

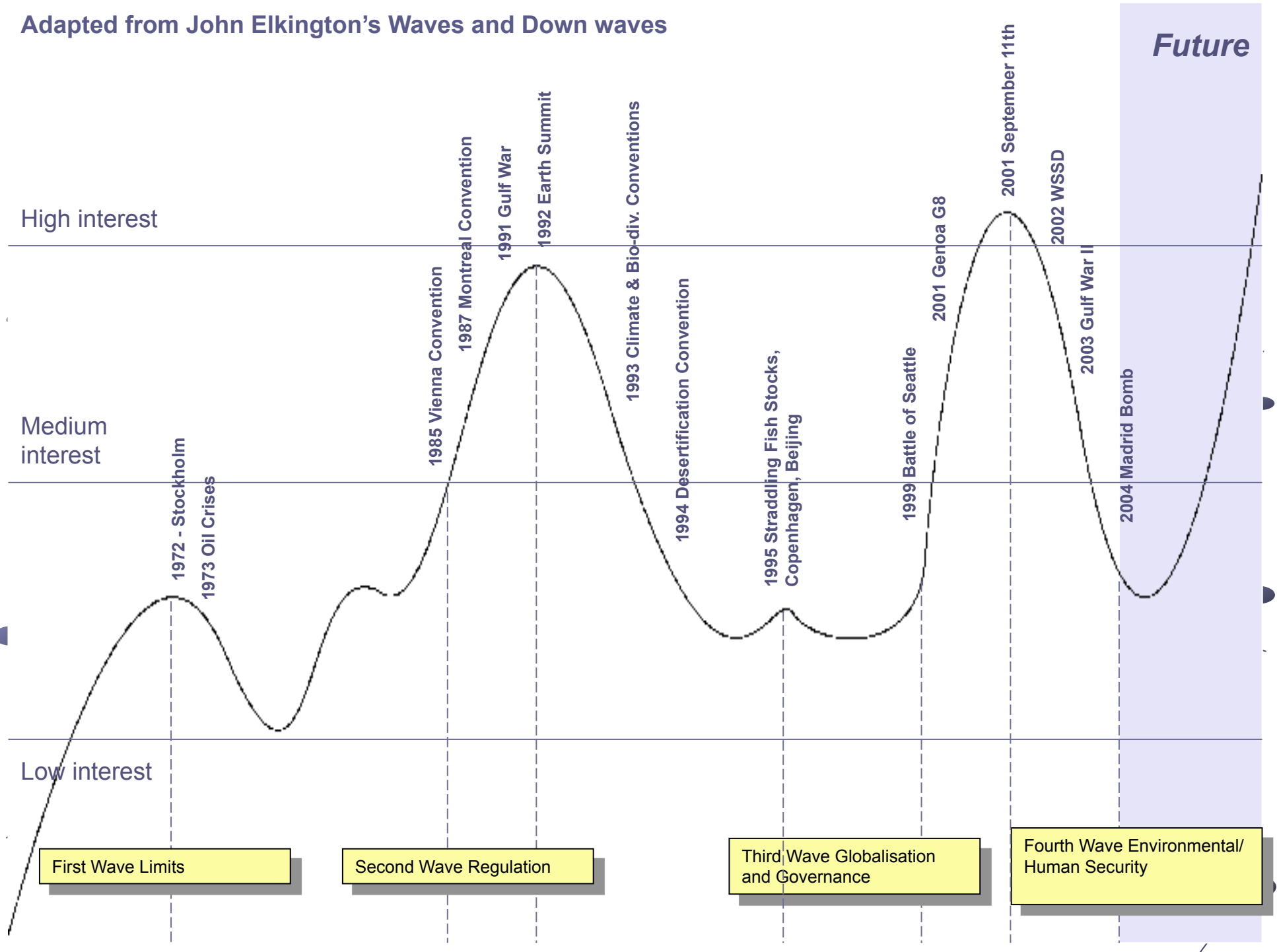

The 2015 development goals landscape

- Country Consultation (June 2012 to early 2013)
 - UN Development Group is overseeing the national consultations in over 50 developing countries
 - Beyond 2015 Coalition have produced a guidance note
 - What about developed countries?

The 2015 development goals landscape

- Secretary General's High Level panel of Eminent Persons on the Post 2015 Development Agenda
 - Three Presidents and PMs
 - Vision and shape of a post 2015 agenda for beyond 2015
 - Focus will be around the three dimensions of economic growth, social equality and environmental sustainability

Sustainable Development Goals – out of Rio+20

- Intergovernmental process

 - Link into the Widening Circle
 - Government lobbying – workshops
 - Indicators



An example

- Sustainable Energy for All to mobilize action from all sectors of society in support of three interlinked objectives to be achieved by 2030:
 - Universal access to modern energy services
 - doubling the global rate of improvement in energy efficiency; and
 - doubling the share of renewable energy in the global energy mix.

- **Global Compact:** Is likely to work with key industry coalitions such as the ICC and WBCSD to ensure that the private sector to engage in the coming process.
- **UN Agencies and Programmes:** Many of the potential goals have UN Agencies or Programmes who will become advocates for them. Linking with them is a critical way of building larger coalitions.
