History

"Last year, at the UN DPI Conference held in Bonn, I warned the international community that Rio+20 could easily turn into a funeral ceremony of sustainable development. Sensing threats to the real issues on sustainable development, I urged the global civil society to step out of their fragmentation and act collectively and proactively using Rio +20 as a platform."

... to avoid a Historical Mistake

- Failure at Rio+20 cannot be accepted
- failure of the official process should not become an obstacle towards successful evolving of a global movement to lead the transition towards sustainable futures on earth.
- Civil Society should not make the historical mistake of simply be reactive to a UNCSD Rio+20 outcome negotiated by governments within the UN system.
- Civil Society should state clearly their aspirations for a sustainable world and propose the recommended pathways.
- Given the urgent need for radical reform in our behavior on earth, and knowing that official outcome cannot deliver such a change, Civil Society needs to come together to bring forward the peoples' agenda.

Fragmentation

- From 1992 to 2012 the fragmentation in civil society has increased tremendously
- The politics of mistrust was openly visible during Rio+20 preparations
- Divisions were open and lack of interest to build common platforms were obvious
- Self interests greater than the cause

The Challenge

- To challenge the fragmentation
- To offer a common platform for all to contribute (not some selected – not just the like minded)
- To reach out to those who were left out of the Rio+20 process
- To bring together those who were already in the process
- To ensure freedom and independence of action
- To provide hope of an alternative "ANOTHER FUTURE IS POSSIBLE"

The Idea

- Peoples' Sustainability Treaties were proposed as a series of independent collective agreements produced by civil society representatives.
- An alternative content outcome by civil society to reflect the public interest and aspirations of a sustainable world
- To serve as collection of proposals to influence governments negotiating for official outcomes at the Summit.
- Essentially, the process will lead towards advancing a Global Movement to ensure sustainable futures

The Initiative

- People's Sustainability Treaties are a series of independent collective agreements produced by people in parallel to the official UNCSD2012.
- It was planned as the alternative content outcome by people at Rio+20 and will serve as collection of proposals for governments negotiating for official outcomes.
- The treaties are considered as a complimentary process to strengthen the People's Summit Rio+20 organised by the Brazilian civil society and all other independent efforts towards creating people's visions and voices.
- The treaties are essentially a forward looking process and targets a future beyond Rio+20 and will become a living document towards the transition to a sustainable world order.

Chaos in Rio

- Compared to the Global Forum organized by the International NGO Forum in 1992 at the first Earth Summit, this was a sad show of how fragmented the civil society has become.
- The so called Rio+20 Peoples Summit, hijacked by a Brazilian NGO Organising Committee, was a chaotic demonstration that lead to thousands of civil society representatives from across the world being stranded and lost without any sense of direction or coordination.

Maneuvering through Chaos

- We had a clear objective being proactive
- We had a source of inspiration people
- We had hope the treaties were a reality
- We had a platform more than a dozen events
- We had a team committed to serve the cause
- We had leadership Determine CSO leaders
- We had Inspiration with great following at Rio +20
- We had hope all came together and started believing

OUTCOME – A Manifesto at Rio+20

- Representatives of treaty circles and those who wanted to wanted to contribute converged at the Rio+20 to launch a Manifesto on the final day of the summit.
- They declared that another world is possible after Rio+20 and pledged their commitment to a transition toward increasingly sustainable futures on earth.
- The signatories to this Manifesto refused to sit idly by in the face of another failure of governments to provide hope for a sustainable future for all.
- This manifesto calls for action that helps move simultaneously toward a more localized socio-economic structure and toward a supra-national mindset that helps us transcend the parochial concerns of a corporatecapitalistic globalization to activate a global citizens movement.

Committing to Our Own Future

 They announced their own responsibility for undertaking actions, inviting and encourage similar actions and commitments by other rightsholders and stakeholders, communicating a vision for healthy communities, sustainable and equitable human wellbeing and its associated strategies, and coming together in the form of a global citizen's movement to shepherd the transition to a sustainable, equitable, and democratic future.
