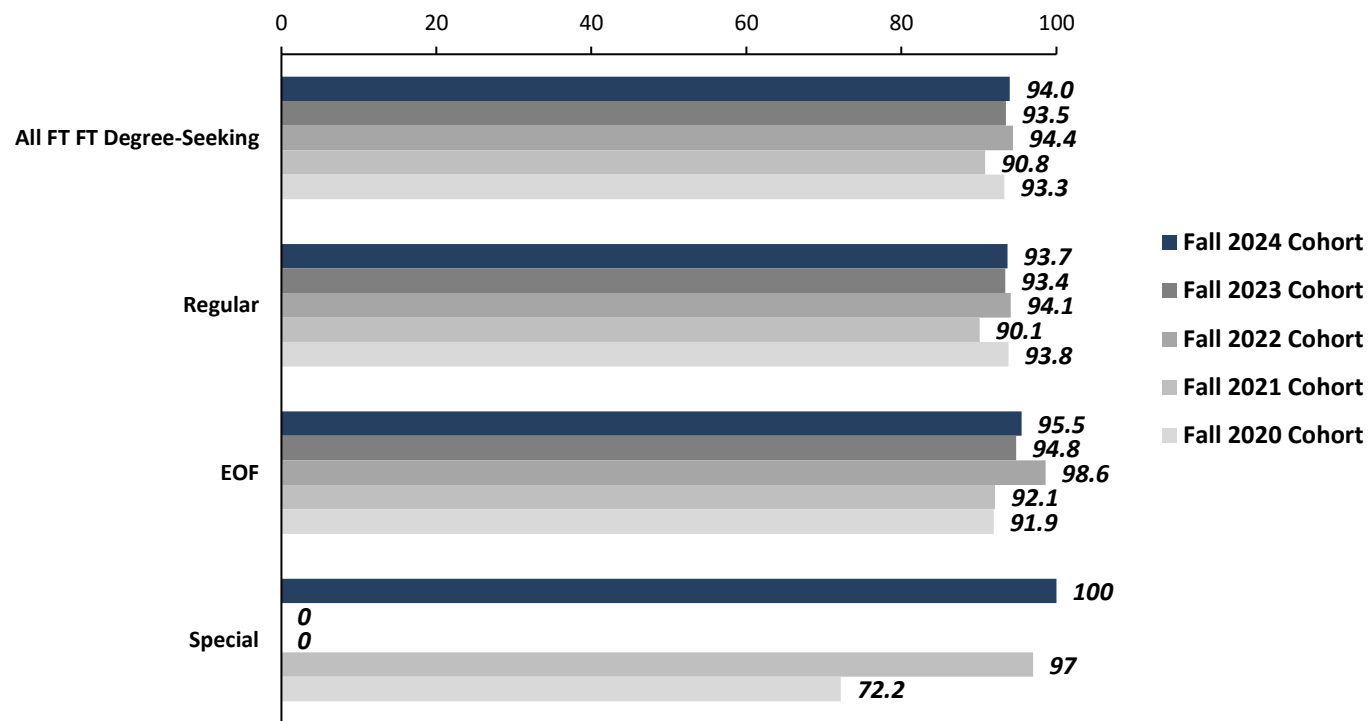

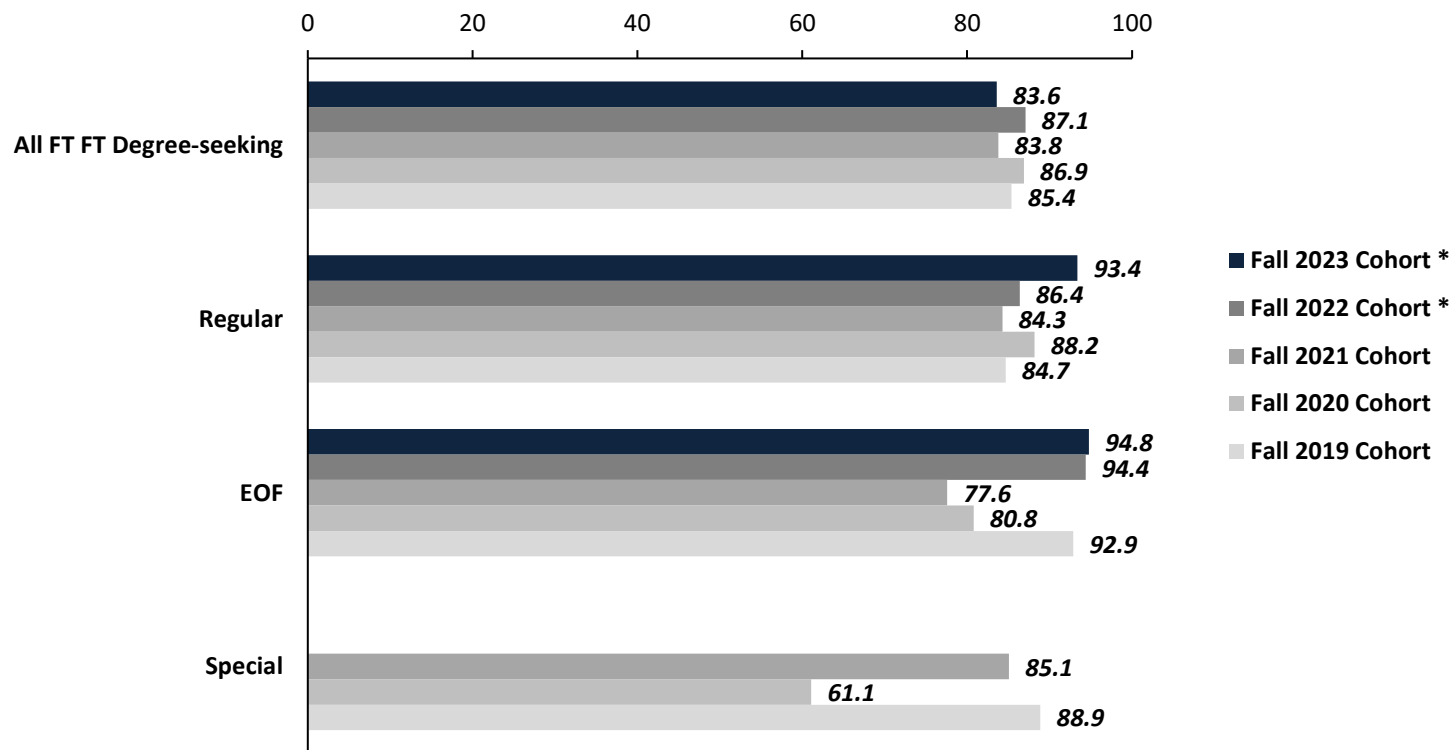

RAMAPO ALUMNI IN USA - FALL 2024

