General Education courses can be done in any order with the exception of INTD 101, CRWT and MATH. Those three general education courses will need to be done first. First Year Seminar is taken in the first semester. Failure to complete CRWT and MATH will result in a hold when the student hits 64 credits. The following general education courses can be done in any order. For more info on these courses, please visit the General Education program requirements website in the College Catalog:

- Social Science Inquiry (SOSC 110) [+W]
- Scientific Reasoning
- Historical Perspectives (ARHT 245-Masterpieces of Western Civ) [+W]
- Studies in the Arts & Humanities (CRWT 102 is a prerequisite to this course) [+W]
- Global Awareness (ARHT 204-Introduction to Global Art Traditions (Spring only))[+W]
- Distribution Category (Must be outside of CA)
- Distribution Category

+W: Students transferring in with 48 or more credits are waived from these general education requirements.

**Note:** Three writing intensive courses are required in the major and/or school core (examples are marked by WI designation in the plan above).

\*These courses are major requirements that will double count for the GenEd, BUT only two courses in the major are allowed to double count. If you have already double counted two courses in the major for the GenEd category, you will NEED to select another course for the GenEd.
