- +W: Students transferring in with 48 or more credits are waived from these general education requirements.
- * Students may take 18 credits without additional tuition.
- ** Students can participate in an ensemble each semester.
- *** Incoming music majors must take Musicianship placement test to determine appropriate placement. If a student scores 74 or below on this test, take MUSI 121-Music Fundamentals in first term and proceed with the Musicianship sequence thereafter.
- **** Many 200-level Music and Culture courses count for the Gen Ed category of Culture and Creativity (CC); check the Catalog.
- ***** Many students in the Music Industry concentration also enroll in the Business Essentials Certificate program conducted by the Anisfield School of Business.