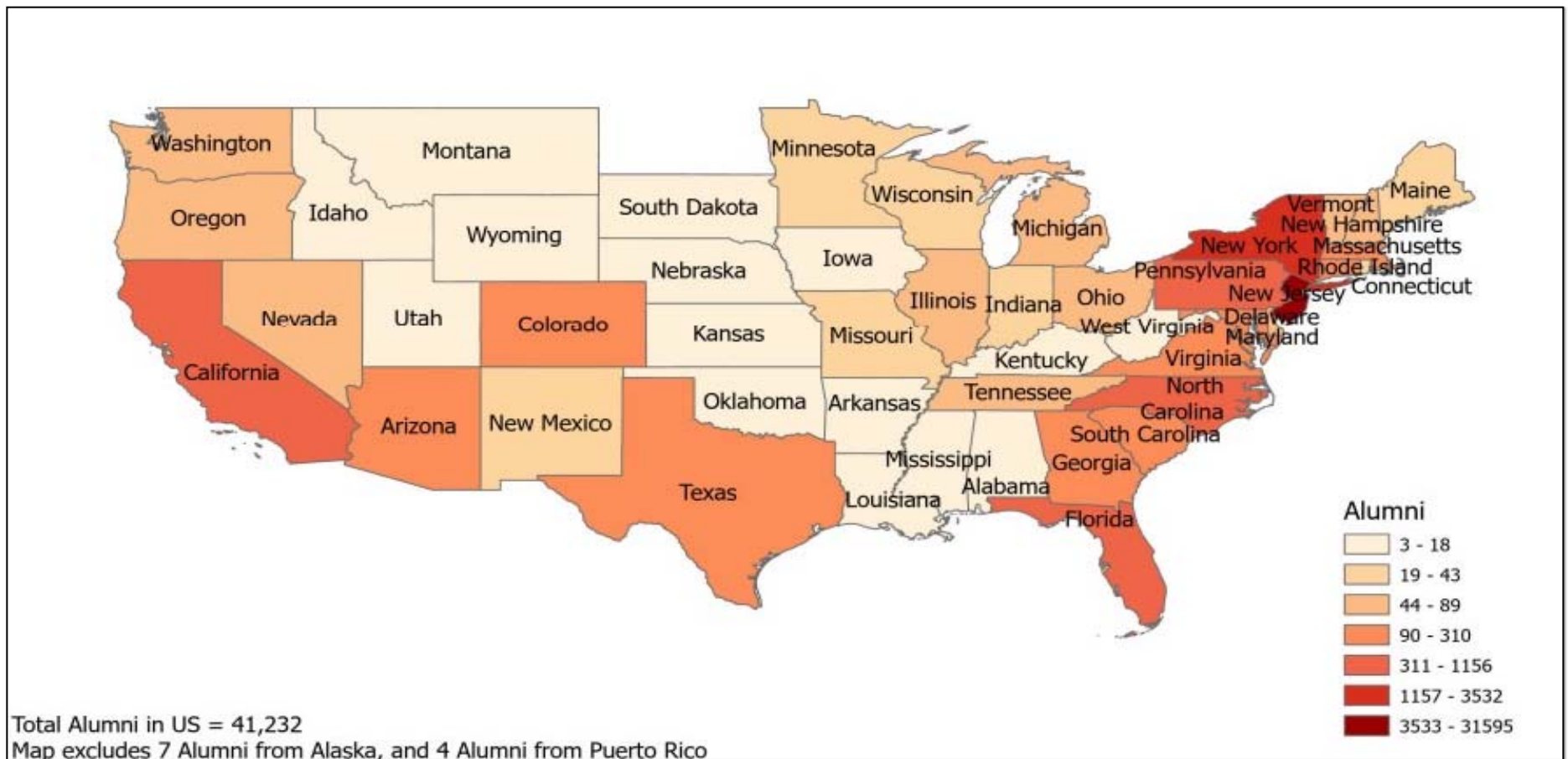

RAMAPO ALUMNI IN COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY - FALL 2024

