Q: What is a Pocket Park?


A: An open or green space 1-3 lots or up to 1/4 of an acre in size that provides a recreational service





A Quick Look

- Only City owned lots and parks may be adopted.
- 2. Lots may be used for community gardening or recreational purposes.
- 3. There is a \$1.00 annual fee per lot.
- 4. The Lease is valid for 2 years.
- 5. Community groups will be required to abide by the rules and regulations of the lease.
 - * attending an educational workshop,
 - * registering your garden online,
 - * providing a minimum of 20 hours of public access,
 - * participating in an annual Green Your Block program.

596 ACRES

596 Acres is the amount of vacant public land in Brooklyn. It is also a grass roots organization that is empowering local citizens to take action against vacant lots in their community. By locating all city own vacant lots, and creating a user friendly mapping tool, it is easy to find a lot, learn its status (if it has yet to be organized around or if access has been gained) along with what city agency owns the land. The website also

can connect all of the people interested in a particular lot so that they can rally together. The organization provides support and resources to individuals and groups wishing to gain access.

596 Acres also raises awareness by hanging signs out side of the lots alerting the citizens to the land resources available to them.
