Presentation on 'Bubblenomics' Explores Impact on Financial Health in U.S.

MAHWAH, N.J. – "Bubblenomics" and the impact of these sudden fluctuations in the financial markets will be the topic of a presentation by Professor Murray Sabrin on Wednesday, November 15 in Friends Hall at Ramapo College. The event, presented by the Sabrin Center for Free Enterprise and Anisfield School of Business, begins at 7:30 p.m. and is free and open to the public.

Sabrin, Professor of Finance at the College, will present the results of his sabbatical research which challenges the conventional wisdom about money, banking and the Federal Reserve as guardian of the economy's health. He also will discuss when the next financial crisis is likely to occur.

Sabrin has been a member of the faculty since 1985. He has a Ph.D. in economic geography, an M.A. in social studies education, and a B.A. in history, geography and social studies. He has worked in commercial real estate sales, personal portfolio management and economic research.

Sabrin is the author of numerous business and academic articles, the book "Tax Free 2000: the Rebirth of American Liberty," and blogs at www.murraysabrin.com. His three documentaries about the Federal Reserve, the income tax, and Medicare and Medicaid can be viewed at Sabrin Films on YouTube.