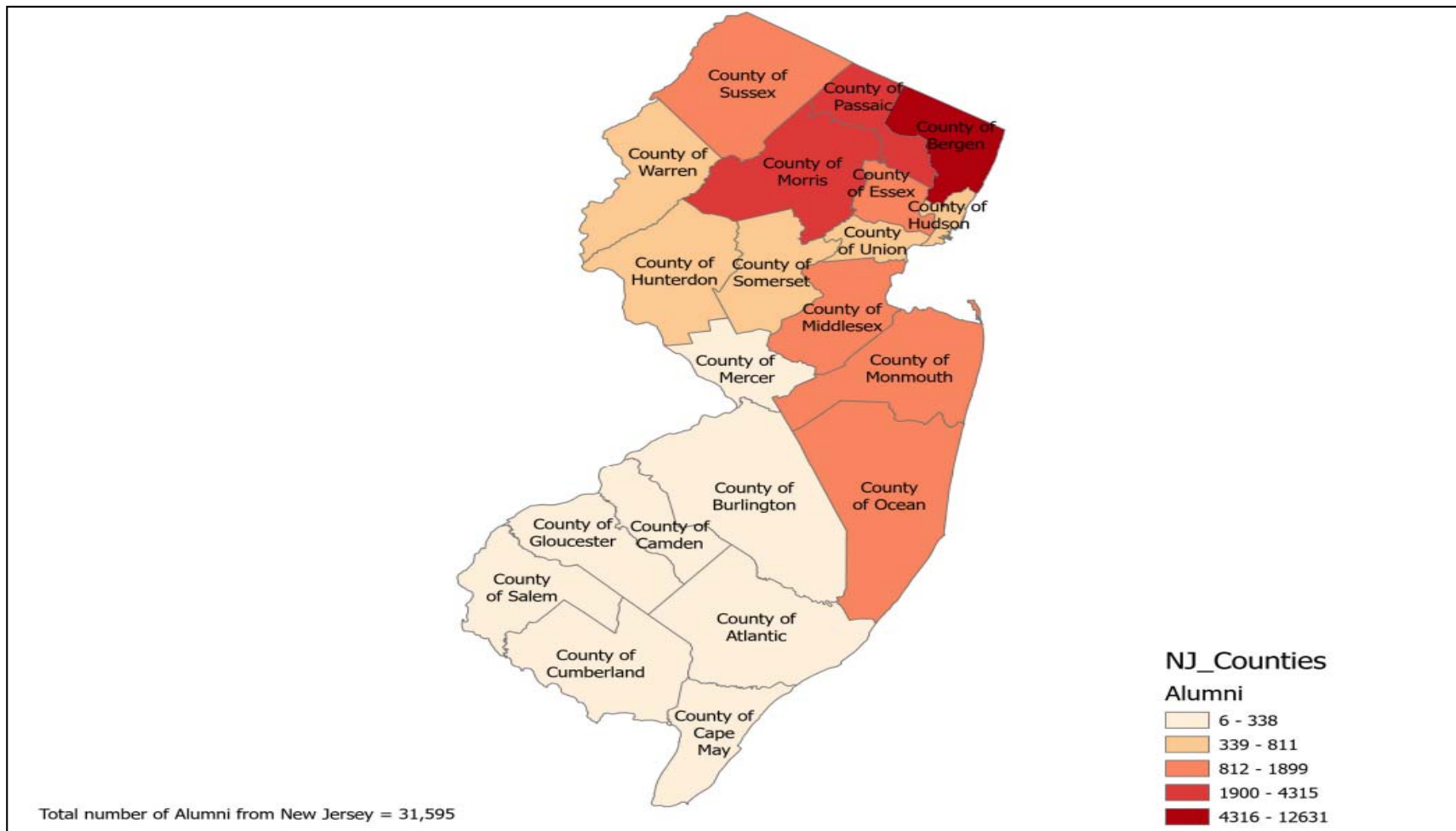

FULL-TIME FACULTY BY SCHOOL, FALL 2024



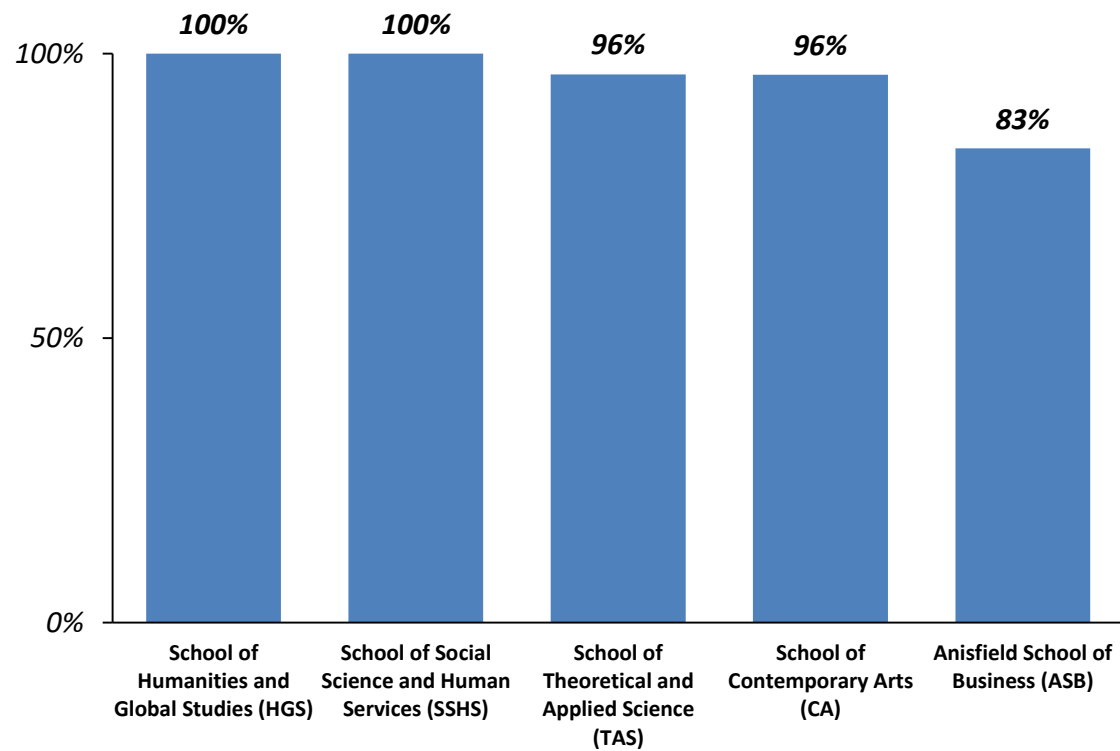

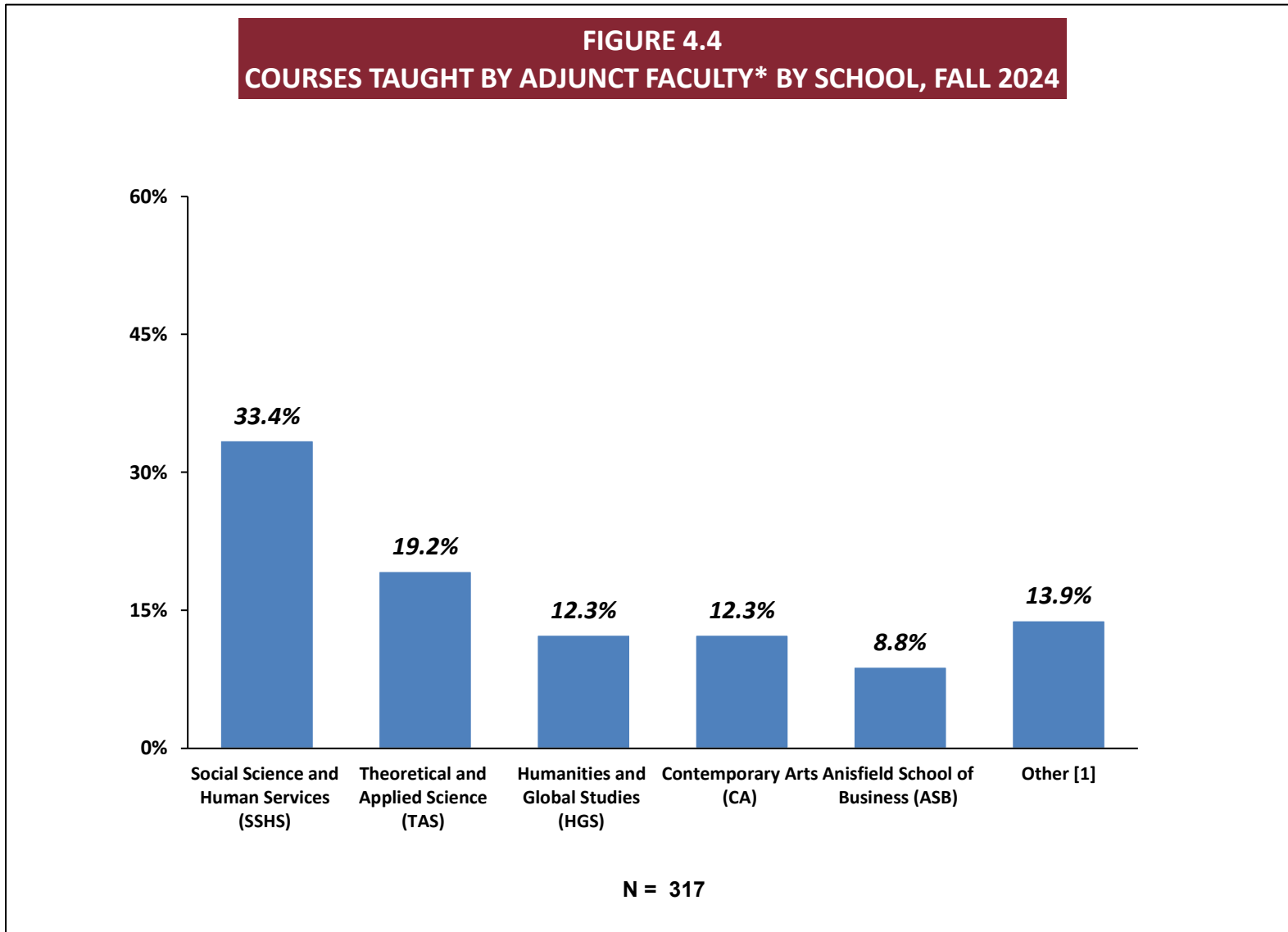

