WILL PRESENT ON AUTHORS WOOLF AND MORRISON AT  
ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE**

MAHWAH – Four undergraduate students enrolled in the School of American and International Studies at Ramapo College of New Jersey will present papers at the International Virginia Woolf Conference at Fordham University in New York City in June. The conference attracts Woolf scholars and graduate students.

Tracey Spinato of Mahwah will speak on “*Imprints of Colonialism in Woolf and Morrison.*” Gretchen Kaser of Hillsdale will speak on “*Memory and the Past in Woolf and Morrison.*” Elyse Wunschel of Harrington Park will speak on “*Fire and Water in the Novels of Toni Morrison and Virginia Woolf.*” Kristen Moledo of Middletown will speak on “*Loss and Healing in Beloved and To the Lighthouse.*”

The students were enrolled in a literature course, “*Woolf and Morrison Major Authors,*” taught by Professor Lisa Williams last fall. The papers will be part of a panel, “*An Undergraduate Course Looks at Virginia Woolf and Toni Morrison,*” chaired by Williams.
