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## Teachers Workshop to Focus on Using Film to Teach about the Holocaust and Genocide

Raising such issues can very well lead to a deeper understanding about the genesis of genocide and aid in their prevention.

Professor Jeffrey Shandler of Rutgers University will deliver the keynote lecture, *Film in Teaching about the Holocaust and Genocide*. Heather Lutz of Pascack Hills High School in her presentation, *"Reading in the Dark": Multimodal Literacy in Teaching about the Holocaust and Genocide*, will provide hands-on guidance to workshop attendees on how best to apply the use of film in the classroom.

The workshop will conclude with Ms. Bella Miller, who will relate her experiences during the Holocaust.
