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

Chapter 1: New Students



Executive Summary

- In Fall 2025, enrollment of students pursuing a second BA rose by 121% (N=42). **(Table 1.2, p. 8)**
- Regular-admit, first-time, full-time degree-seeking students submitted the highest combined SAT score to date (1220). **(Table 1.3, p. 10)**
- Hispanic enrollment among first-time degree-seeking students has shown strong growth, increasing 69% since 2021 and 20% in 2024. **(Table 1.4.2, p. 12).**
- Despite accounting for only 6.8% of all first-time degree-seeking students, out-of-state enrollment increased by 167%, rising from 28 students in 2021 to 75 students in 2025. **(Table 1.5, p. 16)**
- 50% of incoming students were first-generation college students. **(Figure 1.9a, p. 17)**
- Entering transfer enrollment has shown steady growth, rising from 356 students in 2021 to 405 in 2025. **(Figure 1.10, p. 22)**
- Among entering graduate students, 76% were female. **(Table 1.15.1, p. 51)**
- The Master of Social Work program is the only graduate program to observe growth in the enrollment of first time students since 2024. **(Table 1.16, p. 53)**



FALL 2016 - FALL 2025





New Undergraduate Applicants from US with a valid address = 9632



New Undergraduate Admits from US with a valid address = 6744



NEW UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLED BY ZIP CODE FROM NORTH-EAST USA: FALL 2025




New Undergraduate Enrolled from USA = 1099

Newly Enrolled Students from New Jersey = 1023



RACE/ETHNIC CATEGORIES BY SEX OF ALL FIRST-TIME DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS , FALL 2025





ENROLLMENT OF FIRST-TIME DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENTS BY SCHOOL, FALL 2025



OF ENTERING TRANSFER STUDENTS, FALL 2016 - FALL 2025













NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED FROM COUNTIES OF NEW JERSEY: FALL 2025






Executive Summary


- In 2025, Ramapo College’s undergraduate enrollment reached a five-year high of 5,492 students. In contrast, graduate enrollment fell to 529 students—its second lowest level in the past five years. **(Figures 2.1 and 2.2, pp. 58–59)**
- Undergraduate enrollment shows the strongest sustained growth from Hudson, Sussex, and Union counties, while the most notable undergraduate declines are observed in Camden and Monmouth counties. For graduate enrollment, the strongest sustained growth comes from Hudson and Sussex counties, whereas the most significant declines are seen in Bergen and Somerset counties. **(Table 2.10, pp.72-73.)**
- From 2024 to 2025, the number of Hispanic undergraduate students rose by 10.4%, and the number of Hispanic graduate students rose by 11.5%. **(Tables 2.5.1 and 2.5.2 ,pp. 65-66)**
- Despite a 12.5% decline from 2024 to 2025, the number of unclassified/non-degree-seeking students increased 67.3% over the four-year period from 2021 to 2025. **(Tables 2.6 and 2.12, pp. 68, 79)**
- International student enrollment declined sharply, dropping 35% from 2021 to 2025 across undergraduate and graduate populations, and 9% from 2024 to 2025, reaching a new low of 39 students in 2025. **(Table 2.7, p. 69)**
- Veteran student enrollment, while representing just 1.5% of the student body in 2025, has shown steady growth, increasing 62.5% since 2021 and 7.1% since 2024. **(Table 2.14, p. 80)**







Total Undergraduate Students Enrolled from USA = 5475







ALL UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLED FIRST GENERATION STUDENTS, FALL 2025





Executive Summary

- The percent of full-time female faculty has consistently outpaced full-time male faculty by an annualized average of 9.5% since 2020. **(Table 4.3, p. 158)**
- The School of Theoretical and Applied Science is the only school to observe an increase in faculty headcount since 2021. **(Table 4.6, p. 161)**
- In Fall 2025, the percent of courses taught by full-time tenured or tenure-track faculty reached a five-year high of 57.4%. During this same time period, the percent of courses taught by part-time faculty reached a five-year low of 31.4% in Fall 2025. **(Table 4.12, p. 174)**











EMPLOYMENT CATEGORIES* FOR FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES, FALL 2025





FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES BY SEX, FALL 2024