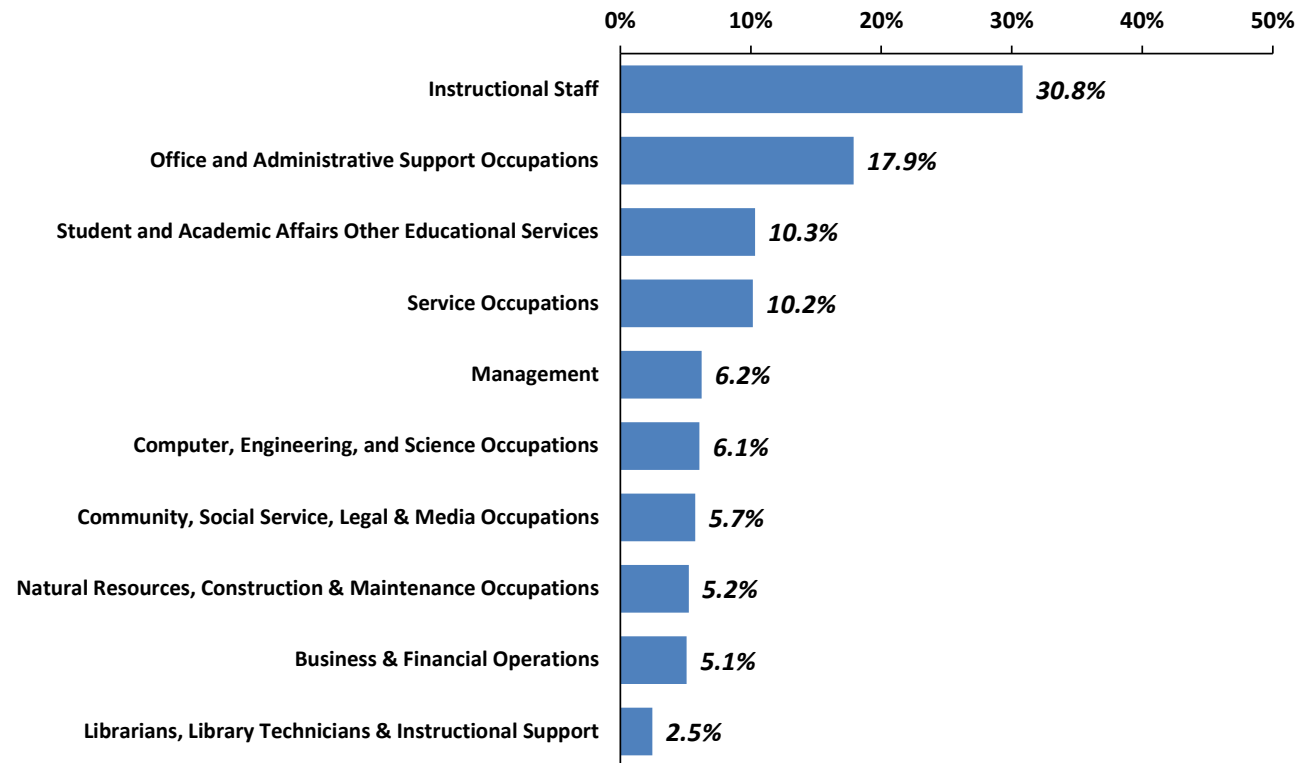

EMPLOYMENT CATEGORIES* FOR FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES, FALL 2024



