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ABOUT OUR CAMPAIGN

The purpose of this campaign is to raise awareness at Ramapo College about the difficulties veterans often face post-war. Our vision is to have both faculty and students join together and become more involved with veteran affairs at the college, and get student veterans more involved to create a veteran community on campus. We wanted to create an environment and space where veterans could feel "at home" while at school. We surveyed and talked to our student veterans and saw they wanted a lounge. It is currently set to open in Fall 2016. We hope that the lounge will serve as a place for veterans to come together to meet one another, relax in between classes, do homework, and serve as a resource center, so veterans may easily find the services they may be looking for. Lastly, through various events, we are raising funds for our non-profit partner, Heroes to Heroes Foundation.

HEROES TO HEROES

Heroes to Heroes Foundation, a non-denominational 501(c)(3) organization, provides a spiritual healing, suicide prevention, and peer support program for veterans who suffer from Moral Injury and PTSD.



Heroes to Heroes Foundation supports all combat veterans, regardless of conflict. They welcome all who are having challenges with PTSD, Moral Injury, or having challenges of returning to civilian life after serving our country.

DID YOU KNOW?

Veteran suicides occur at an alarming rate of 22 per day.

The organization approaches the goal of helping our veterans suffering with PTSD, Moral Injury and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) with structured and intense retreat-like trips to Israel. These trips focus on spirituality and peer support to allow deep emotional bonding with other American veterans suffering from the same issues, as well as Israeli veterans who are suffering in the same way. The trips create an environment where these American heroes can finally open-up and begin the healing process.

HOW OUR CAMPAIGN HELPS

Heroes to Heroes sends groups to Israel throughout the year, with 10 veterans per group. The trip costs approximately \$7,500 per veteran. The organization relies solely on donations with over 90 cents of every dollar going directly to helping these veterans. Heroes to Heroes continues to save lives with every trip and has never had a failure.

The money raised at our event has gone to the organization to help save these heroes and let them open-up and heal.


•Aside from Financial Aid services, we, as well as student veterans we have been working wit.., feel that little is done for our veterans.

•We lack in the communication and services surrounding veterans at Ramapo College. With no direct contact for Veteran Affairs, these students find themselves searching to find what they need.


•We feel that more can be done for our veterans and our goal is to change this for current and future student veterans.

• Through surveys and focus groups with our student veterans, we found what they need and want to see at Ramapo College.


"I Chose Ramapo for its Pro-Veteran Reputation"


What Word Comes to Mind When You Hear VETERAN?
