General Education courses can be done in any order with the exception of INTD 101, CRWT and MATH. Those three general education courses will need to be done first. First Year Seminar is taken in the first semester. Failure to complete CRWT and MATH will result in a hold when the student hits 64 credits. +W: Students transferring in with 48 or more credits are waived from these general education requirements.

LAWS core courses are offered every semester. Therefore, core courses listed for the fall can be taken in the spring, and core courses listed for the spring can be taken in the fall.