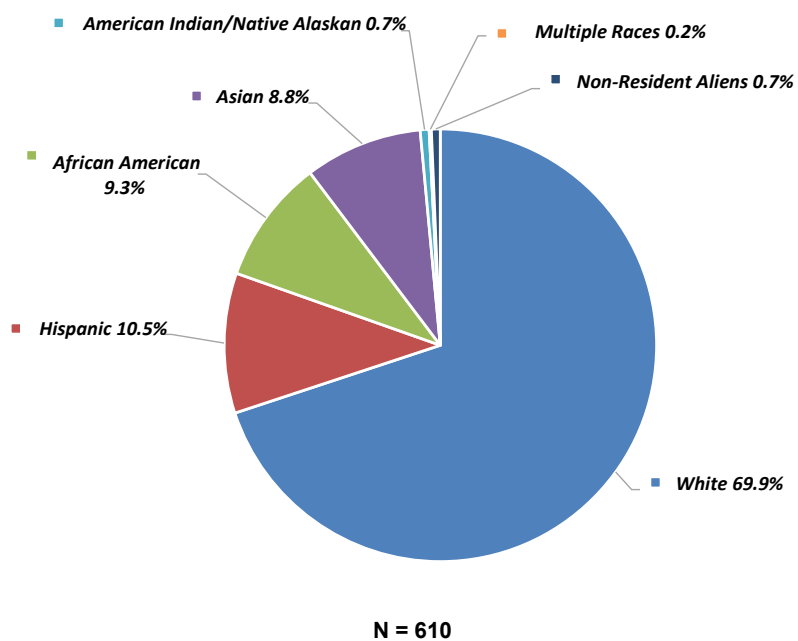

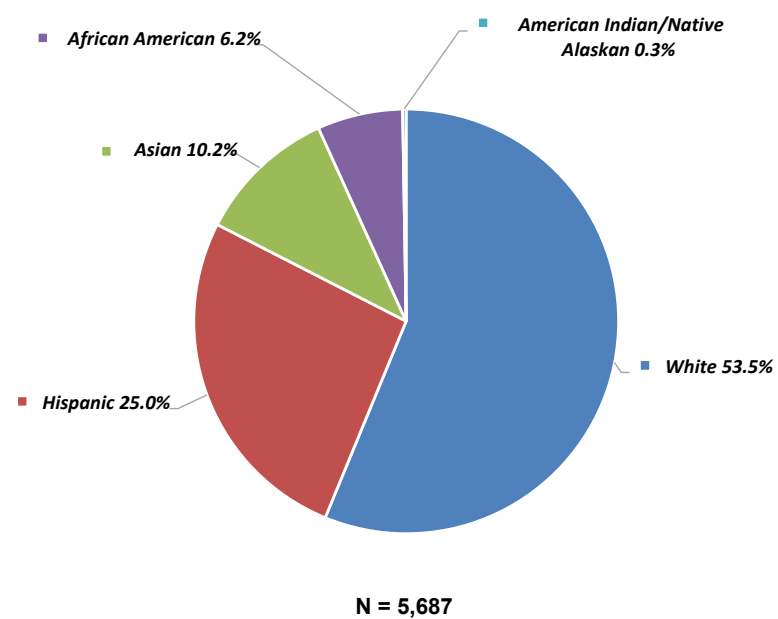

ALL ENROLLED STUDENTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY, FALL 2024

