Readings at Ramapo Visiting Writers Series Welcomes Award-Winning Author Uzodinma Iweala

MAHWAH, N.J. -- Award-winning author and noted physician Uzodinma Iweala will be at Ramapo College on Monday, February 29 as part of the Readings at Ramapo Visiting Writers Series. Iweala will discuss his works, including his 2005 novel, *Beasts of No Nation*, the harrowing story of a child soldier in a war-torn African country who is recruited into a unit of guerrilla fighters.

The event is in the Trustees Pavilion at 7 p.m., and is free and open to the public.

Beasts of No Nation, which was made into a feature film and premiered on Netflix in 2015, won numerous awards including the John Llwellyn Rhys Prize for Best First Novel, the American Academy of Arts and Letters Sue Kaufman Prize, among others, and was selected as a *New York Times* Notable Book.

Iweala was born in Washington, D.C., and attended Harvard University. He later graduated from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons and is currently a fellow at the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard University.
