MAHWAH, N.J. -- Ramapo College of New Jersey is now serving as the full-time host of the Bergen County office of the New Jersey Small Business Development Center (NJSBDC). Ramapo College has been an affiliate partner of the 12-center program for the past two years. The Center is located at the College's Anisfield School of Business, 505 Ramapo Valley Road, Mahwah, N.J.