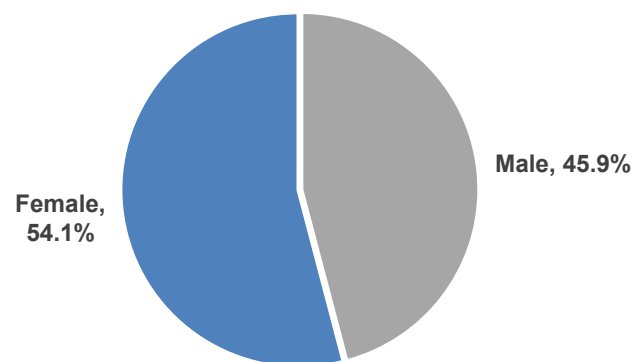

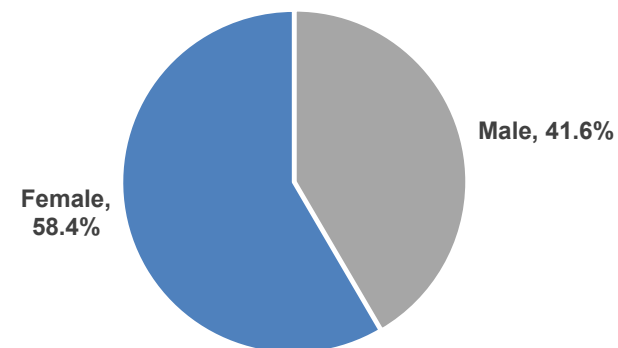

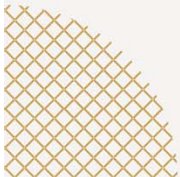

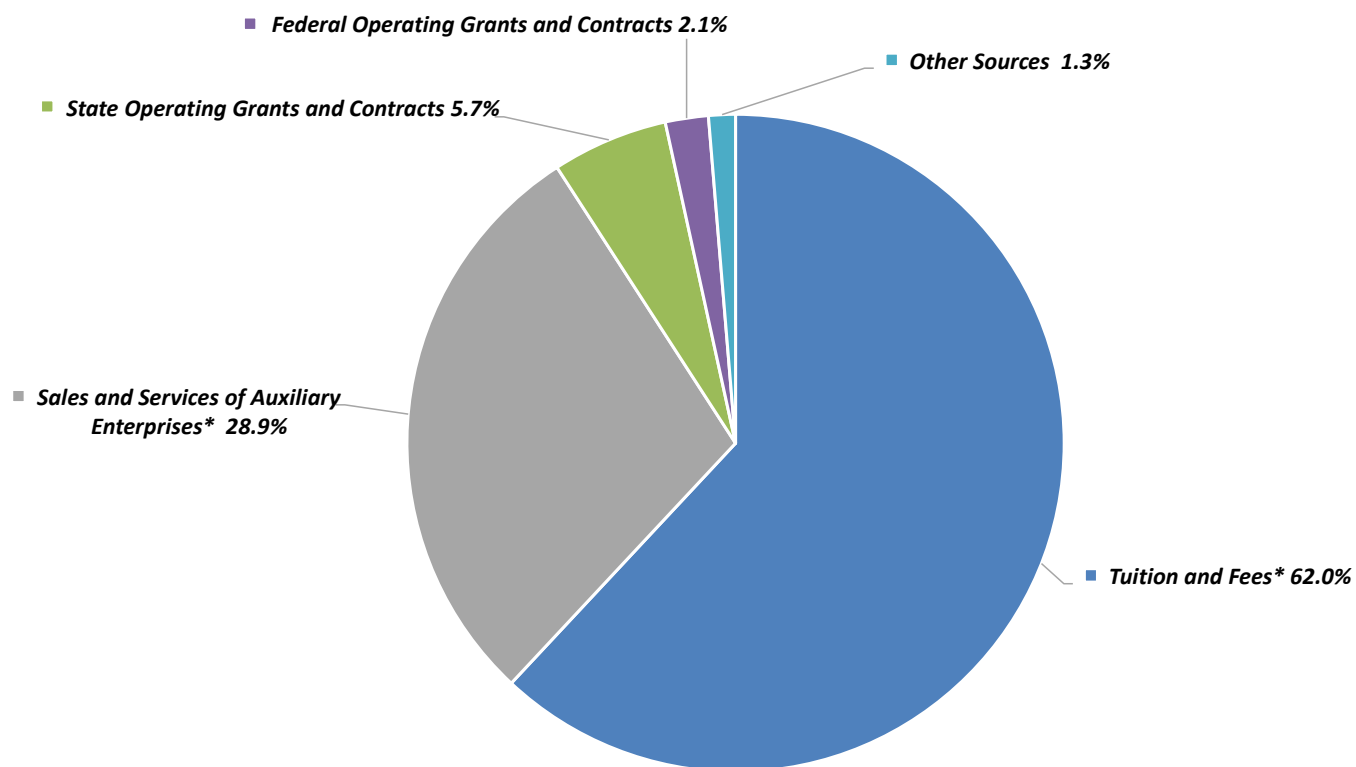
- From FY23 to FY24, the College's total operating revenue increased by 12.7% and expenses increased by 14.5% . **(Table 5.1, p. 180)**

