Teacher Education Program Admissions:

Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 as mandated by the NJDOE for teacher certification.

Ideally, students should be fully admitted into the program by the end of their first year at Ramapo; transfer students before their first semester registration.

Early advising with the TE program is recommended for admissions requirements.

Full admission to the TE program is required before registering for EDUC 222.

It's recommended to take EDUC 211, EDUC 222, and EDUC 360 in separate semesters due to clinical experience hours.

Clinical experience hours occur outside of regular class time.

Health and Physical Education Content Requirements

Students must meet all New Jersey Department of Education requirements for certification at the time of program completion, including a minimum of 30 credits in Health with at least 12 credits at the 300 level or higher, and at least 15 credits in Physical Education, and should refer to guidance from the Teacher Education Program.

Clinical Experience (CE):

CE1 (EDUC 211): 22 hours in an urban public school.

CE2 (EDUC 222): 20 hours in a public school; TE program admission required prior to registration.

Clinical Practice (CP):

A full academic year of Clinical Practice is required by the state. Ramapo's model is Fall-Spring: 180 hours in the fall, 525 hours in the spring (Clinical Practice Capstone).

Students are responsible for transportation to clinical experiences and practice. Consult the TE program if transportation is an issue.

General Education courses can be done in any order with the exception of INTD 101, CRWT and MATH. Those three general education courses will need to be done first. First Year Seminar is taken in the first semester. Failure to complete CRWT and MATH will result in a hold when the student hits 64 credits. The following general education courses can be done in any order. For more info on these courses, please visit the <u>General Education program requirements website in the College Catalog</u>:

- Social Science Inquiry (SOSC 110)
- Scientific Reasoning
- Historical Perspectives [+W]
- Studies in the Arts & Humanities (*CRWT 102 is a prerequisite to this course*) [+W]
- Global Awareness [+W]
- Distribution Category (Social Systems & Society OR Culture & Creativity OR Values and Ethics) (Must be outside of SSHS)
- Distribution Category
