Irving Malin: "The writers of the new American Gothic are aware of tensions between the ego and the super-ego, self and society; they study the field of psychological conflict."



Final Note (Riquelme): There are mad characters and haunted spaces in Virginia Woolf's narratives (Mrs. Dalloway; "A Haunted House", & "The Death of the Moth." Toni Morrison's ghosts, as in Beloved, invite comparisons with earlier emanations in Gothic writings. In a modernist transformation of the works of Poe and other Gothic precursors, one of William Faulkner's most memorable novels, Absalom! Absalom!, concerns the fall of a house. In The Waste Land, T. S. Eliot alludes memorably to Dracula in the figure of the bats crawling upside-down down a wall.