OPERATING EXPENSES BY CATEGORIES, FISCAL YEAR 2024

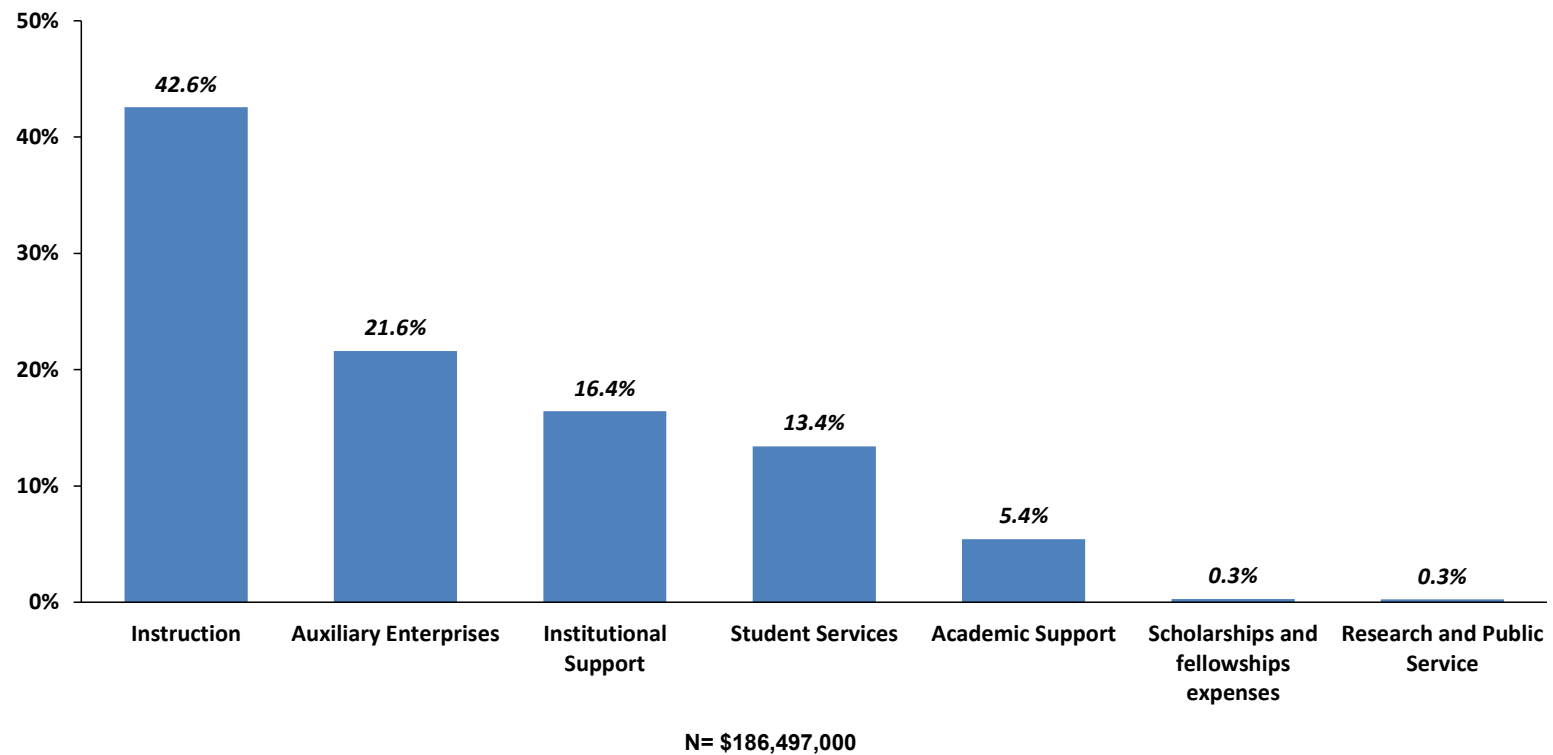

FISCAL YEAR 2020-2024

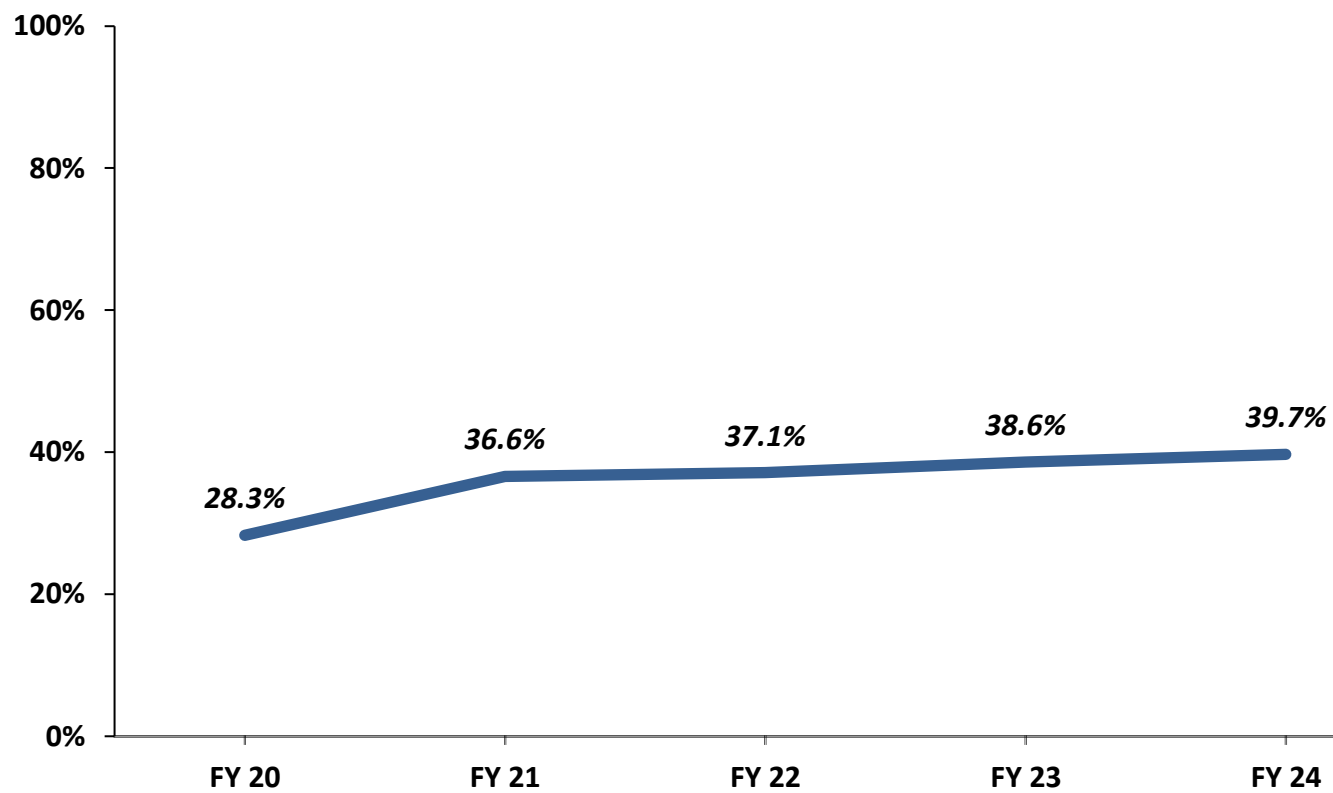

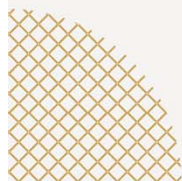

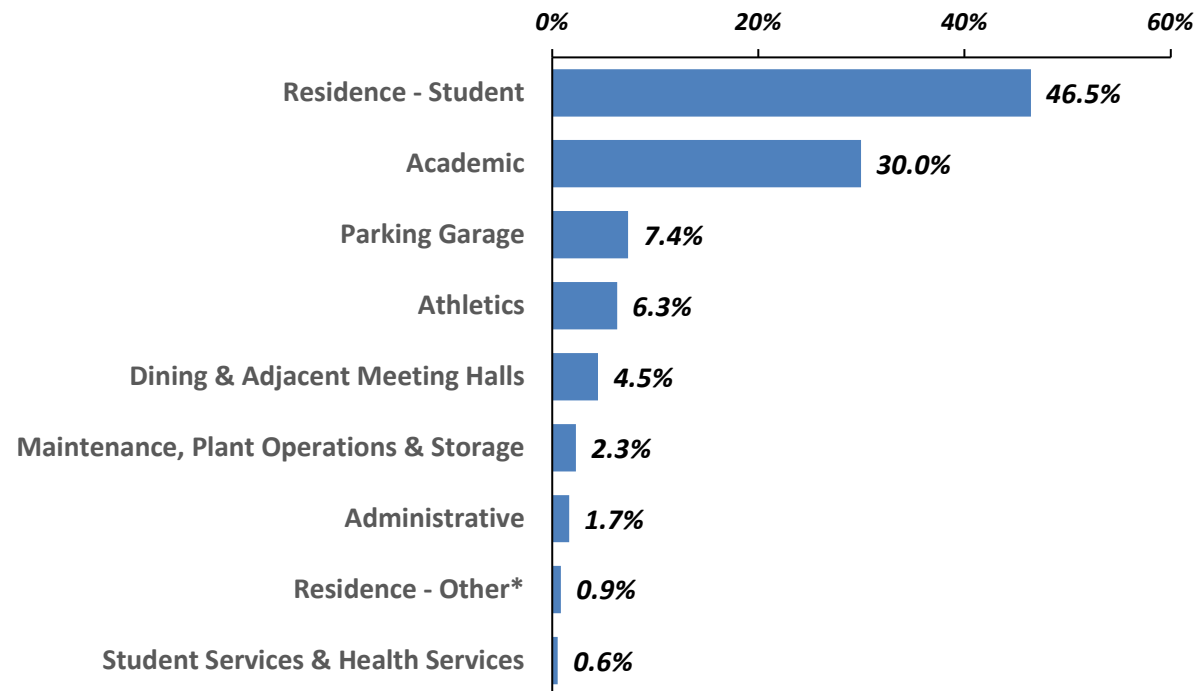


Executive Summary

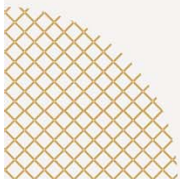

DIRECTIONS TO RAMAPO COLLEGE OF NEW JERSEY

FROM THE NORTH

USING ROUTE 17

Follow Route 17 South (approximately 1.5 miles from Suffern exit on N.Y. State Thruway). Turn right at Route 202 exit. At end of exit ramp, turn left (Route 202 South). Continue on Route 202 approximately one mile to light. Campus entrance is on left.

USING NY STATE THRUWAY

Take N.Y. State Thruway (I-87) South to Route 287 South (New Jersey), exit 15 (Suffern) onto Route 17 South. Follow directions for "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM ORANGE COUNTY USING ROUTE 17

Follow directions above "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM WESTCHESTER AND ROCKLAND COUNTIES

Follow Route 287 West over the Mario M. Cuomo Bridge (a.k.a. the Tappan Zee Bridge) to Route 17 South. Follow directions above for "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM THE EAST

Follow Route 80 or Route 4 to Route 17 North. Follow Route 17 North. Follow directions below for "From the South, Using Route 17."

FROM THE WEST

