- Studies in the Arts & Humanities (CRWT 102 is a prerequisite to this course) [+W]
- Global Awareness (LAWS 201-Global Legal Order (Recommended)) [+W]
- Distribution Category (Social Systems & Society OR Culture & Creativity) (Must be outside of SSHS)
- Distribution Category (Values & Ethics) (LAWS 210 Law, Justice, and Morality (Recommended))*

^{*}These courses are major requirements that will double count for the GenEd, BUT only two courses in the major are allowed to double count. If you have already double counted two courses in the major for the GenEd category, you will NEED to select another course for the GenEd.

⁺W: Students transferring in with 48 or more credits are waived from these general education requirements.
