Poet Aja Monet to Perform at Ramapo College for Women's History Month

Her graduate thesis, *Scared to Make Love/Scared Not To*, was her first compilation of music and poetry.

Monet published her first book of poetry, The Black Unicorn Sings in 2010 and collaborated in 2012 with poet/musician Saul Williams on *Chorus: A Literary Mixtape*.
