c. Liaison Reports

- i. Please write your name, liaison, and summary points from your report below!
- ii. Mihir (Dean of Students): Met with Dean Van Der Wall. Spoke about the commuter sign initiative started by Alan, Matthew, and David, and we were able to discuss alternatives and the next step of this initiative. The majority of our meeting however was speaking on the current events of the world and how they were influencing the student atmosphere. In addition, we spoke about the accolades the college has received at the start of this academic year. (Report)
- iii. David (ITS): ITS is working on increasing the page count from 200 pages and has been looking into the feedback from the SGA. They are issues with the payment system, but everyone will be reset to 0 pages once it is fixed. They are now going to work on adding a link to Microsoft Office access on the website and are going to advertise it in the Daily Digest. They are working on improving the projectors and computer media across the academic buildings A Wing should be completed by October 8th.
 - 1. Peter: Better wifi in Berrie?
 - a. David: Have them fill our a help desk
- iv. Uma (Center for Health and Counseling Services): Met with Dr. Judith Green. We mainly spoke about September being National Suicide Prevention Month and the upcoming events that the Center hosted. The Center created a Ramapo team for the Out of Darkness Walk event if that's something SGA would be interested in. Also talked about current events of the world and how they are influencing students and the multitude of mental health resources available on our campus.

- v. Nate (Cahill): People have been forging their pathway's three certificates. Anyone who forges a certificate will be brought to the provost. Other than that Cahill had a great summer with their events.
 - 1. David: Is there a way to work on streamlining the Pathways programs to focus on specific majors, post-grad tracks, etc?
 - 2. Liz: For many post-grad tracks, such as law school, med school, etc, there is little official support advertised and most students only get support through other students, faculty, and themselves.
- vi. Evelyn (First-Generation Student Office): Met with Uma Mahalingam on September 18th. We talked about the highlights/logistics of the Legacies in the Making Program. 66 students out of 103 applicants participated in the program and 18 of 45 applicants were Legacy Leaders over the summer. Uma was really happy with the turn out for this program and having participated as a Legacy Leader myself I can contest that program went really well. We also talked about the newly renovated office, you should definitely go check it out if you haven't already. During our meeting, Uma said that she plans to host a ribbon cutting event on November 5th from 1-2:30 pm in celebration of the new office (more details to come). We also talked about November being First-Generation month and some possible events to happen such as Breakfast above the Student Center on November 3rd. Lastly, First-Gen Honor Society (Tri-Alpha) inductions is planned for Wednesday November 19th, 2025 from 5-6 in Friends Hall (\$35 fee for lifetime membership).
- vii. Peter (CA):
 - **Dean** Goldstein is interested in the advisory board idea created by the academic affairs committee.
 - If there are any urgent concerns about any rooms in BC please immediately contact a faculty member, as they are best equipped to help students with any and all concerns. These concerns include the pianos in the practice rooms, smells of gas, leaking water, no markers, internet connection, etc. You could also fill out a work order if the issue pertains to facilities.
 - The faculty is currently talking about whether or not they should offer more 2 credit courses for students that want to take certain courses but can't afford it credit wise.

- **Most** if not all reservable spaces in Berrie Center and H-wing can be scheduled through the 25live site.
- A student expressed concerns a while ago about the experiential learning hour that is determined by the professors. Unfortunately, if you have complications with fulfilling this credit hour, this will have to be sorted case by case with the dean!
- As one of my personal missions, I believe that every student going into the music industry should be required to take certain courses to prepare them for the industry better even if they aren't majoring in Music Industry specifically. I will be working with Dean Goldstein to see how we can implement this with the curriculum prepared by faculty.
- One of my goals for this year is to have more student artwork prevalent on campus. This year there's student work in the learning commons on the 3rd and 4th floor. One of the bigger concerns with having student work featured around campus is that there aren't many secure places to feature them. So one of the solutions is to have student work promoted digitally through the TVs in the academic wings! Another idea I had was to install cabinets on the left wall of the D-wing coming from the fishbowl. There's some student work up in C-wing and H-wing!
- **Dean** Goldstein also is trying to advocate for the renovation of both H-wing and BC. I am creating a form that would allow students to voice their own personal concerns with the buildings and I would like for this initiative to be backed by the SGA if possible.
 - Mihir: We would be more than happy to back this initiative.
- viii. Lane (HGS): Nothing too big, we have a lot of social media ideas but we're waiting for the hired student aide to finish the hiring process. We will have student spotlights (HGS Student Spotlight Form) and any and all kudos to professors/faculty are made into cards and given to them. Lastly, our first HGS Faculty & Student Event will be on October 8th at 4:30pm, more details to follow.
- ix. Alessia (Title IX): Met with Kat McGee on September 7th. We mainly talked about ways to reach out to the student body. Kat wants to know

more about how the student body is feeling and if they have any questions or concerns regarding Title IX. Finally, we started to discuss ideas about how to make students feel safer on campus.

