Note: 5 writing intensive (WI) courses required: Critical Reading and Writing II and Studies in Arts and Humanities; at least three courses are taken in the major.

+ Two courses may double count in General Education and Major

**The Philosophy major strongly recommends a Study Abroad but does not require one. Up to 3 courses from outside PHIL can count into the major, including any of these courses: Africana Studies (AFST 208); Anthropology (ANTH 235); History (HIST 277 and 289); Law and Society (LAWS 210); Literature (LITR 268 and 306); Political Science (POLI 206)
