MAHWAH, N.J. -- Clubs and organizations of Ramapo College, along with numerous members of the Athletic Department, joined forces with Special Olympics New Jersey on Saturday, April 30 for a special track and field event on the College campus.

More than 30 athletes, including children and adults with intellectual disabilities from across New Jersey, participated in a track and field competition through Special Olympics New Jersey, an organization dedicated to bringing pride into the lives of all involved.

An estimated 70 students and staff volunteers from the College helped organize and run the inaugural event. "To see the smiles and excitement of the athletes, as well as the appreciation and sincerity of our volunteers, it was truly overwhelming," said Miyah Meadows, volunteer coordinator.

In 2011, the Special Olympics joined forces with the NCAA Division III Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the sole purpose of "enhancing the lives of Division III student-athletes and Special Olympics athletes through a mutual learning experience; provide a platform for recognition of Special Olympics athletes and Division III student-athletes within their communities; and raise awareness of Special Olympics, its programs and services."

Events on this special day provided the opportunity for numerous members of the Ramapo College community to give back and also showcase their own abilities to lead and work as a team, essential for life after college. From the opening ceremony to the closing and awards presentation, it was a day filled with fun, laughter and some exciting competition.