- x. El Sharo (SSHS): Social Media: Contact Marketing, see who runs ASB Instagrams and how they post. Ultimate Goal: Once a week post. The thought is that SSHS is one of the largest schools, psychology is our largest major, and we have a lot going on. Dean Lorenz highlights that if it can be used as a tool to build community then he is all for it. Ramapo Green: Reported to me that the staff who are taking the place of the past president are overwhelmed. Dean Lorenz referred me to speak to facilities
- xi. Gianna (TAS): I had my liaison meeting with Dean Chan on Friday, September 26. We spoke about his endeavors for TAS and his initiatives as a newer Dean here at RCNJ. In regards to the TAS Mentorship Program, Dean Chan pointed out that we need to stay on top of the program if it's going to happen. He suggested to mentor as groups so there's numbers and have these be networking sessions with upperclassmen and lowerclassmen. He wants to work in faculty with this and have more student to student interactions with faculty supervision. Meet the Dean, he would love to host open Dean Office Hours for students to say hello or come to meet him and bring up any concerns.
- xii. Ismael (ASB) I met with Dean Ed Petkus to discuss some ideas I had and also gave him kudos for the ASB instagram page. I also presented some ideas and initiatives I had in mind such as the Battle of the Clubs for the ASB, to build some teamwork, strengthen relationships, and increase awareness of ASB clubs and courses to promote school spirit. Petkus supported the idea as long as it falls under the CSI guidelines. I brought up the idea to promote the bloomberg terminals more and the Dean suggested making an instagram video regarding that. I am supposed to meet his student secretary *Dylan* but our schedules are very conflicting. I did propose the idea to get more Bloomberg terminals in the ASB but the cost of bringing around 11 more according to the Dean is about \$24,000. I did speak with some professors and apparently there's this promotion where if we get 3 bloomberg terminals we get 11 free. I plan to collaborate with the Ramapo Financial Group to see if we can get one more Bloomberg terminal which costs around 2,000\$-3,000\$ each. Which I am thinking is

possible especially due to the fact that we are a business school and we can raise enough of that capital to get it and get 11 for free to get more students bloomberg certified because it helps them out looking for a job especially as an Econ, Finance, or Accounting majors.

- xiii. Ava (Public Safety) Front gate upgrades are underway following summer crashes, and obsolete gates have been removed. Parking pass distribution created confusion due to the lack of confirmation emails and temporary permits; Jason will coordinate with the software company to improve the process. Efforts are being made to strengthen commuter communication through orientation and clearer reminders, and adding Public Safety's number to new Ramapo ID cards is under consideration. Students should call Public Safety for facilities issues, such as hornet nests, to ensure proper documentation and timely response. We are working out ways to fix the lack of lighting around the CPAs. Jason is thinking about conducting a survey and having PSafe and SGA representatives evaluate where lights are needed.
 - 1. Nate: What is the plan for the current distribution of parking permits for this semester for students that have still not received permits even after applying?
 - a. Ava: I would recommend going to Public Safety and asking for updates and documentation.
 - 2. Liz: To clarify on the lighting survey, they have done it in previous years, but not under the current head of Public Safety. Also, I was wondering why Village residents can no longer park in lot B-3?
 - a. Ava: They re-evaluated the parking and B-3 is now commuter parking.
 - i. Liz: There is currently no sign dictating that this is now commuter parking.
 - 3. Peter: It would be helpful to improve signage in the parking lots to avoid confusion. Also, on the back of the current ID cards, it states to return lost cards to Public Safety, however it does not provide where the office is.

EDIC is taking the lead on the college being "digitally accessible" on all online spaces; Canvas, school sites, and social media pages. Aims to achieve full digital accessibility by April


2026, a goal set under the Biden Administration. There are more details on what digital accessibility can be achieved in my report. Also, new warning pads and curb cuts were added over the Summer to the commuter lots to make it safer for students with disabilities. As of right now, the college has gotten funding through TRIO Grants for the present academic year. There are 3 TRIO grants the school usually receives, OSS benefits from the Student Support Services grant, which pays the salaries of 2 OSS counselors who serve roughly 300 students together. For context, OSS now serves 720 students. Next year is still in question, but US Congress currently shows continued support for the TRIO grants. A budget could be released as soon as October 1st, but it is not likely.
