General Education courses can be done in any order with the exception of INTD 101, CRWT and MATH. Those three general education courses will need to be done first. First Year Seminar is taken in the first semester. Failure to complete CRWT and MATH will result in a hold when the student hits 64 credits. The following general education courses can be done in any order. For more info on these courses, please visit the <u>General Education program requirements website in the College Catalog</u>:

- Social Science Inquiry (SOSC 110) [+W]
- Scientific Reasoning (BIOL 101 recommended)

- Historical Perspectives [+W]
- Studies in the Arts & Humanities (CRWT 102 is a prerequisite to this course) [+W]
- Global Awareness (LITR 203: Methods of Literary Study) [+W]
- Distribution Category (Social Systems & Society **OR** Culture & Creativity **OR** Values and Ethics) (**Must be outside of HGS**)
- Distribution Category (Culture & Creativity: (Consider LITR 220, 221, 224, 244, 245, 280, 284, 292, 293, 295, or 308 to fulfill a LITR requirement)
- +W: Students transferring in with 48 or more credits are waived from these general education requirements.

At least three (3) courses in the major must be at the 300-level.

- *If Needed; as few as zero or as many as three courses may be needed to fulfill the Language requirement.
- **These courses are major requirements that will double count for the GenEd, BUT only two courses in the major are allowed to double count. If you have already double counted two courses in the major for the GenEd category, you will NEED to select another course for the GenEd.

WI- Writing intensive courses needed prior to graduation
