## Foundation pledges to raise \$31,000 in 31 days

MAHWAH, N.J. – The Ramapo College Foundation has joined #GivingTuesday, a global day of giving that harnesses the collective power of individuals, communities and organizations to encourage philanthropy and to celebrate generosity worldwide.
