Undergraduate Credit Load

Fall and Spring Matriculated Undergraduate Students

Fall and Spring

A matriculated student who wishes to register for more than 18 credits per semester (at additional cost) must request that the Office of the Registrar raise their credit limit. If the student has under a 3.0 cumulative GPA, that student must obtain approval to raise the credit limit from their academic advisor prior to making the request to the Office of the Registrar. If the student is attempting to register for more than 20 credits, they must obtain approval from their school Dean. Undergraduate students on academic probation should discuss their credit loads with their academic advisor prior to registration.

Fall and Spring Non-Degree Seeking Students

Non-degree seeking students are limited to a maximum of 11 credits per semester for a total of 30 cumulative credits, at which point they may not continue unless they matriculate prior to registration.

Summer

Students may register for a maximum of two<u>courses or</u> 8 credits per session for a maximum of 16 credits for the entire Summer Session. Permission to enroll for more than the maximum noted above may be approved by the assigned advisor or the dean of the school in which the student is majoring.

Winter

Students (matriculated and non-degree seeking) may register for a maximum of one <u>course or</u> 4 credits <u>per in the Winter</u> session. Permission to <u>enroll register</u> for more than the maximum noted above may be approved by the <u>assigned advisor or the dD</u>ean.<u>-of the school in which the student</u> is majoring in or their designee.

<u>Summer</u>

Students may register for a maximum of 10 credits per session for a maximum of 20 credits for the entire Summer Session. Permission to register for more than the maximum noted above may be approved by the Dean of the school in which the student is majoring in or their designee.

Visiting Non-Degree Matriculated Seeking Undergraduate Students:

Non-degree-matriculated seeking students who are visiting from other accredited colleges may enroll-register for a maximum of more than 11 credits per semester with the exception of only 4 credits in the Winter session. Students may register for a total of 30 cumulative credits, at which point they may not continue unless they matriculate prior to registration.

Non-Matriculated Visiting Students from other accredited institutions may register for more than <u>11 credits per semester</u>-if they present a Visiting Student form, (completed by the home institution,) which verifies good academic standing, advisor approval of courses, and the home institution's raised seal.

Post-Baccalaureate Non-Degree Seeking Students:

Non-<u>degree matriculated students who seeking students who</u> already possess a bachelor's degree may <u>enroll-register</u> for more than 11 credits per semester <u>as well</u>.

Graduate Student Credit Load

Matriculated Graduate Students

Each graduate program director will recommend to the <u>dD</u>ean of the <u>sechool</u> that houses the program the maximum number of credits per semester or cohort term<u>and will be posted to</u> program's <u>Catalog page</u>. The <u>dD</u>ean will communicate that decision to the Registrar.

- 1. Permission to exceed the credit load limit must be secured from the Graduate Program Director, who will communicate the information to the Registrar.
- 2. Graduate students on academic probation should discuss their credit loads with their Graduate Program Directors prior to registration.
- 3.2. Graduate students with student loans should discuss their Graduate students should discuss credit loads with the Office of Financial Aid prior to registering when the exceed the limit.
- 4.3. Non-degree students may only take up to eight 8 credits of graduate level courses. before they must matriculate.
- 5.4. Current Ramapo undergraduates not enrolled in a graduate program can take up to <u>eight-8</u> credits of graduate level courses. To take additional courses, students must <u>be enrolled in the 4+1 undergraduate/graduate programs.obtain</u> the approval of the Graduate Program Director associated with that course.

Exceptions to any of the above policy items require approval from the Dean.