Follow Route 80 East to Route 287 North to Mahwah exit 66 (south on Route 17 to 202 South).

FROM NEW YORK CITY

Take the George Washington Bridge, Route 4 West to Route 17 North to 202 South.

FROM CONNECTICUT

Follow I-95 to Route 287 West over the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge (a.k.a. the Tappan Zee Bridge), continue to exit 15 (Suffern) onto Route 17 South. Follow directions above "From the North, Using Route 17."

FROM THE SOUTH

USING ROUTE 17

Follow Route 17 North to Mahwah to exit sign "202 Suffern/Morristown" on right. At the end of the short exit ramp turn left (Route 202 South). Continue on Route 202 to light. Campus entrance is on left.

USING GARDEN STATE PARKWAY

Leave Parkway at exit 163. Follow directions above for "From the North, Using Route 17."

USING ROUTE 208

Follow Route 208 North until Route 202 in Oakland. Continue north on 202 until first light in Mahwah. Campus entrance is on the right.

USING ROUTE 287

Take Route 287 North to exit 66 (Mahwah); follow Route 17 South to Route 202 exit. At the end of the exit ramp make left turn (202 South). Continue on Route 202 to light. Campus entrance is on left.

USING NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE

Take N.J. Turnpike (I-95 North) to end (exit 18W or 18E). Continue North to Route 80 West to Route 17 North. Follow directions above "From the North, Using Route 17."
